We began 2011 with the NSW Combined Catholic Colleges Blue Award Presentation. The ceremony was held at Patrician Brothers' College Blacktown. The Awards recognise the students and teachers who have achieved the highest honours participating through the recognised pathway. We celebrate their achievements through a Liturgy beautifully put together by Helen Notley. It is encouraging to see schools celebrate the achievements of students who regularly display their God given talents. Many of whom we honour at the Blues Award Presentation.

Diocesan Sports Representatives will often work with conveners by supporting activities that are held in their local area. Often it is the local community's hospitality that provides the most memorable moments. The following NSWCCC Conveners have "retired" at the completion of this year: Jane Knapinski (Athletics), Br Jeff Regan (Basketball), Selwyn Gilmore (Boys Hockey) and Chris Hicks (Rugby). I would like to congratulate them on their outstanding leadership in their areas of expertise. These sports have shown tremendous growth due to their professionalism and expertise.

I would like to extend my thanks to the NSWCCC Executive for their support and guidance throughout this year. They are always on hand to provide the leadership and decision making that is required. They have a great commitment to ensuring the integrity and growth of the association remains as a prime focus. Your leadership and vision is outstanding. This year we have not had access to a website. It has caused issues regards communication. A new website is under construction that will also contain an extensive business system that will provide a better service.

The Catholic Sports Coordinating Committee (CSCC) continues to provide guidance and support in developing policies that provides direction to its two working groups – NSWCCPS and NSWCCC. NSWCCC Selection Report

On Wednesday April 27 the selection trials were held at Waratah Oval No. 4 Sutherland. 129 boys attended the trials travelling as far north as Ballina to Wollongong in the south and Bowral in the Southern Highlands. There were 83 boys who were 15, or will be 15 by the end of the year, and 46 were 14 year olds.

There were 8 selectors: four CCC Selectors (James Furey – St Paul's College Boolaroo (absent), Declan Donohue – Marist College Kogarah, Michael Holmes – CCC, Paul Reidy – Xavier College Ballina) and myself. Four CIS selectors (Brett Somerville – St Ignatius' College Riverview, Jo Graydon – The Illawarra Grammar School Wollongong, Ben Zunica – St George Grammar School, Philip Fieldon – Hills Grammar) and 1 independent selectors (Mick Clift – NSW/ACT AFL)

The boys were placed into eight teams and they played two games (20 minutes each). After the completion of the two games a final 36 were selected and another game (20 minutes) was played to finally select 22 players. The trials ran smoothly and the injuries sustained were minor. There were two corked thighs/hamstring strains and one slight ankle injury but all was well and special thanks to Dan (medical officer) for attending to the boys needs and assisting on the day.

The quality of the boy's trialling, were first class and all the selectors were happy with the selection.

It was pleasing to see the final 22 boys come from a variety of schools. 13 boys are from CCC and 9 boys from CIS. 18 of the boys are 15 year olds and 4 are 14 year olds.

NSW All Schools Report

This is very difficult to monitor and I am sure it happens with other sports. Needless to say there is still a lot of quality players out there unable to attend these trials due to no information being passed on.

Due to the trend in increased numbers at selection we will endeavor to use two adjacent fields for the 2012 trials. This is likely to be Olds Park Penshurst as the venue at Blacktown is unable to have a booking schedule finalised until around November and this is too late for the preparation of the 2012 journal.

Congratulations to Isaac Heeney (All Saints College – St. Peters Maitland), Jesse Mudge (William Clarke College Kellyville), Abe Davis (Marcellin College Randwick), Oliver Wetzlar (St. Ignatius' College Riverview), Nicholas Foster (St. Ignatius' College Riverview) and Joshua Barty (St. Phillip's Christian College Gosford) in gaining selection for the 2011 NSW All Schools team. School Sport Australia Report

The School Sport Australia Championships was held in Canberra from July 23 to 30. NSW All Schools finished fifth for the carnival after a creditable three wins and two losses. The team had a team staff of five: Shaun Brooker coach (Yanco Agricultural High School), team manager Andrew Oddie (Finley High School), assistant coach myself and John Shineberg (DET School Sport Unit Bankstown) and AFL assistant Danny Stephens (Albury).

The team had a training camp at St Gregory's College Campbelltown in the second week of the holidays. Nathan Vaisey, from San Clemente High School Mayfield, was a late addition to the team due to a Riverina player severely injured with a broken arm. He was also a late addition to the NSWCCC/CIS North team.

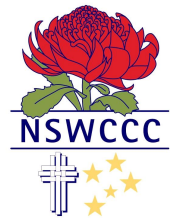

Our early batting onslaught in this game was noted by the CHS Coaching staff who uncharacteristically kept their pitcher on for more than two innings. Our bats matched CHS hit for hit, but once again, the "Holey Glove" demons jumped into our dugout late in the game, with three errors allowing runs to score and our lower order hitters striking out multiple times.

