

OFF-LICENCE

Sections 17 to 20 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the **Act**), **Onerahi Supermarket Limited** is authorised to sell alcohol on the premises situated at **128 Onerahi Road, Onerahi, Whangarei District** and known as "**New World Onerahi**", to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold on, or from, and delivered from, the premises for consumption off the premises, and supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:
**Monday to Friday 7.30am to 8.00pm; and
Saturday and Sunday 8.00am to 8.00pm;**
2. No alcohol is to be sold on, or from, the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday or Christmas Day or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day;
3. A remote sale of alcohol may be made at any time on any day. Any alcohol sold by remote sale must not be delivered between 11.00pm and 6.00am the next day;
4. For any remote sale, the licensee must comply with the requirements in the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Regulations 2013 for signage and to ensure that the purchaser is not a minor;
5. While alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, water is to be provided to patrons free of charge at the place where the samples are being supplied;
6. No alcohol may be sold other than alcohol that contains no more than 15% ethanol by volume measured at 20°C and is –
 - a. beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - b. mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - c. fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine (however that product maybe described in the standard); or
 - d. grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine (however that product maybe described in the standard); or
 - e. a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted;
7. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty, at or nearby the point of sale, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol;
8. The Licensee must display signage at the premises as follows:
 - a. At every point-of-sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance to the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
9. The "single alcohol area" for the premises is as described on the plan date stamped **5 November 2025**. The licensee must ensure that:
 - a. No alcohol is displayed, promoted or advertised outside the single alcohol area; and
 - b. No products other than alcohol, low-alcohol and non-alcoholic beer, wine or mead are displayed, promoted or advertised **inside** the single alcohol area.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The sale, supply or consumption of alcohol is authorised in the premises situated at 128 Onerahi Road, Onerahi, Whangarei District is more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Whangarei District Licensing Committee on 5 November 2025.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be attached to the inside of the premises concerned so as to be easily read by people entering principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from the car park at 128 Onerahi Road, Onerahi, Whangarei District is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force -

- (a) either—
 - (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
 - (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
