TWO DAY HIGHLIGHTS OF KANGAROO ISLAND

To explore Kangaroo Island further and see some of the major attractions, you will need more than one day. By adding accommodation and an extra day to your travels, you will be able to enjoy the highlights of the island.

- Explore the pretty coastal village of Penneshaw, with spectacular views of the South Australian mainland.
- Share a bucket of prawns, and enjoy the delicious wines and views at Dudley Wine's cliff top cellar door.
- Join a KI Ocean Safari and see some of the island's marine life and coastline on one of the daily cruises departing from Penneshaw.
- Enjoy the hospitality and the fresh homemade pasta from the boys at Eatalians Kangaroo. A great place to stop for a bite to eat for breakfast, lunch or dinner.
- Get the camera out for some magnificent photos of stunning Pennington Bay. It also offers some of the best surfing on the island, although the waves can get quite rough.
- Discover the quiet, friendly fishing village of American River nestled on a hillside of native bushland.
- Sample some freshly shucked oysters from The Oyster Farm Shop, showcasing the best of KI's aquaculture and sustainable seafood.
- Discover the local successful honey industry – see the bees, learn about the extraction process and taste the honey flavours produced at Clifford's Honey Farm or Island Beehive.
- Take a guided tour through the stages of distillation at Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery, the only commercial distillery still in operation in South Australia.
- Sample the gins, vodkas and liqueurs at KI Spirits, made using native Australian Botanicals and locally grown or sourced ingredients.
- Explore Kingscote, the commercial hub and largest town on Kangaroo Island. With a population just over 2000, it was originally known as Queenscliffe and is a short distance south from Reeves Point.
- Enjoy an interactive, hands on and educational experience at Raptor Domain with either their Birds of Prey display or their Fang-Tastic show featuring friendly lizards and snakes.
- Stroll along the beach with your guide through a wild seal colony at Seal Bay Conservation Park, home to around 1000 of the rare Australian sea lions.
- Join a tour and walk amid the stalagmites, stalactites, helictites and towering columns of Kelly Hill Caves to discover how the caves and their decorations are formed.
- Marvel at Remarkable Rocks, a grouping of majestic granite boulders carved by nature, standing as sentinels over the Southern Ocean.
- Watch the fierce ocean swells at Admirals Arch, a natural archway framing Long-nosed Fur Seals basking on a rocky shoreline.