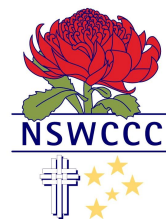

BASKETBALL REGIONAL TOURNAMENT – ILLAWARRA

2011 ANNUAL REPORT



The 2011 Illawarra Regional tournament ended up a successful two days characterised by a good standard of play, sportsmanship and cooperation from all attending teams. We had 52 teams contesting 114 games over the two days, split between Beaton Park and Berkeley stadiums. First aid, court controllers and referee supervisors were outstanding ensuring the games stayed on time and the tournament ran smoothly.

The quality of refereeing was good (depending on the coach and the game result at the time!). It was imperative we offered \$20 per game payment to entice referees to attend the event. In the end we covered all games but we lacked numbers about a week out and this was stressful. My chief referee coordinator, Sandra Kolednik did a great job to pull the roster together and was ably supported by Cheryl Damir and Matt Walker. Thanks also to Matt Flinn who court controlled at Beaton Park over both days.

Results for all pool games semi-finals and finals are attached.

A budget is also attached along with a copy of the program distributed to teams and a master program which included all games across both venues for those who were travelling between venues.

I did have a few late team withdrawals which created hassles (for those of you who organise draws the implications can be major). Fortunately I had teams on stand by in all divisions so was able to slot them straight into the draw. A couple of teams wanted to forfeit games late on the Friday which has obvious impact on the team they were playing and the pool the team was in. Teams should come committed to the full tournament. One senior boys team failed to turn up for the 8.30am round game on Saturday which was poor form. The same team confirmed they would be there on the Friday evening. Again, very inconvenient for the team they were set to play and this did impact on the pool those boys were in. (I did speak to the school sports coordinator and written apologies from a team member went to both myself and the team they were due to play. The sports coordinator dealt with the boys at school)

Some drawbacks

1. No access to Berkeley Stadium on Saturday. The courts at Berkeley are owned by both netball and basketball and Saturday is netball day so we cannot negotiate to use the netball side. I managed to get one round played on Saturday morning but then had to make the two courts netball ready.
2. Accommodating games with existing stadium commitments. The stadium has a lot of commitment in terms of rep training programs, state league, youth league, ABA etc. along with disability trust programs which make our use on the Saturday very tight in terms of time and court usage.
3. Team numbers. You physically could not run any more teams in this event given these restrictions unless you went a lot later in the evening which is not a good thing for teams, students, parents etc.

I again thank the players, coaches and parents who were approached the days with a positive attitude. Finally, thanks to Jeff, for his support and communication to all school teams.

When we look at other carnivals and Tamworth's viability, this needs to be taken into consideration as other carnivals had multiple sides from one school which makes their numbers look bigger. The new "Sports Dome" facility was exceptionally easy to use (6 Courts) and facilities were of a high standard. This allowed for a smooth running of the carnival.

REFEREES: This is becoming a major issue. **This year we only received 4 referees from all the other schools that participated.** I feel this is not acceptable. Out of 76 games 70 were refereed by Tamworth referees with most of these coming from MCC who were also playing. I feel for these students, as some played 4 games on the Friday and refereed 5. Then Saturday played 3 and refereed 3. **Is this fair and equitable?** Although we get great support from our local association referees, we can't continue to shoulder the burden, especially when it's our players who have playing commitments that fill the void. In future, we are looking at paying our referees more per game to encourage them to want to referee. Although, this will only work if schools do as they are required and bring referees. If schools can't bring referees then we may need to look at other ways to force them to do so. For those that did assist I thank you!

FIRST AID: Having funding to appoint a first aid officer was a fantastic decision. We appointed a local physiotherapist that was there for the duration of the carnival. This allowed us to focus on officiating and not first aid. I hope this continues.

REGIONS: The drawing up of regions this year was a good concept. As far as I was aware we were supposed to have the Bathurst Dio at our carnival, yet we had no nominations. Whether there was no nominations or they went to another carnival needs to be looked at. I do appreciate that the Sydney carnival is a closer option, but if we buckle in this area we leave ourselves open to precedent in the future. All schools have to travel for a variety of different sports (Eg: MCC went to Bathurst last year for hockey) and for the good of CCC basketball the stringent use of regions needs to be maintained.

DRAW: My main concern from this carnival was the need for schools to understand their commitment once they have nominated and paperwork is sent through. A lot of work goes into the draw and is put out as quickly as possible to allow schools adequate opportunity to be organised. IF a school nominates, then they have made the commitment to the carnival. If a school pulls out once the draw has been made, then they should be billed for their nomination. Perhaps at CCC level, we need to look at schools paying nomination costs when nominating or making it exceptionally clear that once nominated, if they pull their side out of the championships they still pay their nomination fee.

Future Recommendations for all NSWCCC Basketball Carnivals:

1. Address the issues with referees: Upon nomination schools need to nominate referees and can't participate at the carnival unless referees are brought. If not, perhaps a monetary cost or fine needs to be issued.
2. Continue the use of an official sports medicine officer.
3. The need for official documentation if an injury occurs.
4. The need to streamline all rules, ball sizes, selection criteria etc so all carnivals are the same. Ensure that this is sent to all convenors and school coordinators so ALL people understand and know rules etc (Do we have a constitution?) Continue NOT having 2nd teams from each school unless required to do so for draw purposes.
5. Dates that nominations are due need to be brought forward earlier term 1. Trying to issue a draw in the last week of term is unreasonable and then have teams pull out week 1 term 2 is unacceptable.

