



It gives me great pleasure to present this annual report on behalf of the executive, diocesan and association representatives and individual sport conveners. The scope of this report reflects another amazing year of sporting achievement for our catholic school students and staff in secondary schools across NSW. It provides a reflection of the incredible talent we have in our schools and the pathways that are available in a wide variety of sports. It is always rewarding to see students from our catholic secondary schools listed as members of NSW All School teams (140+ this year) & Australian teams (20+).

Pope Francis delivered a video message to the organisers, players and fans participating in the 2014 World Football Cup in Brazil expressing hope that, in addition to a celebration of sport, the event could be transformed into a festival of solidarity between peoples. He said that sport is not only a form of entertainment but a tool to communicate the values that promote the good of the human person and help to build a more peaceful and fraternal coexistence. This, he said, is a constant reminder of the sacrifices necessary to grow in the virtues that build the character of a person. At its best, sport is educational, exciting, uniting, stimulating, uplifting and beautiful. Sport glorifies God by lifting our spirits and creating genuine communities. These thoughts certainly have significance for our NSWCCC sporting endeavours.

The report that follows is a most detailed account of the many sporting events for the year. It highlights the representative pathways and illustrates the complex yet incredible organisation that takes place to allow all these opportunities to come to fruition. There is no doubt that our success as an association is a result of the tremendous support at a local level from our participating schools, Principals and teachers.

You are at the 'coal face' where these sporting opportunities are communicated and work tirelessly, often well outside your normal teaching duties, thank you. DIOCESE OF ARMIDALE

The Diocese of Armidale is the second largest diocese in NSW by area but is also the second smallest by student population. It contains just five secondary schools – McCarthy Catholic College Tamworth (893 students), O'Connor Catholic College Armidale (428), St Mary's College Gunnedah (371), Holy Trinity Central School Inverell (191) and St Philomena's Central School Moree (120). This year saw two new School Sport Coordinators join the Armidale Diocesan Secondary Sport Council with Anna Reed (St Philomena's Central School Moree) and Matt Feltrin (McCarthy Catholic College Tamworth) joining Peter Ehsman (Holy Trinity Central School Inverell), Greg Jones (O'Connor Catholic College Armidale) and Tim Kennedy (St Mary's College Gunnedah) on Council. Disappointingly there was no Principal's Representative on the Sport Council this year and there is growing concern about the support of Secondary School Sport within the Armidale Diocese by not just School Principals but also by teaching staff in general. It is getting increasingly difficult to find staff willing to give up their time to support Secondary School Sport. Thanks to the Armidale CSO for their continued support as well as the School Principals for allowing their students and staff to be involved with NSWCCC Sport.

The Armidale Diocesan Investment Group (ADIG) once again provided financial support to the Secondary Sport Council this year which allowed us to keep costs to students down considerably. ADIG have been a valued long-term supporter and we hope the relationship continues for many years to come. Prosperity IQ was a new supporter this year providing us with a platform to process orders and payments for our Diocesan Uniforms. Hopefully this process will be used again next year as we move towards using the available technology to streamline the payment process.

Finally, a huge vote of thanks from the Armidale Diocese to everyone involved with the organisation and running of NSWCCC Sport in 2014. The past few years have seen huge changes in the way things are done but what has remained constant has been the calibre of the people involved – well organised but still willing to listen and be understanding of our needs and concerns. There are 11 secondary schools in the Maitland/Newcastle Diocese. We are proud of the number of talented and committed students we have, not only for what they achieve in their sport but also for the manner in which they take part. Many of these students have also managed to combine their sporting achievements with rigorous academic programs.

DAY 1

Day 1 began with the boys competing in the 36 hole SSA Strokeplay Championship and at days end Isaac Noh shot 72 – 70 to win the event and add his name to the trophy which includes the likes of current USPGA Tour players Geoff Ogilvy and Jason Day. All the NSW boys played well, winning the SSA team Strokeplay - Dean Shakes Trophy by a massive 24 shots from Victoria with Qld a distant 3rd.

All the NSW players placed in the top 13 with Blake shooting 72-72, Luke 74-71, Mitch 76-69, Daniel 75-71 and Will 77-75. The tricky Toowoomba City layout placed a premium on straight driving with a number of players using long irons off the tees in the afternoon session. This change in strategy resulted in better scores during the second 18 holes and an unassailable lead for the NSW Team.

