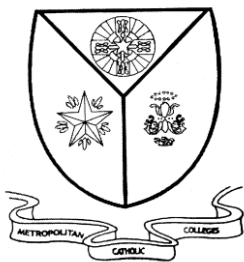

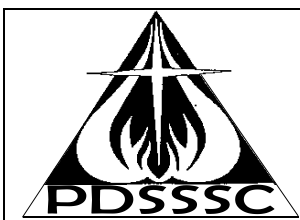

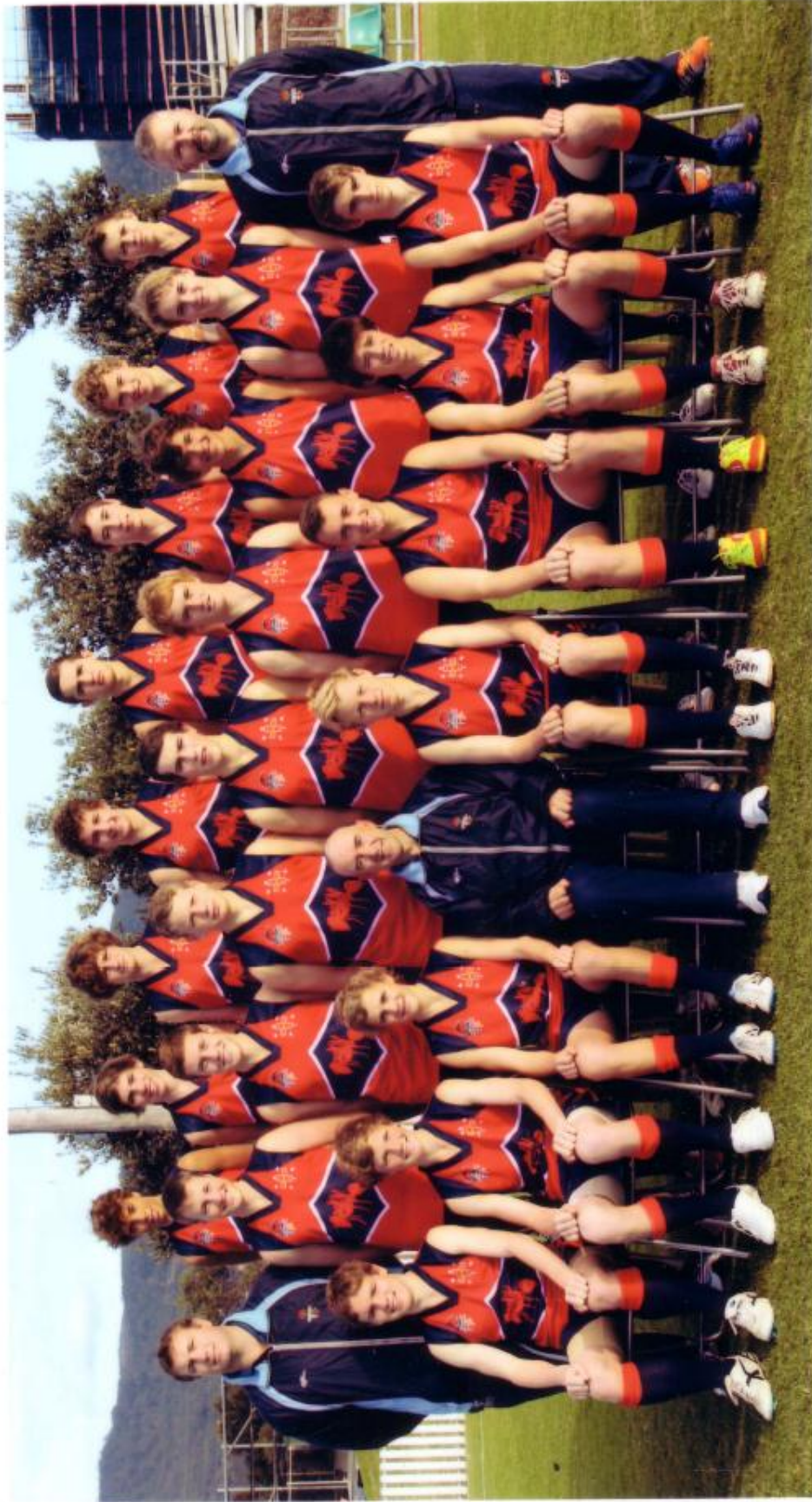

Thirty six teams from the Lismore Diocese descended on the Sportz Central complex in Coffs Harbour for the annual NSWCCC Regional Qualifying Carnival chasing coveted positions in the state finals later in the year. Despite a number of clashes with other events and trials all schools are to be commended for commitment in ensuring all teams entered attended the tournament. A big thank you to Trinity Lismore, St Mary's Casino and Woodlawn. These schools had teams involved in the Marist Carnival on the Gold Coast leading into the Coffs Carnival.

All divisions were hotly contested with St Paul's Port Macquarie, John Paul College Coffs Harbour and St John's Woodlawn figuring heavily in all age groups.