Could be rectified if dates were earlier. We should never have a carnival 2 days after the school term starts for term 2. This was chaos and poor planning on our behalf. It didn't allow time for organisation etc unless you wanted to give up your holidays to do so. Also, schools weren't checking information until the last minute which made things difficult.

Perhaps a situation of seeding teams where fewer but slightly longer games being played would be the best solution. Of greater importance however is the real need to structure breaks in the two days between the matches to allow selectors to debrief without being rushed. The elimination of the "possibles v probable" could possibly achieve this. Further the provision of a Goalkeepers Selection training session before the tournament begins or perhaps first thing on day two would allow for a truer selection of the best keepers as at the moment, the very short duration of matches means that the best keepers are not always selected. The tournament was rightly fought out between the best two teams on display with MCC coming out as deserved Champions.

Congratulations must go to the tournament organisers on the staging of a very successful tournament and I look forward to another equally impressive event in 2012.

All Schools Report

The 2011 NSW All Schools Football Selection Tournament was held at Seymour Shaw Park this year with another excellent squad selected to represent NSWCCC. The team was unfortunately not the originally selected side as two Newcastle/Maitland boys withdrew a week after the naming of the side. This was extremely disappointing as it appeared that the two boys did not intend on making themselves available for selection due to out of school football commitments. I feel that perhaps for the future, paperwork needs to be supplied from the Diocessan Teams similar to other sports where participants clearly indicate their willingness or otherwise to stand for selection. It is unfair on the selectors, coach, the team and any non-selected players when some players do not notify selectors that they are unavailable for selection.

Some work still needs to be done on the format of the CCC Selection tournament to allow for selectors to have the best opportunity to select players to represent NSWCCC at the next level. The rushed format of 15 minute each way matches does not allow selectors to select boys best suited for the 40 min each way matches of the All Schools Tournament to follow. Of greater importance however is the real need to structure breaks in the two days

between the matches to allow selectors to debrief without being rushed and the provision of a Goalkeepers Selection training session to give all goalkeepers proper opportunity to display their skills.

Rain again interfered with the preparation of the team however the opportunity to play a trial match v Sutherland U20 and a training session saw the boys gel into a very competitive unit. For the fourth year running the team again went through the tournament undefeated and drew 0-0 with the Tournament Winners CHS 1 in the final. The disappointment of again only securing three players in the final NSW Squad to the CHS's 13 was difficult to accept in the light of our 0-0 draw with these players. I suppose from a coaching point of view, we must have performed miracles as we obviously put together a great team that remained undefeated yet apparently did not have many top class players?

With the structure of selections at All Schools Level with the CHS coach being the prime selector, it is unlikely that this situation will change any time soon. I again feel that the only chance for our boys to have an opportunity to play at Australian Championships is for our Association to seek to go alone or at worst combine with the CIS at the Nationals. It happens in other sports like Rugby League, so perhaps we should push for it in Football too.

Congratulations must go to all the boys who represented the CCC so well in both their skills and attitude. Congratulations and thanks also goes to my fellow coaching staff, John Carnabuci and Dean Bertenshaw who provided great support and contributions to another undefeated season, the fourth in succession. I look forward to being given a further opportunity with my coaches to continue our success in 2012.

NSW All Schools Strokeplay Championships Report

Twenty two boys and 4 girls from NSW Catholic schools joined students from the Combined Independent schools and the 10 NSWCHS regions at Blackheath Golf Club to contest the NSW All Schools Championships over 36 holes. The players' scores from Camden Lakeside and Blackheath are used to select the NSWCCC boys and girls teams that would eventually attend the All Schools selection trials at Dubbo late in June.

Unseasonal wet weather ensured many parts of the Blackheath layout were very damp and necessitated preferred lies through the green and many G.U.R areas were local rules for the championship. For better boy players the wet conditions actually make scoring easier as drives don't "run into trouble". The greens are also far more receptive which allows players to attack even the most difficult pin placements.

Once again players from Catholic schools performed well with Travis Smyth, Luke Feltis, Jordan Mullaney and Ruben Sondjaja up with the leaders after day 1 of the championship. Similar conditions on day 2 produced equally good scoring with only 9 shots separating 22 players. Luke Feltis played solidly despite a crow "stealing" his ball after he drove his tee shot over 285 metres on his first hole of day 2. Luke calmly walked backed to the tee and birdied the hole with his second ball on his way to shooting 72 and clinch a place at the All Schools trials.