DAY 2

Up early for the usual difficult clash with the talented Victorian boys team. Luke Ferrier and Will Barnett jumped out of the blocks leading their matches early giving the whole team confidence heading into the back nine. The top half of the team struggled with Blake losing 2 down, Daniel 2/1 and Mitch losing 3/2. Isaac recovered to finish all square but the heroes were Will and Luke winning 3/1 and 5/4 respectively. This gave the match to Victoria 3. 5 to 2.5, which shocked the NSW team, which hit-off as clear favourites to win after their strong win in Monday's Strokeplay.

The afternoon matchup was against an all new South Australian line up. The boys played well early and made a clean sweep of their match eclipsing S.A. 6-0 with Blake winning 1 up, Isaac 6/5, Daniel 3/2, Mitch 6/4, Will 2/1 and Luke 2 up. The day's results had the NSW team in 3rd place behind the undefeated Victorians and Qld.

DAY 3

Educational Excursion

Cobb and Co Museum was the venue this year with Beatles memorabilia, Toowoomba Sports stars as well as an historical expose on transport through the early years of Australian settlement. Student also involved themselves in leathercraft and woodburning. A quick game of basketball followed with Barnett the star. Thankfully, there were no injuries as we headed into day 3 with matches against ACT and Qld.

DAY 4

The ACT Team are always difficult to overcome and the morning matches proved to be very close in the early stages. Will Barnett continued his unbeaten run with a 2/1 victory. Luke Ferrier crashed back to earth after two solid wins losing 6/5. The top of the order stood up late in the morning with Blake Windred smashing 2013 SSA Champion 6/5 in a clinical display. Isaac won 2 up, Daniel Kolar 4/3 and Mitch Gannon completed the rout with a 6/4 win leaving NSW with a 5-1 victory and valuable match points heading into the afternoon "state of origin" clash with arch rivals Qld. Qld had beaten Victoria in the morning to open the door for the NSW team provided they could overcome the northerners.

A quick lunch and a confident NSW side had Qld on the ropes early with all players gaining ascendancy through 9 holes. The Qld team and management were shell shocked and although they fought back to win at number 1 and number 5, wins by Luke, Isaac, Mitch and Daniel cemented a 4-2 score line and a lead for NSW for the first time in the competition.

DAY 5

Friday dawned and with 6 very tired but talented players the team was confident of victory over what seemed to be an underachieving Western Australian lineup.

The equation was simple. Beat WA and the title was ours. Despite having the same win/loss record as Victoria heading into the last matches, NSW's superior individual matches statistics meant we only had to get 3.5 points from the last clash.

In a dour struggle with no more than three holes separating the players at day's end, NSW triumphed after much drama on the closing holes. With two holes to play Luke Ferrier was one down and at best hoping for a half. Luke kept his nerve winning the 17th and 18th holes to steal victory from his shattered opponent. The vital point was the difference between winning and losing. Will Barnett lost 1 down, Dan Kolar lost 3/2 but wins to Blake Windred, Mitch Gannon and Isaac Noh ensured 4-2 winning margin for NSW.

The win over the plucky sand gropers gave NSW the all important Matchplay Championship, regaining the shield they lost in Victoria 12 months ago. Victoria finished second for the first time in a number of years.

All competitors have the opportunity to be selected in the Australian Merit Team or SSA Team of the Year. Points are awarded for performance in both the strokeplay and matchplay events.

After a long meeting where 4 boys could not be separated for the 6th position in the team, a 4 hole play-off was used to select the lucky player. The play-off involved Daniel Kolar(NSW), Mitch Gannon(NSW), Blake Collyer(Vic) and Clay Lewis(WA). The WA boy was eliminated after bogeying the first and all remaining players parred the tricky par 3 second with Blake making an amazing up and down to secure his par. Off to the par 4 third hole and with Blake in good position after his tee shot the two NSW boys found themselves bunkered after indifferent approaches that led to bogeys. Blake's regulation par was enough to secure the final berth in the merit team.

Blake Windred and Isaac Noh were both selected in the School Sport Australia merit team.

It was great to be part of an event that brought so many talented golfers together. The tournament witnessed a course record and 3 holes in one. The camaraderie between the players is amazing.