### YEAR 7/8 GIRLS

John Paul College dominated this division with half of their team from last year's being state finalists. St Paul's Port Macquarie girls have continued to improve and will no doubt do well at the state finals in Tamworth. The final began as an arm wrestle but suffocating defence by the Coffs girls enabled them to skip away on the scoreboard and had the game sewn up at half time. JPC winning the final 39 – 17.

### YEAR 7/8 BOYS

Again a division dominated by a John Paul College team that narrowly lost the state final last year. The JPC boys were too big and fast for their opposition with nearly all players in the team having years of NJL experience. St Paul's Port Macquarie, Xavier Ballina and St. John's Woodlawn fielded competitive teams with Port and Coffs qualifying for the state finals. John Paul College won the final 53 -18 in a one sided contest due to the depth of talent in the Coffs Harbour team which is expected to be very competitive at the state finals later in the year.

### YEAR 9/10 GIRLS

Two teams dominated this division - John Paul College and St John's Woodlawn. Both teams feature stifling defence and depth through the whole team. The pool game saw St John's Woodlawn win by 10 points after dominating the latter stages of the first half. State selection trials and injury decimated a powerful JPC team. The final saw the Coffs girls slip out to an early 12 point lead which stunned the Woodlawn girls who missed easy baskets and failed to secure offensive rebounds. The Coffs girls failed to press home their advantage and the Woodlawn girls came back from 25 – 13 down with 5 minutes on the clock to nearly win the match. In a nail biter John Paul College won 27 – 26.

### YEAR 9/10 BOYS

Very little separated 3 teams in this division with JPC, Woodlawn and St. Paul's only losing 1 game each during the round games. Percentages were needed to separate the teams with Woodlawn unluckily missing out. The school will apply for a wildcard for the state finals.

The final between JPC and St Paul's was a see-sawing battle until Port's chief playmaker was fouled off early in the second half. The John Paul boys kept the defensive pressure on forcing a number of turnovers which they converted into points. To their credit the Port Macquarie side scored a number of outstanding baskets but finally went down 37 – 26 in the decider.

### YEAR 11/12 GIRLS

Despite state representative Jessi Reeves absence the 2011 state champions JPC breezed through the carnival in first gear. The final was a similar story as the girls defeated St. Paul's Port Macquarie 54 – 19. After winning the state final in double overtime last year, this JPC team will no doubt be a force again in 2012.

### YEAR 11/12 BOYS

Woodlawn College and John Paul Coffs Harbour were the two dominant teams in the Open Boys division. JPC went into the final undefeated. The Woodlawn boys had lost only one game – by 3 points to JPC.

The semi finals were between a plucky Xavier Skennars Head team and Woodlawn which saw the Woodlawn boys prevail 51 – 19.. The other semi was between JPC and MacKillop Port Macquarie with Coffs boys winning 84 – 54 in a game where defence took a back seat.

The final between JPC and Woodlawn saw the Coffs boys establish an early 12 point lead which despite a heavy foul count and injuries to key players, they managed to maintain that margin for the entire game running out 45 - 34 winners avenging last year's loss to St John's Woodlawn.

**CARNIVAL:** The carnival itself ran exceptionally well. This year it was a smaller carnival which was much easier to manage (71 games). This was also enhanced by not using 2<sup>nd</sup> sides from individual schools unless needed for draw purposes (which didn't happen in 2012). When we look at other carnivals and Tamworth's viability, this needs to be taken into consideration as other carnivals had multiple sides from one school which makes their numbers look bigger. The new "Sports Dome" facility was exceptionally easy to use (6 Courts) and facilities were of a high standard. This allowed for a smooth running of the carnival.

**REFEREES:** This is becoming a major issue. **This year we only received 4 referees from all the other schools that participated.** I feel this is not acceptable. Out of 71 games 58 were refereed by Tamworth referees with most of these coming from MCC who were also playing. I feel for these students, as some played 4 games on the Friday and refereed 5. Then Saturday played 3 and refereed 3. **Is this fair and equitable?** Although we get great support from our local association referees, we can't continue to shoulder the burden, especially when it's our players who have playing commitments that fill the void. In future, we are looking at paying our referees more per game to encourage them to want to referee. Although, this will only work if schools do as they are required and bring referees. If schools can't bring referees then we may need to look at other ways to force them to do so. For those that did assist I thank you!

**FIRST AID:** Having funding to appoint a first aid officer was a fantastic decision. We appointed a local sports medicine officer that was there for the duration of the carnival. This allowed us to focus on officiating and not first aid. I hope this continues. My only concern is that we don't have anything official in place in terms of documentation if an injury occurs. I believe this needs to be addressed as we are leaving ourselves liable if it's not documented. This year I used an "Accident" proforma from school but we may need to look at a CCC document.

**REGIONS:** The drawing up of regions this year was a good concept. As far as I was aware we were supposed to have the Bathurst Dio at our carnival, yet we had no nominations. Whether there was no nominations or they went to another carnival needs to be looked at. I do appreciate that the Sydney carnival is a closer option, but if we buckle in this area we leave ourselves open to precedent in the future. All schools have to travel for a variety of different sports (Eg: MCC went to Bathurst last year for hockey) and for the good of CCC basketball the stringent use of regions needs to be maintained.

