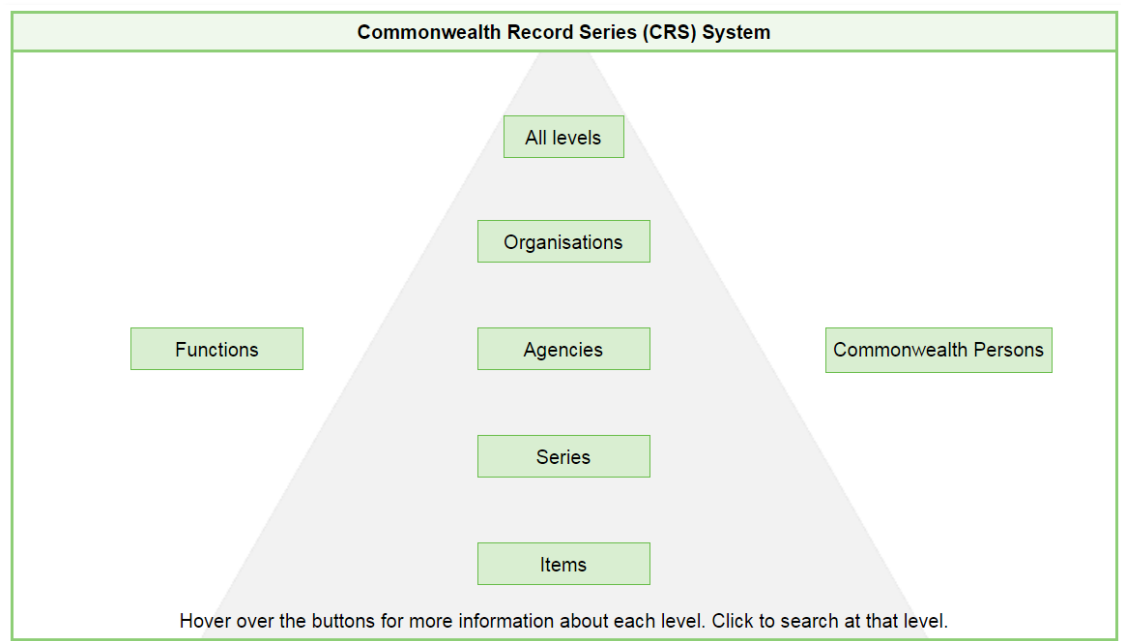




Virtual War Memorial FINDING DIGITISED WWII SERVICE RECORDS

Unlike World War One, many of the service records from World War Two, held at the National Archives in Canberra have not yet been digitised. This fact sheet guides you through finding digitised records from WWII.

- 1 Go to the National Archives of Australia “**Advanced Search**” page

- 2 Click on “**Items**” box at the bottom of the the Commonwealth Record Series System map

- 3 Enter the **Series number** for the records you wish to view (see below) and ensure that you select the “**Digital Copies only**” checkbox at the bottom of the page, then click search.

Please Note: If you wish, you can narrow down the search to South Australia by typing in SA as a keyword. This will find anyone whose place of birth, home town or enlistment as South Australia.