The NSW Team all contributed to the team's winning of the SSA title. Every player should be proud of his efforts during the week.

It was great to be part of and watch the NSW Team play so well during the week. More importantly it was a pleasure to witness how they accepted victory and defeat, how they conducted themselves both on and off the course and how they treated officials, opponents and team-mates with the utmost respect. It was a privilege to be associated with this group of fine young men. They are a credit to their schools and families.

The NSW Girls' team had an extremely successful week. They won the National Competition in a close competition drawing their matchplay against Queensland 3 matches each. However their match wins against the other states gave them the Championship. Doey Choi, Santa Sabina College Strathfield was the leading golfer for the Tournament winning all her matches at No 1; winning the stroke event and setting a new course record – 69 in the first Round of the 36 hole stroke event. She was named as Captain in the Australian Merit team. The behaviour and sportsmanship of all girls was outstanding throughout the week.

NSWCCC RUGBY LEAGUE – 2014 ANNUAL REPORT



100 YEARS OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS RUGBY LEAGUE

2014 marked 100 years of playing rugby league in the Catholic schools of New South Wales. A schools competition began in Sydney on 20 May 1914, with matches being played at the Domain and Metters Sportsground, Erskineville. Nine schools took part, eight of which were Catholic and one Anglican – St John's Darlinghurst. These schools were:

St Benedict's Broadway
St Joseph's Newtown
St Mary's Cathedral
St Patrick's Parramatta
St Patrick's Church Hill
St Peter's Surry Hills
St John's Darlinghurst
St Vincent's Westmead
St James Forest Lodge

Winners of the first competition held in 1914 – St Vincent's Westmead



The event was recorded in *The Daily Telegraph* of 20 May 1914: "League football will enter upon an important stage of its career to-day. For the first time the 13-side game will be played by a number of school teams. The competition has been launched after considerable beating down of prejudices, and even now, only denominational schools have taken up the code"

A commemorative ceremony and games of Rugby League took place at Erskineville Oval on Tuesday 20 May 2014. Erskineville Oval is adjacent to where the old Metters Sportsground once existed. The three surviving schools that played in 1914, St James Forest Lodge, St Mary's Cathedral College and Parramatta Marist High all played matches at Metters in 1914, and took part in the event.

The event was attended by Rugby League greats Ron Coote and Bob McCarthy both of who are former students of Catholic schools. The Under 15 team had high hopes leading into the 2014 National Championships in Tamworth. 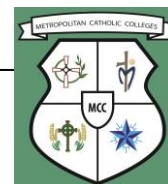

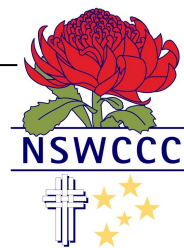

Alicia was nominated as the first shadow and was called into the team when four players withdrew because of Year 12 commitments and injury (Courtney Milone). Sarah Dimech, Karle Mangelsford and Emily Burke were also called into the team as shadows to replace those who withdrew. Sarah, Karle and Emily all filled their roles well and contributed positively to the team spirit. Alicia was moved from a middle position to the wing and also missed the first day of the NYC. This was disappointing and her inability to attend the first day of these championships was only communicated to team management on the Sunday evening prior to the tournament beginning on the Wednesday. 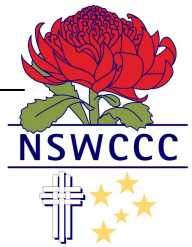

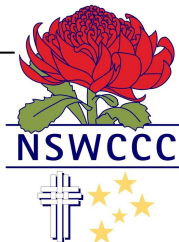

NSWCCC WATER POLO CHAMPIONSHIPS 2014 ANNUAL REPORT



Overview of Event

The CGSSSA Water Polo tournament was held over two days, on the 29th October and 31st October 2013. There were 10 teams entered into the Senior Division and 10 teams entered into the Junior Division. This meant there was a great mix of schools from both the CCC and CGSSSA associations. The Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre (SOPAC) allowed students to play in an impressive facility. The growth in the depth of water polo players and teams in both divisions across schools is a real positive for both the CGSSSA and CCC associations. Monte, North Sydney, OLSH, Kensington and Stella Maris, Manly (in both the junior & senior divisions) were the standouts teams of the event.