Year 8 student Daniel Kolar proved to be very consistent and cool under pressure shooting 71-72 off his 5 handicap to indicate he may be a star of the future. Another young gun to perform well was year 7 student Jack Pountney who shot a great round of 70 on day one but faded on Wednesday to miss selection with a disappointing 79. NSW All Schools Trials Report

Over 100 of the state's best junior male and female golfers descended upon Dubbo for the annual NSW All Schools selection trials. A record number of 16 CCC players were invited to attend the trials highlighting the depth of golfing talent in catholic schools in NSW.

The event is a 54 hole tournament run in conjunction with the CHS inter-regional championships. Scores from this carnival AND the NSWAllschools Championships held earlier in the year at Blackheath are used to select coveted positions in the 6 person NSW All Schools Team that will travel to Adelaide this year to compete in the School Sport Australia Championships.

After the 36 hole Blackheath event a number of CCC players were in strong positions with Tahnia Ravnjak and Lizzie Elmassian pushing strongly for places in the girls team. Both Lizzie and Tahnia played consistently at Dubbo in difficult and tricky conditions to cement their places in the side. In 2010 both girls narrowly missed selection and were invited to represent Western Australia at SSA in Port Macquarie where both played very well. The girls have been rewarded for their talent and hard work and can now start packing their bags for Adelaide in September.

The benign conditions at Blackheath enabled over 30 players to be within 10 shots of the leader in the boys' division. The practice round at Dubbo on Monday also suggested that the course would play relatively easy and selectors would have headaches separating the players vying for team positions. A brisk Tuesday morning dawned and a gusty breeze combined with a few tricky pin placements ensured a challenging day's golf ahead for all competitors. Many players in contention struggled in the difficult conditions.

On day 1 not one player broke par on a course that had yielded many birdies the previous day. The usual suspects of Ricky Kato, Andrew Best and Ruben Sondjaja were well placed after the first round. An earlier start, colder conditions and a strengthening wind greeted the players on day two. Again many struggled with the tight layout and at the end of play about a dozen players had realistic chances of making the side including Travis Smyth and Nathan Waters from NSWCCC.

The final day sees a shotgun start and a seeded draw. This pits players vying for team places against each other putting them under pressure to perform in tournament conditions. Again tight pin placements and greens that were difficult to read played havoc with many of the players.

After an enthralling day's play 3 CCC boys were selected in the side with Ruben, Travis and Nathan who shot the week's best score of 69 making the 2011 Allschools Team. Shaun Cameron played well on day 3 to stitch up the 1st reserves position.

Once again Daniel Kolar played well shooting two rounds of 70 to win the 36 hole net competition. Of the 12 places on offer, 5 NSWCCC players were selected in the 2011 team (3 boys and 2 girls) holding up the fine tradition of Catholic schools' golfers performing well at the elite level. The teams head of to Adelaide in early September for the SSA Championships at Tea Tree Gully, Murray Bridge, Flagstaff Hill and Grange Golf Clubs.

Not only did they give up their course for 3 days but a number of them spent many hours on the course "spotting" and officiating during the event.

School Sport Australia Report

The NSW Allschools Golf Team travelled to Adelaide to compete in the 2011 SSA Championships at Tea Tree Gully, Murray Bridge, Flagstaff Hill and Grange Golf Clubs.

Ricky Kato shot rounds of 68-70(4 under) around Tea Tree Gully Golf course to win the SSA Strokeplay title for the second year in a row. Ricky is only the second male player in history to win the title twice. Nathan Waters had 70-72, Cameron Davis 69-74, Travis Smyth 77-72, Andrew Best 76-74 and Ruben Sondjaja 75-76. Nathan placed 4th, Cameron 6th, Travis 10th, Andrew 12th and Ruben 13th with NSW the only state to have all 6 players within the top 15. These 36 hole scores enabled the Boys to win the Interstate Team Strokeplay Championship for the Dean Shakes Trophy adding to their victory in 2010.

Day two saw players head to Murray Bridge for the opening round of the interstate matchplay series. Drawn against host state South Australia in freezing early morning conditions the NSW boys held on well against the locals to finish 3-3 at the end of play. A number of matches went right down to the 18th hole in a tight tussle.

Day two had the sided playing traditional rivals Qld and at the end of play the Queenslanders were devastated as NSW prevailed 4.5- 1.5. Western Australia proved to be stronger than the morning rivals and despite the same scoreline the sandgropers gave the NSW boys a very torrid afternoon with most matches decided in the last two holes.

Friday morning arrived and NSW needed to beat Victoria and ACT convincingly and hope that SA would have trouble with WA and Vic. The NSW boys lost only one of their 12 matches and the Victorian boys rallied to hold SA to a draw which enabled NSW to take out their 3rd PGF Shield for matchplay in as many years.

Highlights of the week were Ricky's second SSA Strokeplay title, Cameron Davis' hole in one during the first round of the strokeplay, Travis Smyth winning all 5 matchplay games, Andrew Best's undefeated run in the matchplay, Nathan Waters(overall net winner) and Ruben Sondjaja winning crucial matches decisively on day 5. Congratulations must also go to Ricky and Cameron for their selection in the SSA merit team for 2011.