**DRAW:** My main concern from this carnival was the need for schools to understand their commitment once they have nominated and paperwork is sent through. A lot of work goes into the draw and is put out as quickly as possible to allow schools adequate opportunity to be organised. IF a school nominates, then they have made the commitment to the carnival. If a school pulls out once the draw has been made, then they should be billed for their nomination. This was the case again this year with St John's Dubbo pulling their 11-12 boys side the day before the carnival. Perhaps at CCC level, we need to look at schools paying nomination costs when nominating or making it exceptionally clear that once nominated, if they pull their side out of the championships they still pay their nomination fee.

### Future Recommendations for all NSW CCC Basketball Carnivals:

Address the issues with referees: Upon nomination schools need to nominate referees and can't participate at the carnival unless referees are brought. If not, perhaps a monetary cost or fine needs to be issued.

Continue the use of an official sports medicine officer.

The need for official documentation if an injury occurs.

Continue NOT having 2<sup>nd</sup> teams from each school unless required to do so for draw purposes.

After skipping away to lead 3 up Doey looked to have the match sewn up until Molly's experience showed through as she won 15, 16 and 17 to have the match all square standing on the 18<sup>th</sup> tee. A loose tee shot almost (1cm) out of bounds nearly handed the match to Doey however Molly recovered well to halve the hole and send the match down the 19<sup>th</sup>. Despite finding a hazard Molly had a 2 footer to save the match but it slid by giving Doey Choi from Santa Sabina Strathfield a berth in the second round against last year's champion Shelly Shin.

A plucky performance from Doey enabled her hang in for 17 holes before losing 2 down to Shelly who went on to win the matchplay title for the second year in a row. Shelly completed a remarkable double by winning the Strokeplay and the matchplay two years in a row. Not bad for a girls in year 8!

Travis Smyth and Owen Woodley were the two CCC representatives for the boys matchplay. Both won their first round matches. Owen was pitted against 2010 All Schools representative Brayden Pertersen from Hunter region in round two. Brayden was 4 under par as he clinically disposed of Owen 7/6.

Travis defeated Mischa Aksenoff 4/3 from CIS after a tight struggle in the quarter final. Travis then met Orara High School's Tom Major in the semi final. Travis led 5 up through 8 holes and looked to have the match parcelled up but Tom won the 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> holes. A brilliant tee shot on the par three 12<sup>th</sup> hole with a tap in birdie steadied the ship and went on to win 4/3.

The other side of the draw saw All Schools Strokeplay champion Harrison Endycott defeat Brayden Petersen after being 2 down with 5 to play. Three birdies in a row enabled Harrison to seize the initiative and win 2/1.

Both boys were well under par in all their wins setting up an enthralling final between the two "in form" players of the event. In another high quality match Travis took the lead with an eagle and 3 birdies on the front nine. A double bogey at the short par 4 - 11<sup>th</sup> hole gave Harrison a glimmer of hope but following Travis' undefeated matchplay run at SSA in Adelaide last year, his experience showed through as he closed out the match 2/1 to secure his first NSW All Schools Matchplay title.

### **NSW All Schools Trials Report**

Sydney North hosted this year's NSW All Schools Trials with over 100 players vying for selection in the boys and girls NSW All Schools Teams. During the week the girls played six games, finishing the rounds with 3 wins, 2 losses and 1 draw. The girls all tried hard but struggled to work together as a team. Over the week this gradually improved, with them displaying moments of brilliance and all girls showing their ability and the reason why they were selected, but unfortunately we were not able to do this consistently enough. All 10 girls were given equal opportunity to show what they could contribute to our team, with everyone getting court time in each of the round games. The inconsistency made it difficult to work out combinations as what would work in one quarter didn't seem to in the next quarter, very

confusing from a coaching perspective, but the girls would all listen and take on board what I was asking them to do, they tried hard but I needed them to step up a level and this was difficult for them. I believe if we were given more time these very same players would have been able to deliver, because it was coming together in patches, just not consistently enough.

At the end of the rounds VIC finished 1st, NSW 2nd, QLD 3rd and SA 4th. We played QLD in the Semi Final, whom we had previously had a draw and a win against in the rounds, but it was always going to be a tough game, as the QLD team was made up of some very strong individuals and they were going to fight till the end for an opportunity to play in a final. It was a really close and tight fought game in which we were always behind but never by more than 5 goals. The girls tried their hardest and hung in really well, but just couldn't get in front of a very determined QLD team and we lost the match 39-44.

On the final day of competition we had to play off for 3rd and 4th, a disappointing result and a difficult game to play, but to their credit, to the girls remained positive and prepared for the match as if it was the Grand Final. The first half was a tight struggle with SA hanging on, showing determination and spirit only allowing us to gain a small 3 goal lead. At half time I made a number of changes going back to our Semi Final 7 and the girls proved their worth dominating the 2nd half winning the game by 15. They finally played 30 minutes of consistent, strong netball as a team, showing me they definitely have the potential to be very good players and a strong team in the future given the opportunity. Congratulations to Victoria who went on to win the Grand Final by 25 goals. They were a very strong and talented outfit who finished the week as undefeated Champions.

