## RUGBY LEAGUE - 2007 ANNUAL REPORT

2007 saw only minor changes to our Executive with Mark Falkenmire from McCarthy Catholic College Tamworth being elected as Country Vice President at our AGM in December 2006 and Barry Walsh from St. Dominic's College, Kingswood fulfilling the role of City Vice President. A massive vote of thanks to all members of the executive for their tireless work in overseeing the operations of the NSWCCC Rugby League in 2007.

This years Selection Trials were conducted for the first time at the Crest complex at Bass Hill on May 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. Apart from the threat of inclement weather and some initiation teething problems games went ahead as schedule at what proved to be a very appropriate venue. Thanks to Bankstown Council, Mr Frank Barrett of the Bulldogs and the Bankstown Sports and Social Club for their support with the Trials. Many thanks to Mr James Clancy from De La Salle College Revesby and the Principal and Staff for their assistance with the convening of this selection trial.

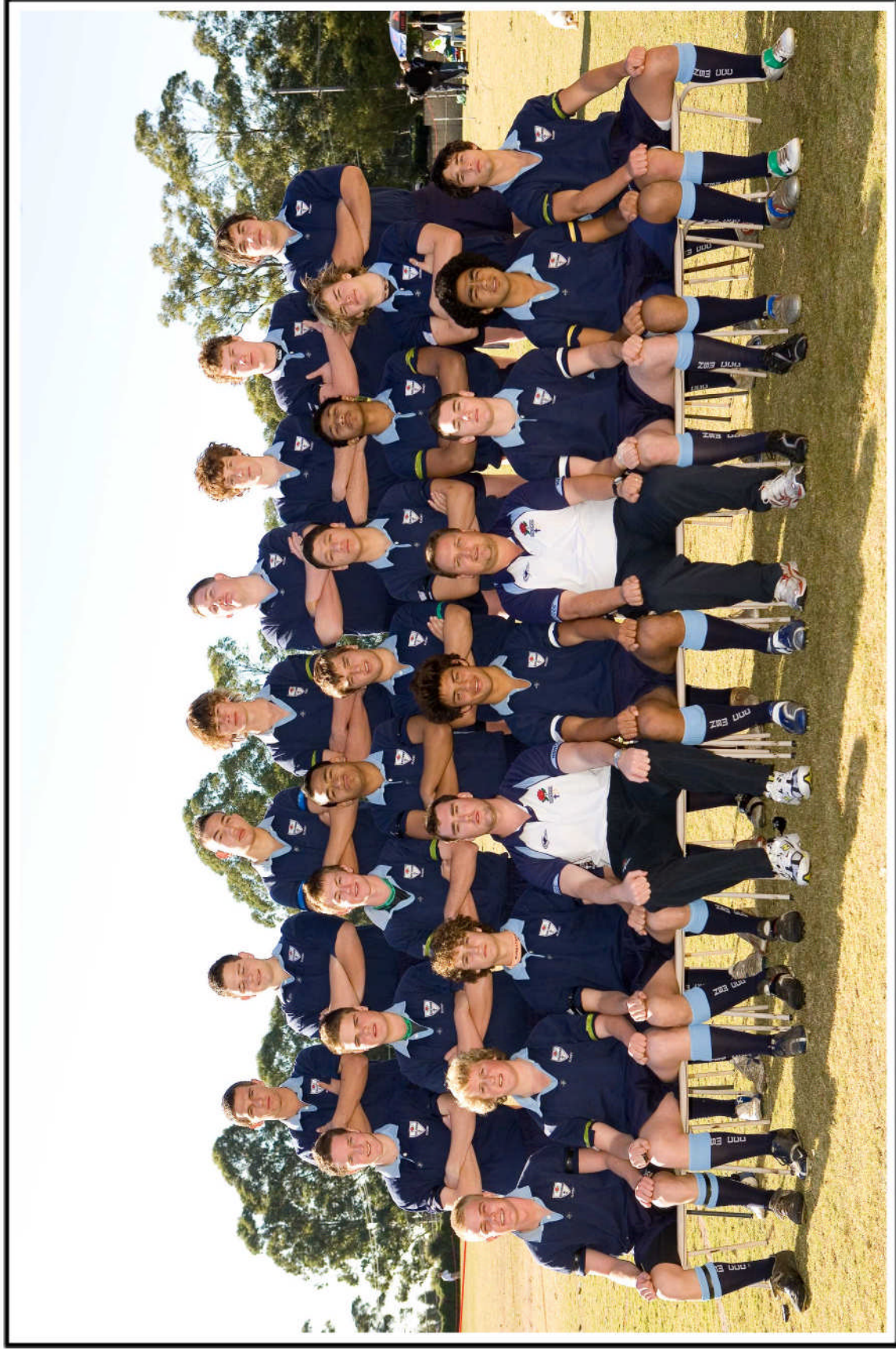