Thanks must also go to affable National Secretary David Seely, the SA organisers, Paula Nielsen, Dean Shakes and David Bottroff. Appreciation also to the host Golf Clubs and their members. Special thanks to Phil and Debbie Smyth for their tireless work in ensuring the boys were "game ready" every day of the tournament.

Finally a big congratulations to the team for the manner in which they conducted themselves both on and off the course. They were gracious competitors regardless of the outcome of their individual matches. All players contributed to the team effort and were rewarded with winning every event they contested.

They are a fine group of young men. They are a credit to their schools and their families.

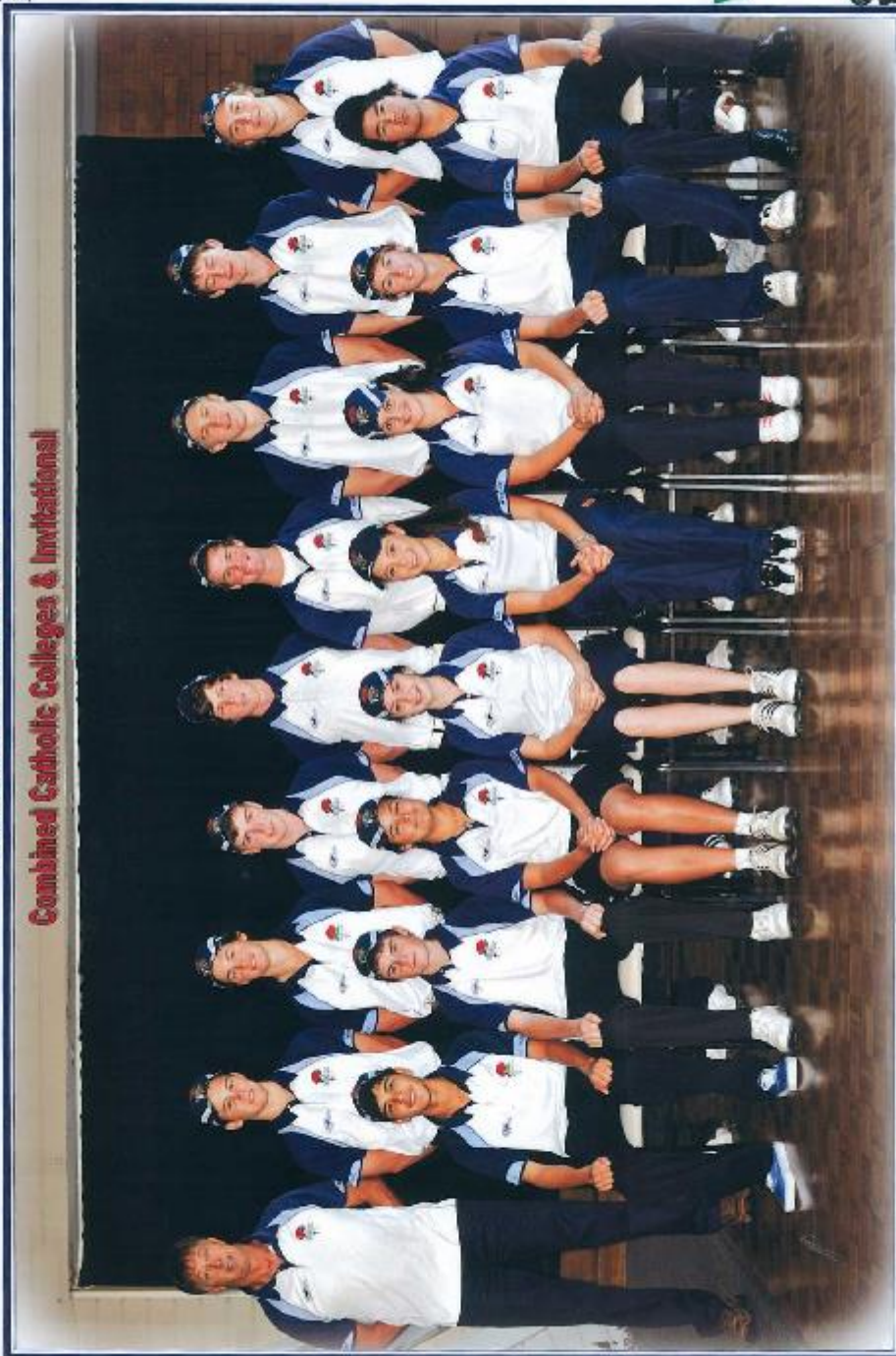

15 YEARS RUGBY LEAGUE - 2011 ANNUAL REPORT



The 2011 NSWCCC 15's Rugby League squad to represent NSWCCC at the ASSRL Championships at Perth, was selected after successful trials at St Mary's Leagues Stadium. The selectors were able to agree on an initial squad of 23 players.

The squad met as a group prior to the Championships at Holy Cross Ryde. The first training weekend involved a training day on the Saturday and a trial against West Tigers to pick our final team on the Sunday. This trial was about testing combination and trying players in different positions. A lot of positives came out of the hit out.