The Open Team consisted of 10 young and relatively inexperienced individuals, who over the week learnt a lot, worked hard, learnt many valuable lessons, and really tried to step up a level and play at a standard of netball they hadn't had the chance to before. Given more time they could have had the opportunity to really utilize their individual strengths and be able to come together as a team, on and off court. They were all nice kids who loved their Netball, wanted to be the best they could be, were able to own up to and see their weaknesses and know they have a lot to give and a lot to learn, and I wish them all well in their future endeavors on and off the Netball Court and I hope they are given the opportunity to achieve their dreams.

To Ann, for all her hard work feeding, washing, driving the bus and helping to care for the girls, thank you so much. We work hard but it is very rewarding and lots of fun. I really appreciate your care and support.

Thanks to Karen for all her efforts in looking after the girls and keeping them on the court. Your support of me and all the players is invaluable and much appreciated.

Thank you to Megan and Lisa, for coming and helping us wherever we needed. Also to Lisa, for representing us as a Selector, a difficult and thankless task. It was great to have Stewart join us in Adelaide, so thanks; we couldn't play without your umpiring talents and thank you for the laughs.

Congratulations to Kim, Shirley and the Under 16's on your efforts at the Championship and on your win in the Grand Final, making NSW the Australasian Catholic Netball Champions. Well done, you were all awesome and thoroughly deserved your success. Thanks to you for all your support, encouragement and friendship, it helps to make Catholic Netball a special experience for all of us.

Thank you, thank you, thank you Leanne for all your hard work before, during and after the Championship. Without your effort all of this would not be possible. Your support of the Association, Coaching staff and the players is greatly appreciated. You are the glue that holds us all together.

## NSWCCC Selections Report

During these Selection Trials each player representing their association were scrutinised for their ability to demonstrate an abundance of physical skills coupled with endurance, self discipline and determination to compete. Each match was played with a real sense of purpose and it soon became evident that the team chosen to represent NSWCCC 15 Years in 2012 would be highly competitive and would represent many of the association teams involved.

The task of selecting these representative teams was made easier by the willingness of key rugby league personnel to assist the representative team coaches in this formidable task. These selectors from NRL clubs as well as the NSW Rugby League Academy bring a wealth of experience and help validate the selection process. We thank them for volunteering their time and services in their already busy rugby league schedules to help maintain the desired transparency.

## Pre-Carnival Preparation

The NSWCCC Rugby League teams have the privilege of being able to compete at the National Championships under its own banner. This results in the need for thorough preparation and a strong focus to perform at the highest standard when representing NSWCCC in Rugby League. The preparation for the 2012 championships was systematic and meticulous. It initially involved the team coming together at Holy Cross Ryde where the Coach Brian Battese, Assistant Coach John McKnight and Trainer Michael Fisher put the players through their paces. A trial matches against the West Tigers Development Squad enabled players to build cohesiveness and teamwork prior to competing in Darwin.

The role of the NSWCCC Executive came to the fore in this preparatory phase. This executive has been instrumental in the ongoing success of the NSWCCC Rugby League in recent years. Under the skilled leadership of President, Nal Wijesekera, each member of the executive shares the desire and commitment to ensure that students in Catholic Schools playing Rugby League are given the very best chances of furthering their playing opportunities and ensuring all activities are conducted in a manner that enhances the image of Catholic Schools. The NSWCCC Presentation Dinner at St Mary's Leagues Club was a clear example of the expertise this group demonstrates when promoting Rugby League in Catholic Schools.

In the final NSW section of the preparation, the team came together at Mulgoa on the Wednesday. In a camp situation the players were able to train, bond and form a closeness which would bring them together for the following week. It was here that a promising squad was moulded into a very fine team.

During this camp a number of crucial activities ensued:

We established a common objective and a culture of success as we reflected on why NSWCCC teams have been successful in the past. We clearly defined the need to focus on team goals rather than individual aspiration and developed an appreciation of the opportunity presented through competing at a National Championship. We benefitted from the experience of successful people. The players were most fortunate to meet with current NRL players Mitchell Pearce and Mitchell Aubusson who spent hours with the team, sharing their experiences of representing NSWCCC and discussing the attributes needed to play at NRL and State of Origin level. We promoted personal and social development with talks on Social Media and Illicit Drugs. We established our Code of Behaviour and identified our responsibilities. We utilised the power of prayer and motivation.

The team travelled to Darwin on the Friday. The excellent response to the very early start confirmed each player's level of responsibility. Check-in was super smooth thanks to Mrs Hawkins and soon many players were experiencing their first flight. Arriving in the Darwin heat confirmed the need to arrive early to acclimatise. We were greeted by Carnival Convenor Trent Nolan and were transported to Kormilda College, which became our base for the week.

Saturday was greeted by an early morning training session, followed by an exciting visit to the Crocodile Park. It was here that the boys gained a healthy respect for these animals as they had turns feeding some very large and very hungry reptiles. Our preparatory days concluded with the team attending Mass at the Darwin Cathedral. Here they were warmly greeted by the congregation and the recognition of their responsibilities as a member of a Catholic Schools team was further reinforced.

