St Mary's College Gunnedah provided five of the six individual winners at the NSWCCC Triathlon Championships with a sixth competitor finishing second in the event not won by a Gunnedah competitor. All six triathletes went on to represent NSW All Schools at the School Sport Australia Triathlon Championships held at Devonport, Tasmania with two winning individual medals. Special thanks to John Hickey and other members of the Gunnedah Triathlon Club for all the support and guidance given to the triathletes.

Students, staff and parents from all five secondary schools in the Armidale Diocese greatly appreciate the opportunity to be able to compete in sport at this level. The Armidale Diocese is one of the largest dioceses in NSW in area but also one of the smallest by population. This combination of large area and small population means that our costs [especially travel] are high. With many families carefully watching their spending it was unfortunate that many students could not afford to go on to higher levels of sporting representation this year.

In 2009 the Armidale Diocese combined with the Bathurst Diocese in Football [Soccer]. With our small numbers it was not viable to send a team to the NSWCCC selections but by combining with the Bathurst Diocese students from the Armidale Diocese were still able to follow the selection pathway to NSWCCC. Thanks to Linda Densmore and the teachers from the Bathurst Diocese involved for allowing this to take place. 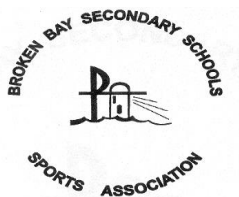

Some of the outstanding students have been acknowledged with the most prestigious award in Catholic Schools sport - a NSWCCC Blues Awards. This years recipients are:

