

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **Point Chevalier Supermarket Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at **1136 Great North Road Point Chevalier Auckland 1022**, and known as **NEW WORLD POINT CHEVALIER**, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) **No alcohol is to be sold on or delivered from the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.**
- (b) **Alcohol may be sold only while the premises are operating as a supermarket, and only during the following days and hours:**

MONDAY TO SUNDAY	7.00AM TO 9.00PM

- (c) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers immediately adjacent to any alcohol that is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
 - (i) **beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or**
 - (ii) **mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or**
 - (iii) **fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or**
 - (iv) **grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or**
 - (v) **a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.**
- (e) No intoxicated persons may be allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
- (f) The licensee must ensure that A4 signs, stating 'Alcohol will not be sold to minors or intoxicated persons' are prominently displayed so as to be easily read from every point of sale.
- (g) Only the area delineated on the plan dated 21 May 2025 is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol. A copy of the plan must be either displayed alongside this licence, or available for viewing at the premises upon request.
- (h) **The whole of the premises is undesignated.**
 - (i) The licensed premises are more precisely identified as outlined in the plan date stamped as received by Auckland Council on 21 May 2025.
 - (j) No single sales of beer (excluding craft beer) or cider in containers sized 500mls or less are to be sold.
 - (k) Incident register: The licensee must maintain a register of alcohol related incidents as set out in clauses 4.4.4. and 4.4.5. of the Auckland Local Alcohol Policy. The register of incidents must be available for inspection by the Police and Licensing Inspectors at any time that the premises is open to the public. The incident should be recorded in the incident register within 12 hours of the incident occurring.
 - (l) No sales to persons in school uniform.
 - (m) There will be no sales of alcohol via "buy now, pay later" payment options. This condition does not prevent the use of credit cards issued by registered trading banks (or American Express).
 - (n) Appropriate signage regarding the restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons must be prominently displayed at each entry, and adjacent to every point of sale.
 - (o) Retail packaging will not be broken down to sell any alcohol products in smaller packs than intended by the manufacturer for retail sale (whether that be 1, 2, 4 or 6 units). 10.16.

Off Licence

Section 17 to 20, 64 and 135, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

- (p) The licensee must ensure that A4 signage in the single alcohol area, stating that alcohol will not be sold to minors or intoxicated persons, also includes a pregnancy warning label as defined in the Food Standards Code and as shown here:



DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) either—
- (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
- (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

This licence expires at the close of 18 August 2026 unless renewed.

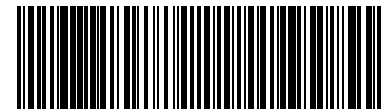