### **The Carnival**

Day 1: Sunday 24th June. The National Schoolboys Carnivals are an excellent promotion of all that is good in rugby league. It is one of the few times where all mainland states and territories converge in the name of this sport. As school retention rates do not impact on this age group, it truly does bring the best from all over Australia to play rugby league. Teams from all mainland states attended and the Opening Ceremony was a stark reminder that we were here for something special. All the preparation was over .. It was game on .. and what a game we played. The carnival convenor was spot on when determining the best game to showcase opening day. Two relatively even teams put on a great display for the welcoming crowd and our well-deserved victory placed us in an excellent position to realise our week-long team goals.

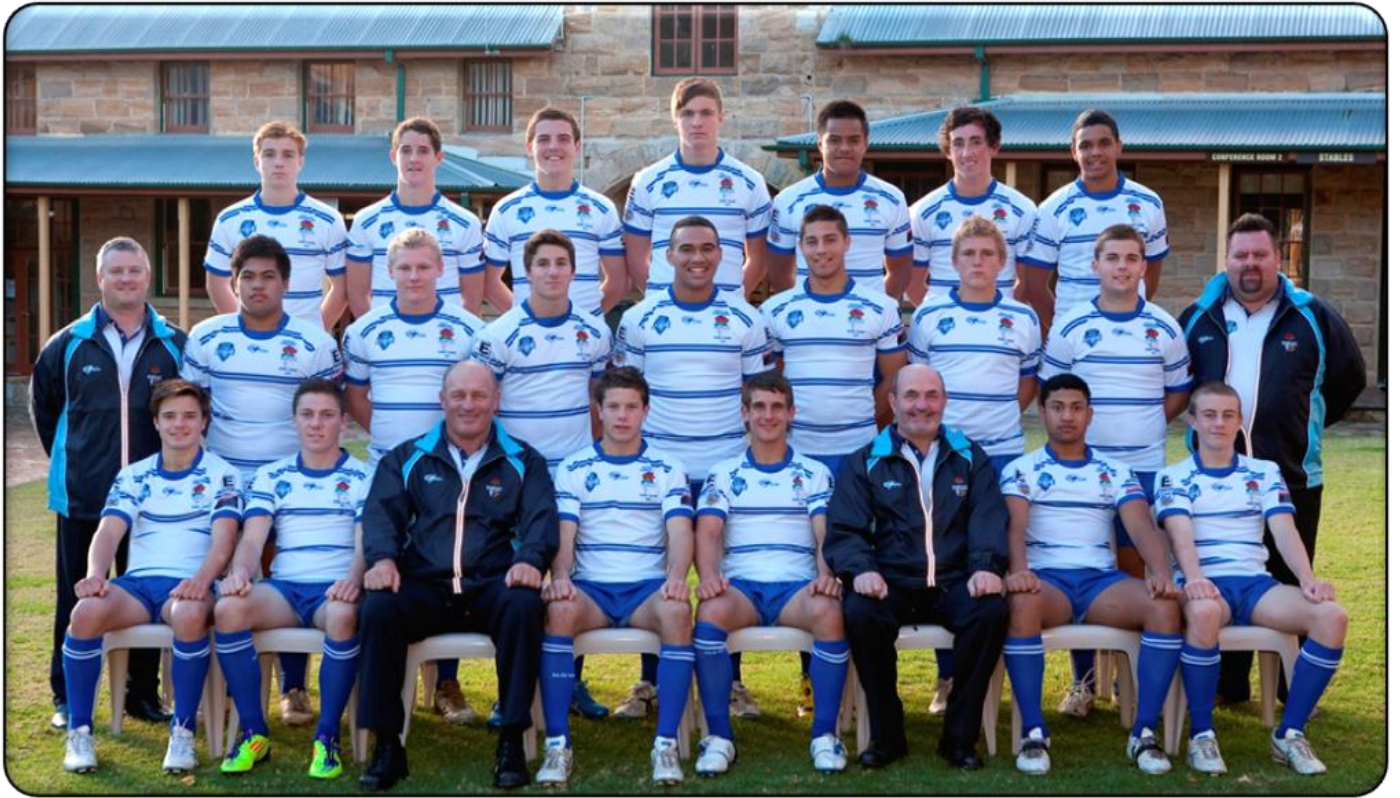

# NSWCCC RUGBY LEAGUE CUP 2012



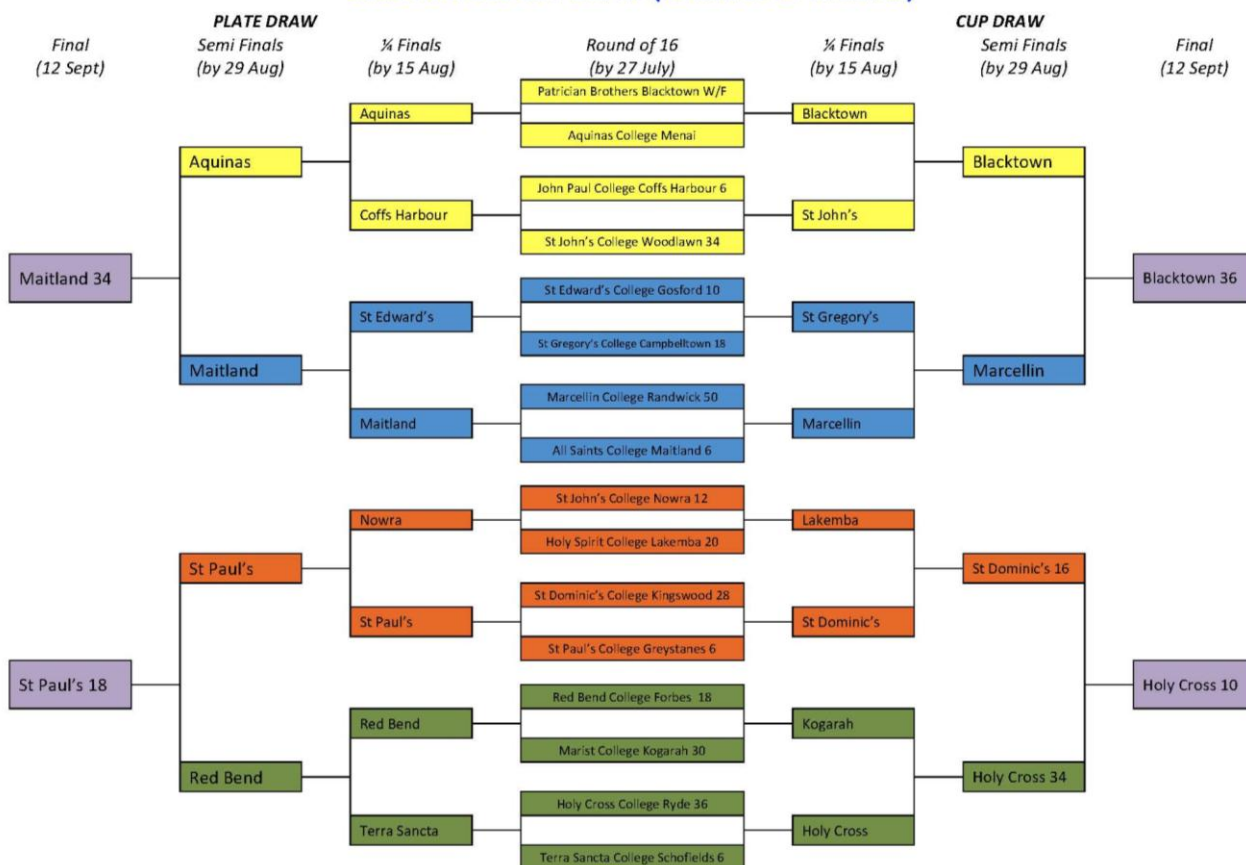

### NSW All Schools Report

Rugby continues to grow within the CCC as evidenced by the number of teams trialling from over the state. After the two days of trials, a team was selected to represent the CCC at The NSW Championships. It is pleasing to note, that the team was made up of mainly rugby players who already had the necessary skills and made coaching so much easier. Again it is disappointing to notice players from previous u16s teams who do not continue the pathway through CCC as they get poached by other associations.

The camp returned to Narrabeen this year and over the three days we spent together, the squad really developed and enjoyed the facilities that Narrabeen offers (most notably the Ice Baths). The boys also enjoyed an outing to Manly Oval to watch a local Shute Shield game between Manly and Eastwood.

Our first game against CHS on a wild and windy day at Hills Grammar saw us really put it to CHS and we were unlucky to be behind at oranges. We could not however, sustain this effort in the second half and a couple of late tries saw CHS defeat us by twenty odd points, in a result that did not really reflect the difference between the two teams. Our second game against ISA was a much closer affair in which we lost by one point after rejecting a shot at goal that could have won us the game. Our third game against GPS was also a close affair and in a nail biter, we eventually defeated them.