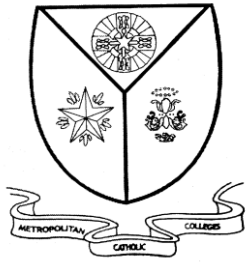

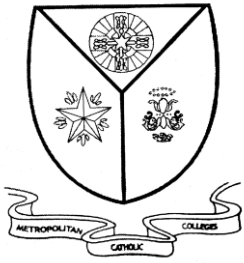

## NSWCCC Selection Report

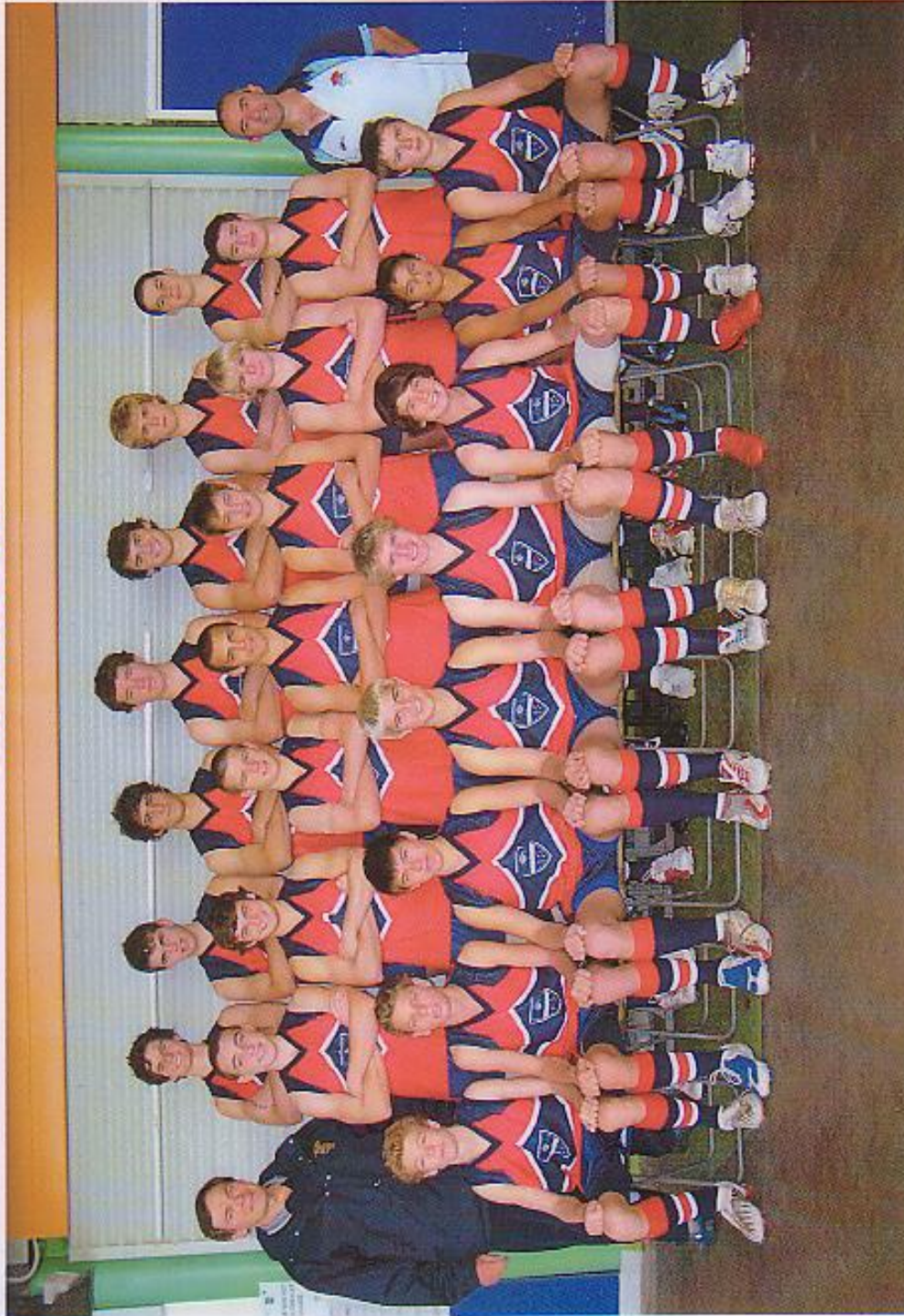

General Comments: Coaching staff were excellent to work with and both undertook their role very professionally. Team Manager did a great job in terms of managerial duties. All athletes both trialing and selected were informed of procedures and responsibilities. Assistant Coaches (Leon and Luke) helped in running of selection camp and were very valuable during games.

Possible Recommendations:

- Team Accommodation for Saturday and Sunday night to create a better team environment. Some may have other ABL or state league commitments but to make it more prestigious need to set stronger guidelines after all they are representing their

state not just their local association.

- Possibly arrange training camp/selection trials to be conducted two weeks prior to All Schools Carnival with the All School Carnival weekend to be used as a team training camp to prepare for the All Schools Carnival, which is what CHS and CIS seem to be able to do. Look at billeting like they do for training camps.
- In the selection camp procedure maybe make it like an All Star Weekend where the selected southern, northern and metro teams (which are selected from their regional carnivals) play against each other and the NSW CCC team can be selected from this round robin. i.e. the same way NSWCCC Touch Football runs their carnivals and then on the weekend before the All schools Carnival the selected team goes into a training camp to improve preparation.
- Applications and appointments and contact lists made earlier so planning for training camp and bookings can be made earlier!
- Look at having an U/15s NSW All schools Carnival to be run in conjunction with the Senior Opens program (like Rugby League do with Southern and Northern NSWCCC Country and 4 Sydney Regional Teams (North, South, East and West). That way the tracking of players for the NSWCCC Opens team would become easier and it would also give those players in junior years within the sport an opportunity to reach a higher level of competition.

Overall, as head coach I enjoyed the whole experience, the team was great to work with and hopefully we can further improve the results from this year in 2010.

Lastly, thank you for giving me the opportunity to be a part of such a prestigious program and I look forward to being a part of it all again in 2010.

All game results are attached with game sheets being distributed to schools on request. I utilised 3 experienced court controllers who kept games on time and in fact ahead of time on occasions. Our first aid trainer (Sports Medicine Australia) was kept very busy and illustrated the need to have a qualified person in this role.

All Saints, Maitland were a 'no show' in the girls and I was unaware of this until 3-4 minutes before tip off of their first game. This illustrates the importance of final teams confirming their intention to participate. Wet courts due to condensation on the Tuesday was an issue but with plenty of towels and volunteers we managed to get first round games started close to scheduled time. The **Boys** (10 teams) were played in 2 pools of 5 with the top two teams from each pool qualifying for cross over semi-finals with the winners progressing through to the final. The final between McCarthy Tamworth and Edmund Rice College Wollongong was a quality game with the boys from McCarthy taking the title with a 57- 35 victory.