Evaluation

The championships ran smoothly however the timing in the senior division posed a problem with recovery and timing allocated between semi-finals and finals. SOPAC Staff were amazing with the setup and re-configuration of equipment was spot on. This is the first time this has been the case in 5 years. There were numerous players from a variety of schools with long nails, which continued to delay the commencement of round games. All schools arrived on time and had players and coaches sorted to commence games at 8.30am. The booking through Kym Skeritt was perfect and paid for with all requests accommodated. The staff present on pool deck for both days were fantastic and the purchasing of new scoring equipment made the final easier to adjudicate. Having SOPAC staff run this scoring for finals was also brilliant. Having no lane to warm-up in due to heavy NSWIS swimming bookings was frustrating for teams playing in the second games, but we made do with what we had. The officials were highly organised and did their best to support all players from the elite to the beginner. However, an official's uniform is required to be worn and this was supposedly guaranteed earlier when booked. The St Clare's College students who were recorders also proved to be an asset to the tournaments overall success.

There were a few issues that arose during the two days. Although it has been mentioned over the last few years and also in numerous emails for this carnival we still had a large number of players with long nails. In terms of safety it is crucial that staff or coaches for teams ensure that students DO NOT play with long nails. All teams were inspected by the convenor prior to their first game but it was something that should be overseen by staff from individual schools.

There was a last minute change to the senior draw this didn't cause hassles from anyone except the convenor. All coaches received this update via email and in hard copy on arrival to the pool. The draw was also posted onto the CCC Website, which was also highly beneficial.

Staff from all competing schools read the By-Laws associated with the sport and seemed more informed with the carnival. Coaches must also ensure they are fully aware of water polo rules so officials don't spend time coaching.

Strengths

All schools had an equitable amount of game play throughout the day making the tournament worthwhile for all teams. The juniors are continuing to grow in skill and the high standard of play throughout the day was a highlight. Overall, the sportsmanship demonstrated throughout was appropriate and was supported by the watchful eye of all the referees. Finally, the carnival was thoroughly enjoyed by all teams and was pleasing to see and was well supported by a growing number of parent spectators.

Recommendations

- Continue to use the streamlined registration process: All teams had to be entered via the CCC website which caused some initial confusion. I was given access this year to entries via Kym Skeritt, which helped immensely. This meant I could contact CCC schools directly through their details on the website.
- Better communication to competing schools: Continue to ensure all CCC schools competing in the carnival to be sent the CGSSSA by-laws and complete the same entry form as CGSSSA requesting the student's year group. The entry form must be a mandatory component of the registration process and cap numbers must be completed as these will become the template for scoring.
- Refinement of Game Play: Continued use of shot clocks and electronic scoreboard (for the finals only) to benefit staff, players and also spectators. Book in SOPAC official in advance to look at the running of this.

- All round games should continue to be 5 minutes / quarter and then 6 minutes for playoffs and semi-finals. As long as SOPAC can support it 5 minute actual time per quarter should continue in the finals.
- Logistics of Field: To make it less intense for the players perhaps staying on a smaller field make work for the final. Going to full court after playing 5 games is physically demanding for the athletes.
- Improved Safety Inspections: Staff from competing schools to continue to ensure that players have swimming cap as well as no long or acrylic nails. These will continue to be checked prior to the commencement of the days play for all schools.
- CCC Representation: Ensure that the CCC Water Polo data for the website is finalised by the end of 2014.

Results

In the Senior Division, Monte claimed back the trophy as a CGSSSA school beating Stella Maris 5-4.

In the Junior Division, Stella Maris again dominated the juniors with some amazing goals and excellent team play beating OLSH 20-0.

In the Senior Carnival, St Clare's College took out second place, whilst in the Juniors Santa Sabina finished as runners up in CGSSSA.

All round game, semi-final and playoff results can be forwarded to school co-ordinators.

Thanks must go to SOPAC, Chris Hook and Kym Skerritt from NSWCCC and all CCC teams for their continued collaboration in this event. A special thanks, to all CGSSSA Staff and students who supported the running of the day and entered into each game with enthusiasm and sportsmanship. My appreciation to the officials, especially John Cotterill, for their expertise and assistance in running the carnival so smoothly and to the students and staff at St Clare's College who made it a very successful tournament.
