

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **Taihape Supermarket Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at **65 St George Street Papatoetoe Auckland**, and known as **New World Papatoetoe**, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

## **CONDITIONS**

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on or delivered from the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) **Alcohol may be sold only while the premises are operating as a supermarket, and only during the following days and hours:**

**Monday to Sunday    7.00am to 9.00pm**

- (c) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers immediately adjacent to any alcohol that is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
  - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
  - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
  - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
  - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
  - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) No intoxicated persons may be allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
- (f) The licensee must ensure that A4 signs, stating 'Alcohol will not be sold to minors or intoxicated persons' are prominently displayed so as to be easily read from every point of sale.
- (g) Only the area delineated on the plan dated 13 May 2025 is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol. A copy of the plan must be either displayed alongside this licence, or available for viewing at the premises upon request.
- (h) The following conditions in relation to external signage apply:
  - (i) External or external-facing advertising of prices of alcohol products, or promotion of a special price / discount of an alcohol product must not be displayed on the façade of the building.
  - (ii) External advertising of alcohol products must not be displayed by way of flags, sandwich boards or bollard covers outside the premises.
  - (iii) Any alcohol-related lifestyle or branding images must not exceed 25 per cent of the façade of the premises.
- (i) The whole of the premises is undesignated.
- (j) The licensed premises are more precisely identified as outlined in the plan date stamped as received by Auckland Council on 13 May 2024.

# Off Licence

Section 17 to 20, 64 and 135, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

- (k) Incident register: The licensee must maintain a register of alcohol related incidents as set out in clauses 5.3.5 and 5.3.6. of the Auckland Local Alcohol Policy. The register of incidents must be available for inspection by the Police and Licensing Inspectors at any time that the premises is open to the public. The incident should be recorded in the incident register within 12 hours of the incident occurring.
- (l) There will be no single sales of beer in containers less than 750ml and with a strength of 6% ABV or greater, except for craft beer.
- (m) The licensee must operate CCTV on the premises. Recordings can be provided in response to an order by the Police. Recording must be of a quality that would assist in the identification of alcohol-related offending. Areas covered by the CCTV include: the entry, the exit and the main body of the premises.
- (n) Exterior lighting at the entrance and/or exit must be operational at the premises.

## **DURATION**

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) either—
  - (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
  - (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

**This licence expires at the close of 4 July 2026 unless renewed.**
