

Off Licence

Section 17 to 20, 64 and 135, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012



007/OFF/28/2019

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **Mac Retail Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at **11 Moana Avenue, Orewa, Auckland 0931**, and known as **New World Orewa**, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) **Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:**
Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 11.00pm
- (c) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers immediately adjacent to any alcohol that is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
 - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Ensure that no intoxicated persons are allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
 - (ii) Ensure that appropriate signs are prominently displayed detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons, at each entry and adjacent to every point of sale.
- (f) Only the area delineated on the plan dated 11 March 2019 is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol. A copy of the plan is to be displayed either alongside this licence or be available for viewing at a point of sale.
- (g) The whole of the premises is **Undesignated**.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) either—
 - (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
 - (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

This licence expires at the close of 15 April 2020 unless renewed.

DECISION

Introduction

[1] I have before me an application for a new off-licence in respect of premises situated at the above address. The nature of the business is a supermarket and the hours sought are as set out below.

[2] A report on the application was received from an Inspector, the Medical Officer of Health and the Police offering no objection.

[3] The application was duly advertised and did not attract any public objection.

Committee’s Decision and Reasons

[4] I am satisfied as to the matters which I must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act, and I am satisfied that the application meets the purpose and object of the Act. Accordingly, I grant the applicant an off licence. The licence may issue upon payment of any outstanding fee.

[5] I refer any party who wishes to appeal this decision or part of this decision to sections 154 through to 158 of the Act.

Conditions

[6] The conditions to be attached to the licence are as follows:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.

- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 7am to 11pm
- (c) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers immediately adjacent to any alcohol that is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
 - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Ensure that no intoxicated persons are allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
 - (ii) Ensure that appropriate signs are prominently displayed detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons, at each entry and adjacent to every point of sale.
- (f) Only the area delineated on the plan dated 11 March 2019 is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol. A copy of the plan is to be displayed either alongside this licence or be available for viewing at a point of sale.
- (g) The whole of the premises is undesignated.