Unfortunately, none of our players were selected in the main NSW squads although Jonathan Brown from Sydney South was selected as a shadow player. Although seemingly disappointing from a CCC perspective, it was fair call as no other player really stood out more than others who were selected. What is obvious and was commented upon by the selectors, was the great team play exhibited by the team and how they had developed from the first game. I have no doubt that CCC has now been given the credibility they deserve and the fact that we can 'match it' with the top representative teams is testimony to this.

This year also saw the Australian Schools Rugby Union hold a forum in Brisbane to discuss issues that related to schools rugby. The first of its kind, it brought together a range of teachers and coaches from around Australia, Super Rugby representatives and the ARU to discuss rugby issues. From these discussions, a range of strategies have been put in place to try and deal with the issues raised. Some of the more prominent issues were:

- Scheduling/timing/ coordination of matches ie test matches, national championships and selection trials
- The role of ASRU and communication of the role to schools
- The purpose, value and timing of the Australian championships
- The ASRU school teams playing academies
- Parity of games across competitions - focus on lower graded teams
- The role of the gold squads and the impact of gold squads on schools and school programs
- Coach education in schools and clubs
- Promotion of the game
- Duplication of elite programs within schools and what is offered by the ARU
- Development and maintenance of rugby
- State Union and ARU involvement at school level
- Referee development and promotion
- Support for rugby in non traditional schools

Whilst this may seem an exhaustive list, it is not anticipated that the ARU Schools Association can address all these issues. The feedback and analysis generated at the Forum provided the ASRU with an opportunity to develop a Strategic Plan. The issues and suggested strategies from the Forum will form the foundation of such a Strategic Plan.