# CROSS COUNTRY - 2009 ANNUAL REPORT



The NSWCCC Cross Country went off without any major issues. Due to some wet weather in the leadup we again used wet weather marshalling and recording facilities.

The carpark located closest to the Chifley Hotel was also wet and so all parents and officials used gate 7 again this Year. Gate 2 was used only for disabled access and competitors staying at the Chifley and walking across.

There were a few issues around the need to time events so only AWD events will be timed in 2010 and both the primary and the secondary AWD will be run as combined events. There will be 2km and a 3km primary events and a 3km secondary event. This is not a change to the secondary program only to the primary, the change is the fact there will be no timing for all events except AWD events. Most of the better runners will be self timed in 2009.

This will free up the radios for communications and will speed up the results. Timing keeps the radio channels closed for ten minutes prior to the start of each race which eliminates other communication from around the track at that time. Entering all times in to the database also slows the result process down. Pathways to the next level work on positions not times except AWD races which will continue to be timed.

There will also be changes to the program for 2010 to attempt to fix up the long delay at the start of the day before any results or team selections come through and the issues at the end where four 3k secondary races come in at the end of the day in succession. The issues are that some areas are then overworked at particular times of the day and this may spread the work load over the total time. In particular secondary uniform and team selection at the end of the day and recording of the last four events. Hopefully the new program will address these issues in 2009. It will be reviewed at the end of the meet in 2010.

### NSW All Schools Championships Report

The opportunity to play on one of Australia's greatest golf courses on a picture perfect day greeted the 120 players teeing off in the NSW All Schools Championships during the second week of term 2. New South Wales Golf Club was the venue for the first 18 holes of this year's Championships with the second 18 holes played at close neighbour The Coast Golf Club on day two. The magnificent layout of the NSW Club tests every aspect of a golfer's game, demanding long and accurate driving on most holes. Tricky pin placements reward those who play below the hole. The course has 4 par 3's and 4 par 5's – each one faces a different direction of the compass. The scenery is beautiful and dramatic. The stretch of holes that meander along the cliff tops are some of the most photographed in Australia. The wind can be brutish and often a major factor. The players this year enjoyed only a light breeze – perfect weather for good scoring. Despite the rather benign conditions many players struggled to cope with the demanding tee shots and deep bunkers- a lone par round of 72 was the best score on day one. 2008 All Schools and NSWCCC Champion Dimi Papadatos shot 73, Jake Higginbottom 74 and John Yim a 75 to be the best placed CCC boys after day 1. Carly Beck's excellent round of 74 had her leading the girl's championships after day 1. Aliza Huff was also in the mix with a very solid 78. On a day many players will cherish, where many reputations were lost in thick scrub, thanks must go to the host clubs members for giving up their course and assisting with spotting on a number of holes. The club captain spent 6 hours helping players!

Day 2 dawned and the weather turned rather nasty. Heavy rain and strong southerly winds meant that scoring would be difficult on The Coast's tricky layout. The anonymous first round leader shot 97 and drivers into par 3's were the order of the day. A low centre of gravity and the ability to hit the ball below the wind were distinct advantages.

Despite losing a ball in the middle of the 17th fairway Dimi showed his class to wrap up his second All Schools title with a solid 74. John Yim and Jamie Hook both had 73's to finish second and third to give the CCC boys the trifecta. Jake Higginbottom was 4th and Adrian Lee equal 7th. Randwick's 14 yr old star Ruben Sonjaja played very steadily with rounds of 77-77 to finish 10th. Lachlan Crowl's 79-76 also enabled him to place in the top 20 and qualify for the All Schools trials in Tamworth.

The strong wind and wet fairways played havoc with the girls' scores with very few players breaking 80 on the day. Carly Beck lost narrowly in a play-off to Bathurst's Chantal Hodson who went on to win the matchplay title as well. Aliza Huff, Claudia Lim, Molly Lavercombe and Millie Kohen will join Carly in Tamworth during the last week of term two hoping to gain Allschools selection.