On the second weekend our coach Brian Battese and his training team of Scott Asimus, Assistant Coach and Dane Mackay, Trainer, put the team through a hard training session in preparation for Perth.

We assembled on the Wednesday before the Championships at Edmond Rice Retreat centre Mulgoa for a three day camp. This was a great bonding experience. 18 YEARS RUGBY LEAGUE - 2011 ANNUAL REPORT



This year saw a very successful NSWCCC under 18's squad become National schoolboy's champions and breaking a five year draught in the mean time. Although the squad did win the game that counted, if it wasn't for the professionalism on and off the field by both players and coaching staff then I couldn't imagine it turning out as successful as it did.

The National Champion side was selected after a successful couple of days at the NSWCCC State trials at St Mary's Leagues Stadium at St. Mary's, Sydney late May. Thank you to the coaching staff of all teams involved, in particular to our two independent selectors Wayne Portlock and Ben Rogers who came up with a team that covered all bases.

The squad came together for two weekends soon after the selection championships at Holy Cross College, Ryde. It proved to be a valuable couple of weekends as the boys were able to come together to bond but most importantly come up with a plan for the championships. Thank you to Mr Adam Taylor (Principal, Holy Cross College) and also to Tim White for organising the facilities and accommodating us for those two weekends. Special thank you go to the parents for the time they gave up to ensure their sons were at training, especially to those families that had to travel from various country areas. We had an opportunity to play a trial game against the Wests Magpies development side during the second week and it also proved a successful day. Many thanks go out to Warren McDonald for his willingness to help with our preparation. The score for that trial was NSWCCC 22 (Nick Ritter 2, Adam Elliot, Aaron Gray, Nathan Aubusson tries; Samisoni Langi goals) defeated Wests Magpies 12.

Just before we went into camp, the team suffered a couple of changes. Tom Rouse our selected halfback suffered an injury in a Under 20's game which unfortunately would place him on the sidelines for the entire season. His replacement was Michael Moses from Holy Cross College, Ryde. Then a day before we went into camp, David Nofoaluma decided to withdrawal from the team for unknown reasons and his replacement went to a young Michael Morgan from Marist College, Kogarah.

We assembled at the Christian Brothers Retreat Centre in Mulgoa on the Thursday prior to the Championships which were to commence on the Sunday. That night Life Member and past President, Phil Tobin inducted the boys into the team and gave an inspiring talk about what it means to be a representative for the New South Wales Combined Catholic College's Rugby League team. Thank you to Phil for his availability and time in coming to speak to the boys which was to become the initial start of the successful week ahead.

The morning of the Friday was dedicated to training and focusing on strategies and game plans for the week ahead. The afternoon took us to Aqua Golf in Penrith for a much needed break and bonding session. The boys were able to show us their other talents with some extremely good hard hitting and well placed golf shots. That night, representatives from the police force and welfare organisations were present to educate the young men on issues such as sexual harassment, indecent behaviours relating to mobile phone use and social media such as facebook. These aspects have been focus among young Rugby League players through the media and in public places in recent times. Our boys took the opportunity to ask questions and felt that the session was worth the while as it relates well to them at the present time.

The next day, Saturday, was put aside as a training day with three major sessions being organised. Led by our coaching staff Mick Lewis and Tim White with help from Peter Burke and Mitchell Lewis including John Billings who was invited to help with the defensive side of the game, the boys were became more confident in their set plays and it was evident that they were gelling together quite well. It was also an opportunity for our two new players to get familiar with the plays and their new positions in the team. That night, the players along with members of the coaching staff attended Mass at the Sacred Heart Parish in Luddenham where they were warmly welcomed by the Parish Priest.

The draw placed us with a bye on the first day, so as a team we trekked to St.Mary's to watch the game between NSWCHS and QSSSRL which was to be played soon after the Opening Ceremony. In the evening the boys were presented with their playing jerseys by ex NSWCCC representative and Australian Schoolboy Representative Andrew Hill (Chief Operations Manager of the NRL). We thank Andrew for giving up his time to come to speak to the team and inspiring the boys through what he had to say along with his presence.

The Championships for NSWCCC commenced on the Monday and we were drawn to play NSWCHS. CHS defeated QSSSRL quite significantly the day before and were considered favourites to come out winners of our game. Our team were quite focused before the game and you could hear a pin drop in the bus on the way to the game. We were slow to get started and NSWCHS galloped to an early lead in which they kept till half time. Being 12-4 down at half time the boys were determined to strike back and that we did, with a try early on in the second half. Being 12-8 down with less than a few minutes and all looking lost, Nick Ritter anticipated a set play by CHS and took an intercept 20 metres from our line. Nick was able to outpace his opponents to score underneath the

post for Curtis Sironen to convert. NSWCCC was able to hold on to that lead until full time to bring up a very exciting but well needed victory to start off our campaign.

The NSWCCC team was addressed by Dr Dan White (Executive Director, CEO Sydney) at the completion of the game and expressed his best wishes. We thank Dr White for his support throughout the tournament.

