<p>Content</p> <p>Main Idea <i>What is the main idea?</i> <i>Describe in detail what you see and read.</i> <i>List the important words, phrases, and images.</i></p>	<p>Creator</p> <p>Citation <i>When was this created?</i> <i>What type of source is it?</i> <i>Who created the source?</i> <i>What you know about this person?</i></p>
<p>Context</p> <p>Situation <i>What was happening during the war (and at home) at the time this source was created?</i> <i>What was happening at the place this source was created?</i></p>	<p>Connections</p> <p>Prior Knowledge <i>How does this connect to what you already know?</i> <i>Does this source back-up the evidence found in other sources?</i></p>
<p>Communication</p> <p>Point of view/bias <i>What is the purpose of the source?</i> <i>Who is the intended audience?</i> <i>What is the creator's perspective (point of view)?</i></p>	<p>Conclusions</p> <p>Understanding <i>What evidence in this source helps to answer your inquiry/essential question?</i></p>
