OFF-LICENCE*Sections 17 to 20 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), TK Supermarket Limited is authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises situated at 4 Main Road TE KAUWHATA and known as New World Te Kauwhata, to any person for consumption off the premises, to deliver it somewhere else, and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) No alcohol may be sold other than-
 - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold while the premises are operating as a supermarket, but only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 9.00pm
- (d) The area delineated as the single alcohol area in the plan submitted with the application is the only area permitted for the display and promotion of alcohol.
- (e) Drinking water must be freely available to customers within the designated single alcohol area and immediately adjacent to where the samples are being provided.
- (f) The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (g) The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are observed:
 - (i) All staff will be trained in their responsibilities under the Act.
 - (ii) A sign shall be prominently displayed inside the premises, which identifies by name the manager on duty responsible for the management of the sale and supply of alcohol under the licence.
- (h) The sale or delivery of alcohol is authorised on the premises generally. The premises situated at 4 Main Road, Te Kauwhata are more precisely identified in a plan date stamped as received by the Waikato District Licensing Committee on 13 July 2022. The whole of the premises is undesignated.

Display of Licence

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Main Road is designated as the principal entrance.

Duration

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force-

- (a) until its expiry date detailed below; OR
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence expires, until the close of the period 3 years after the expiry date.