Day 3 of the championships, our second game against QSSRL was a complete contrast to the first. From the start we just were just "blown out of the water" and were significantly out played! Every move that we tried didn't come off and our handling errors and completions were far below par! In turn, everything the Queenslanders did turned to gold and through that we were heavily defeated. To my knowledge, it was the heaviest defeat experienced by any NSWCCC side since the first formation of such a representative team several years ago. It was no surprise that all players and coaching staff went home extremely disappointed that night.

After the previous game, the team regrouped. We were drawn to play NSWCHS in the semi final and were determined not to let the previous game destroy what we had in our first game. NSWCCC came out "all guns blazing" and through some clever plays and extremely good and positively fierce defence we able to go into half time being 14-0 up. In second half, we were still dominant, however on the back of some penalties against us and handling errors CHS was able to creep back and before we knew it the scores were locked at 18 all with a couple of minutes left on the clock. Still, the team went back to their defensive mind set of the first half and was able to just keep them out when the full time siren went. According to the rules of the championships, the first try scorer of a drawn semi-final will progress through to the championship final and that we were!

Friday's championship final had us going up against QSSRL at St.Mary's Leagues club stadium, St.Mary's. With the hard work from our rehab team in Peter Burke and Lauren Gradwell (Physio) who stayed up late the night before preparing players and working on their injuries, we were able to start the championship final with all 20 players.

Queensland came out expecting to repeat what they did to us a couple of days before but this time our defence stood up. QSSRL attacked our line on several accounts; however was our defence that avoided them from crossing over. Although, our boys took several hard knocks and were battered physically, they were determined not to let Queensland get the better of us this time around. We came in at half time 4-0 down but really happy with what we had offered.

We came out in the second half with something to prove and that was to win the championship. We responded early in the half and were not only the first team to score in the second half but the only team. We continued with our hard defence but this time was able to convert our plays into tries. NSWCCC left QSSRL with no answers and it was complete turnaround in events from what was experienced a couple of days prior. On the back of a couple of quick tries and one from Nick Ritter who had scored in every game of the tournament including the trial, we had won our first championships since 2005 and were gallantly named Australian Schoolboy Champions of 2011. Samisoni Langi was also named player of the final.

The closing ceremony bought it with it the announcement of the Australian schoolboy's team to play 2 tests in New Zealand in October. NSWCCC had 6 players selected: Samisoni Langi (Trinity Catholic College, Auburn), Adam Elliot (St.Gregory's College, Campbelltown), Lellani Latu (Patrician Brothers College, Blacktown), Luke Vescio (St.Augustine's College, Brookvale), Curtis Sironen (Holy Cross College, Ryde) and George Jennings (Patrician Brothers College, Blacktown).

NSWCCC coach Michael Lewis is to be congratulated for his magnificent job in preparing the boys and coaching the boys at a high standard. Michael's organisation of the team was first class and his coaching record is proof of this. Assistant Coach Tim White supported Mick extremely well and brought his own knowledge and understanding of the game which no doubt contributed to the success of the team. Peter Burke's first year as the trainer of this team is a memorable one for not only himself but for the players around him. The players were never ending complimenting Peter's knowledge and commitment in focusing them on rehab and staying fit for the entire week. Peter's contribution to the team was evident through their success and is to be congratulated for his epic service. Peter was assisted extremely well by Mitchell Lewis, made available by ACPE, who was an extra pair of hands that was well needed and made a much needed contribution to game communication on field. Thanks also to John Billings for his services to the function of the team and finally to Lauren our Physio was working overtime ensuring that the players stayed on the park.

Congratulations must go to James Clancy (NSWCCC Executive) for an excellent job as Championship Convenor that made our week much more enjoyable and trouble free. To the Executive of NSWCC for their assistance with our campaign, Nal Wijesekera, Kym Skerritt for the help with uniforms, Mark Falkenmire and in particular Fady Ghanem for his continuous assistance with finance throughout the week.

A final thank you to the parents of each player for their dedication to their son and their support to NSWCCC. The manner in which the players conducted themselves throughout the week, on and off the field is a credit to themselves and their families. They should be extremely proud on their performance and dedication and

National Youth Championships Report

Warm weather greeted the girls once arrived on the sunshine Coast and with a final training run on Tuesday afternoon all was in place for this side to challenge for the title. The next few days were as inspiring as they were interesting.