The boys All Schools Matchplay conducted at St. Michaels on Wednesday and then back to NSW on Thursday saw Dimi and James Thomas from Manly breeze through their first two matches only to meet in the semi final. Whilst it meant one NSWCCC boy would contest the final one would also be eliminated. In a match producing outstanding golf James' 4 under after 15 holes saw him through to the final and a match up with Matt Egan from Cobar.

The afternoon final was an intriguing match. Both long hitters with excellent short games the two boys were very evenly matched and it was no surprise to see the contest go the very last hole. James drove the first green – a 321m par four to set the tone for some great shot making and brilliant "up and downs" during a front nine with only two squared holes. The highlight of the match was James' near hole in one on NSW famous 6th hole where his ball rolled over the lip to finish less than 10cm from the pin. The boys were never separated by more than a shot with Matt holing crucial pressure putts to stay in the match until the short par three 17th hole where his tee shot narrowly missed the green. Matt's bogey enabled James to head to the 18th hole 1 up- a lead he retained on the last to win the match and his first NSW All Schools Matchplay title. James will join the 7 other boys in Tamworth in CCC's largest ever contingent at the All Schools Trials. The 28 CCC players represented their schools, clubs and families with distinction. It would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the exceptional organizational work done by CHS Sydney East Golf Convener Dan Cullen (a NSWGC member and former Club Champion). His

efforts in co-ordinating the event over three courses of this calibre is to be commended and I am sure all the players (even those who shot big scores) appreciate the work Dan did to enable the State's best juniors to play on some of the State's best courses.

### **NSW All Schools Trials Report 2009**

The state's best junior golfers converged on a chilly Tamworth Golf Club during the 2nd week of July for the final 54 holes of the NSW All Schools selection trials. After 18 holes at NSW and a further 18 at the tricky (and windy) The Coast layout most places in the 6 person All Schools teams were up for grabs with Dimi Papadatos and Carly Beck looking to cement themselves in the sides they were selected in last year.

Dimi once again proved to be the outstanding male player of the series and was rewarded for not only his ability but also his modesty and demeanor throughout the tournament by being named team captain. Jake Higginbottom from St. Mary's Gateshead, Jamie Hook from St. Paul's Kempsey and John Yim from Holy Cross Ryde joined Dimi in the All Schools boys team that competed in the School Sport Australia Championships in Canberra.

Our Girls also fared very well with Carly Beck from Stella Maris College Manly, Claudia Lim from Gilroy Catholic College Castle Hill and young star Aliza Huff from St. Mary's Gateshead all forced their way into the girls' team which also competed in Canberra.

Others to perform well from CCC James Thomas, Ruben Sondjaja, Millie Kohen, Adrian Lee and Bede Polding's Lachlan Crowl who will also represent CCC in Cross Country at Eastern Creek.

The CCC squad wrested the Tony Stair Cup from CHS clutches for the first time winning by a massive 40 shots. This event is between the best CIS/CHS/CCC boys and girls players. The winning margin is indicative of the incredible depth of talent in NSWCCC Golf. With Huff, Higginbottom, Sondjaja, Lee and Molly Lavercombe (sick in 2009) still in the junior school the future looks very bright for years to come.

As manager of the NSWCCC team, I was privileged to be involved with such an outstanding group of young people. The way they conducted themselves both on and off the course was a credit to both their families and schools. I spoke to a number of locals hosting NSWCCC students in their homes and they were very impressed by the students' attitude and behaviour. Particular mention must go to newly selected All Schools captain Dimi Papadatos from McKillop Collge, Warnervale for his outstanding contribution to CCC Golf for a number of years. Dimi has led the scoring in nearly every event he has contested being a 3 time NSWCCC Champion, twice NSW Allschools Champion, NSW All Schools team captain and an Australian Merit Team representative. Despite all his achievements, Dimi remains modest and supportive of the junior members of the NSWCCC team. As a year 12 student and a player heavily involved in state junior golf Dimi still managed to make himself available for NSWCCC competitions and selection trials. He has been a wonderful ambassador for NSWCCC sport and we wish him well for which will be no doubt a professional golfing future.

## NSW All Schools Carnival Report

CCC was unable to convert field position dominance in to goals, especially in the second half. Up 1-0 at half time, it was 2 late goals in the last few minutes which sealed the win for CCC.