In conclusion, rugby at CCC level continues to grow and most importantly, students in Catholic Schools in NSW are finally being afforded the same rights as those in other associations. The challenge for us, is to get more CCC people involved at a state level, either as selectors or coaches to ensure that our players are represented at the selection meetings.

## National Youth Tournament Report

**"UNDEFEATED AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONS"**

The 2012 NSWCCC 18's Touch Football team to represent NSWCCC at the National Youth Championships in Port Macquarie, was selected after successful trials held at Tamworth in early June. Selectors agreed on a squad of 14 players who they thought could best represent NSWCCC in the upcoming Youth Championships and end Queensland's domination in the tournament. Due to scheduling of the event in the last week of term 3, five boys were forced to withdraw themselves from the team due to year 12 commitments and five shadow players were called in as replacements.

The team trained well in the lead up to the tournament but were forced to cancel the final training session, scheduled for the day before competition, due to year 12 graduation commitments. The team gathered for the first time in Port Macquarie an hour before our first game. At the Team Meeting prior to our warm up it was announced that Dom Field and Mitchell Newman, both NSWCCC 18's boy's veterans, would co-captain the team.

Day one of competition featured three games against New Zealand Touch 17's, Tasmania and Northern Territory. NSWCCC conceded the first try against the highly fancied New Zealand 17's team and never looked back from there winning the game 7 – 2. Games against Tasmania and Northern Territory followed with boys producing comprehensive displays winning 18 – 5 and 17 – 2 respectively.

NSWCCC went into day two of competition coming off three big wins and three big games followed against NSWCHS, NSWTA Development and ACT Pirates. Day two was billed as “Derby Day” as NSWCCC faced the two other NSW teams in the competition. Game one against NSWCHS was promoted as match of the day and the boys wanted to desperately win this encounter. NSWCCC led early and never really looked like losing, coming away with a 10 – 7 victory.

Game two was against NSWTA Development. This team was made up of players who missed out on selection of the other NSW teams and who were all desperate to impress. They definitely put up a fight but NSWCCC proved too strong winning 8 – 4. Game three was the teams’ one and only night game against the ACT Pirates which we won 15 – 5.

Going into day three the boys had to win their last game in order to take the number one seed into the quarter finals. We faced the much improved Western Tigers and after a tough game NSWCCC ended up winning 13 – 8. This win marked the beginning of a new competition as the boys were now playing knockout football. The quarter final had NSWCCC coming up against rivals NSWCCIS. After a tough first half and an inspirational half time speech NSWCCC won 12 – 6.

Day four was the final day of competition and what many would call the business end. Central Queensland Bulls, the pre competition favourites, awaited NSWCCC in the semi-final. Scores were level at half time and the boys were determined to make the grand final for the third consecutive year. This drive and passion went a long way in the team’s 8 – 6 upset victory against a more highly fancied opponent.

It had been 3 long years since the last time NSWCCC tasted opens boys success and the last two years produced agonising losses in the grand final against Queensland Secondary Schools Touch. And that is who awaited us again in the grand final. Both teams undefeated and a game away from being crowned Australian Champions. NSWCCC went into the game as underdogs and QSST began the game strongly leading 3 – 0 and 4 -1 at various stages of the first half. NSWCCC eventually clawed their way back into the match and were level 5 – 5 at half time.

Mitchell Newman and Dom Fields at half time both spoke about their desire to finish off their NSWCCC careers as champions, a title that had eluded them the previous two years. It was deja vu for these two boys as last year’s grand final was also locked at 5 – 5 at half time. NSWCCC were down 7 – 5 early in the second half but after a string of four consecutive tries led 9 -7 and eventually won the game 9 – 8 in the dying seconds. Undefeated Australian Champions.

Matthew Arnold was named man of the match for the grand final, while Jed Ibbotson was named man of the tournament. Ciaron Toner was awarded the players player award voted by the coaching staff and his teammates. As a result of their fine efforts both Ciaron Toner and Jed Ibbotson were both rewarded with selection in the Australian under 18’s team to play New Zealand in January.

Many thanks must go to the parents of the players for their commitment and hard work. The help and support you provided the boys was greatly appreciated by all. Many thanks must also go to Kym Skerit for her organisation and hard work put into the team. A big Thankyou also must go to the Thornton family for all their hard work in managing the team and providing them with water before, during and after games.

It was an absolute privilege to coach a group of such talented individuals. The NSWCCC team was written off from the start of the tournament with both Queensland teams expected to play out the grand final. The preparation for the tournament was hampered by boys withdrawing due to year 12 commitments and even the grand final was played with 12 men due to this. The NSWCCC boys proved how resilient they were in continuing on with the job despite all kinds of obstacles being thrown at them. This resiliency and desire to win went a long way in helping them to achieve the ultimate goal of being Undefeated Australian Champions.

