**Notice of renewal of licence**

Section 135, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

The Off-licence in respect of the premises situated at 7A, Leicester Avenue, Tamatea, Napier, and known as "Pak n Save Tamatea", is renewed.

The conditions of the licence remain unchanged

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, the licence continues in force—

- until the close of the period for which it is renewed; or
- if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before it would otherwise expire, until the close of the period of 3 years after the date for which it is renewed.

**The period for which the licence is renewed is 2 years and 11 months, expiring on 21st November 2020.**

**OFF-LICENCE**

*Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*

**Pursuant** to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **D & G TRADING LIMITED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell alcohol on the premises situated at 7A, Leicester Avenue, Tamatea, Napier and known as "Pak n Save Tamatea", to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises and to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

**CONDITIONS**

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day;
- (b) No alcohol may be sold other than-
  - (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
  - (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
  - (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or
  - (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or
  - (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
 

**Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 11.00pm**
- (d) The area outlined in red and shaded blue, delineated on the attached plan is the only permitted area for the display, advertisement and promotion of alcohol.
- (e) The following steps must be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - (i) Appropriate signs must be prominently displayed adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of liquor to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (f) At any time while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises, drinking water is to be freely available to customers. This must be located and available from the same place at which the free sample is given.
- (g) The whole of the premises is undesignated
- (h) The premises for the sale and delivery of alcohol and the principal entrance for the display of signs and the licence, are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Napier District Licensing Committee on the 17th November 2017

**DURATION**

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) Either—
  - (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
  - (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
