Section 17 to 20, 64 and 135, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012



007/OFF/2534/2016

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **Silverdale Food Warehouse Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at 20 Hibiscus Coast Highway, Silverdale, and known as **Pak n Save Silverdale**, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day.
- (b) **Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:**
Monday to Sunday 7.00 am to 10.30 pm.
- (c) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers immediately adjacent to any alcohol that is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- (d) No alcohol may be sold other than—
 - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
 - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
 - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
 - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
 - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Ensure that no intoxicated persons are allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
 - (ii) Ensure that appropriate signs are prominently displayed detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons, at each entry and adjacent to every point of sale.
- (f) Only the area delineated on the attached plan is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol.
- (g) The whole of the premises shall be UNDESIGNATED.
- (h) The area for display and promotion of alcohol is defined on the floor plan attached and dated 11 April 2016, and shall take effect from 14 July 2016. There shall be no reconfiguration of this area without the prior approval of the District Licensing Committee.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
- (a) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed.

This licence expires on 21 March 2019 unless renewed.