A very talented and committed contingent of 14 girls travelled to Port Macquarie to compete in the National Youth Championships in September. Aply coached by Australian Women's Representative Stephanie Halpin and Mark Heiss, the team gelled as a playing unit and friendship group. All buoyed by the common bond of hard Warm weather greeted the girls once arrived in Port Macquarie as we began our final training preparation. As the storm clouds gathered during the session the girls shared ideas on how best to break down their opposition. It was fulfilling as a coach to see the leaders in the team taking the reins and showing their commitment to the tournament. From then it was clear the next few days were going to be special.

Day one was a big day for the girls with games against Tasmania, NSWTA and ACT.

In game one the team took on Tasmania on field one and put in a dominant performance. While Tasmania is considered an emerging state, they played hard against CCC. A score of 14 – 1 was a fair indication of the two teams though. It was a try scoring feats for our wingers as Tarnii Price crossed for three tries and Claire Eisenhuth four. This game showed that our girls were happy to let the ball do the work and play as a team. An impressive performance.

Game two was a grudge match against the NSW Touch Association Development team; they fancied themselves as being able to beat their CCC counterparts. In a tight game CCC won 5-3. 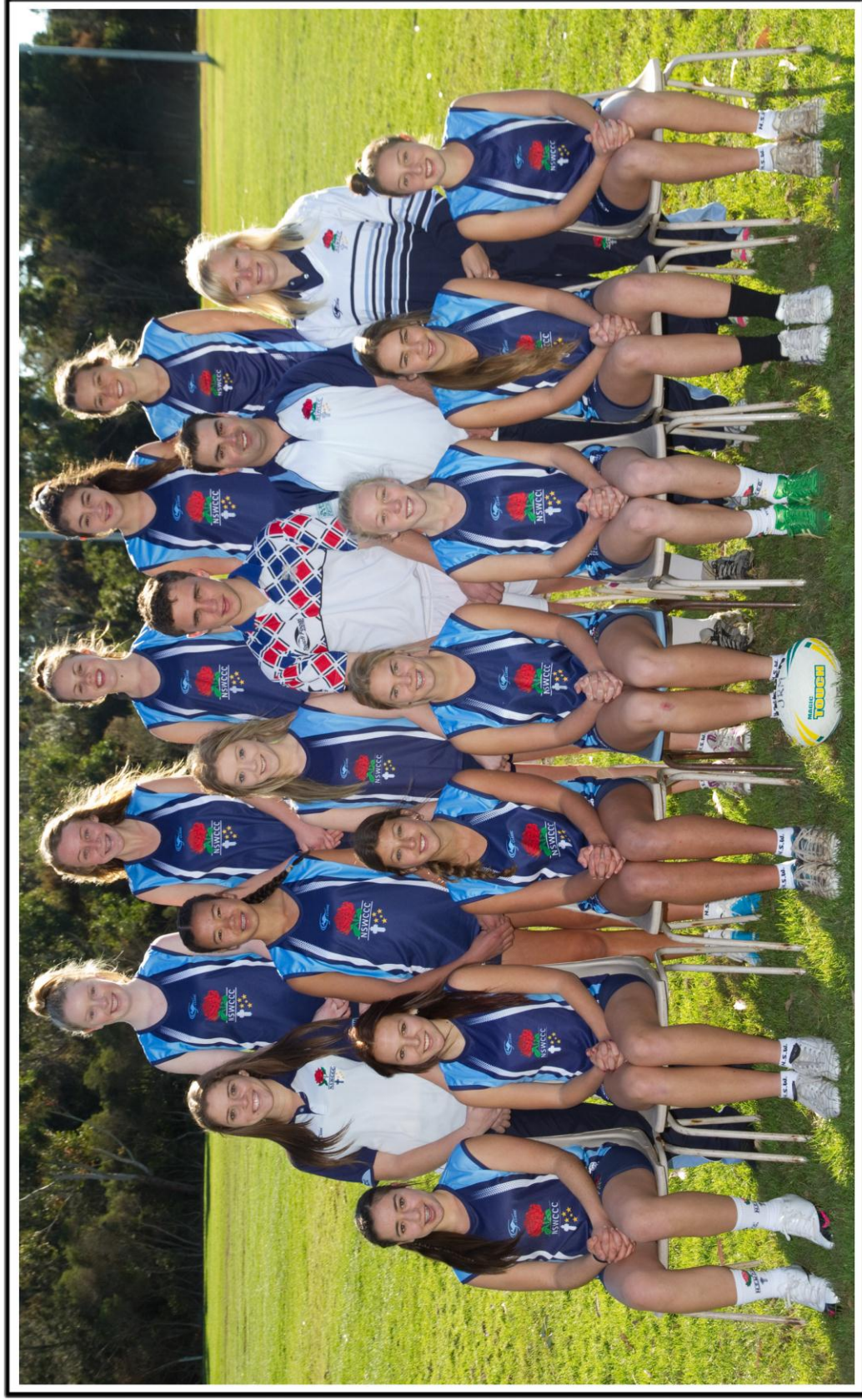