Wednesday was a big day for the girls with three games to start the event. First up were the Hunter Hornets who would prove to have a bit of "sting" in their game. A tight first half meant that the scores were locked at half time 2 all. With a tightening of our defence and a few tweaks in attack the second half was a different story. CCC opened the scoring early and then continued to score tries at a fast rate. A final score of 8-2 was a fair indication of the talent in the CCC team. While the 16 tries was pleasing, coach Winchester was most happy with not conceding any tries. She heaped praise on the players for their commitment to their defence and to sticking to a game plan, even when the game was well and truly won. Game two was against Cobras and while they were highly fancied going into the tournament, the Brisbane side seemed to lack the same enthusiasm and fitness of the CCC girls. Their one strong playmaker was continually frustrated by the CCC defence and as the screws tightened the score widened. A slip, a misread, a dropped ball was enough to give CHS a lead. CCC clawed back, but the CHS pressure was mounting, hence they were doing a CCC on CCC - pressure, position, completion and toughness. Again it was our skipper Laura Peattie who would be inspirational and Rhianon Adcock, Sarah Jane El Takchi, Sally Dwyer and Sam Rodgers continually shut down attacking raids by CHS. 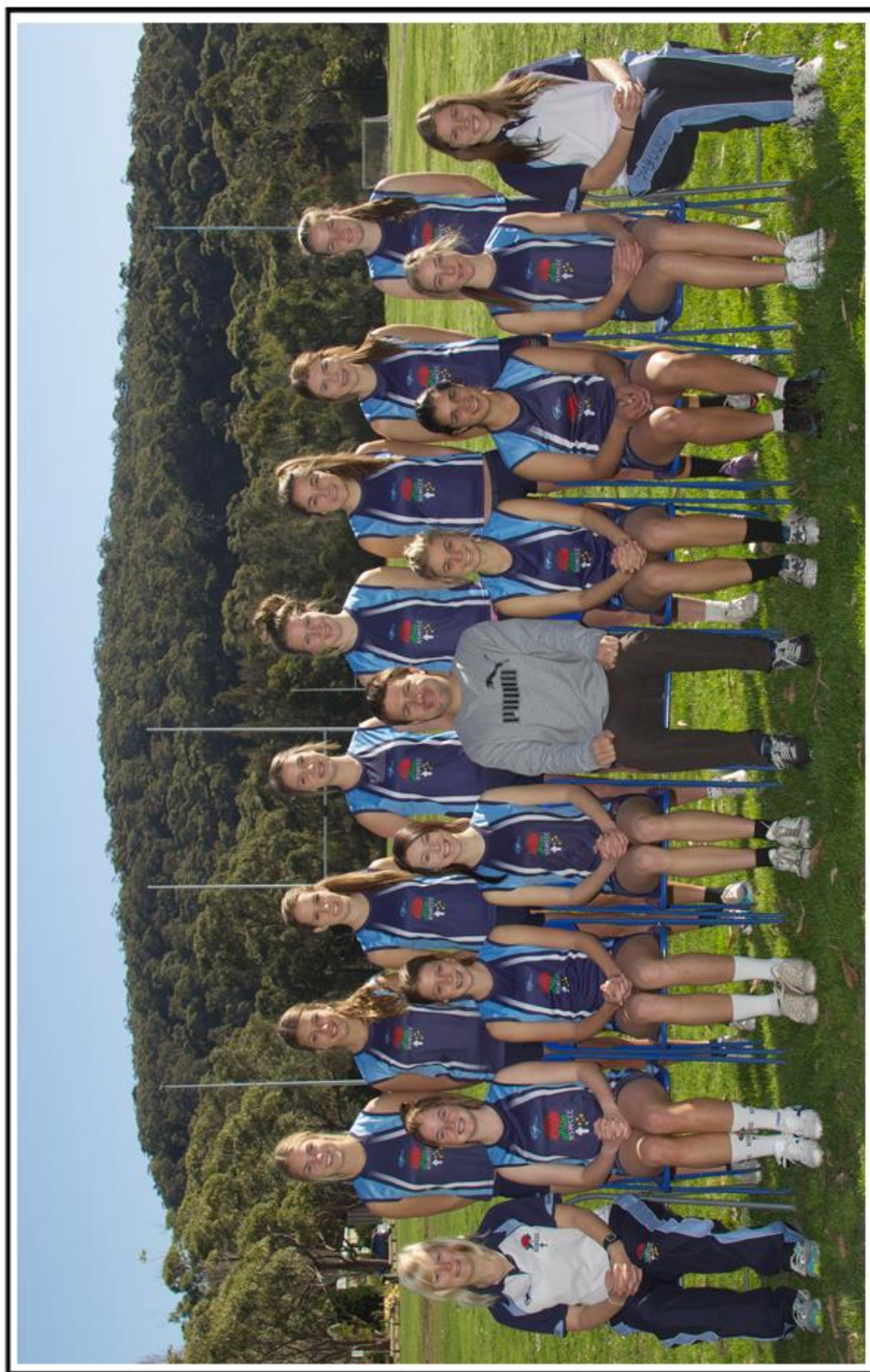

Recommendations:

- **On-line registrations-** are a crucial tool we require. With numbers for the teams' event in particular becoming so large, athlete safety can become compromised. On-line registration provides us with the ability to "cap numbers" and declare a race full. At present, if an entry is received, we have no way to decline an entry.
- **Staffing-** an increase in NSWCCC staff involved as officials is required. NSWCCC officials were the lowest of the three sectors at the All-Schools carnival. Targeting schools who attend regularly and have large numbers of students participating will be investigated as first options to take up these roles.
