


Chromatic notes are notes that do not belong in the given key, for example, if you are playing in C Major, the notes are C D E F G A B C - if a C# occurs in the music, this would be called a chromatic note, as it is not part of the C Major scale.

A **chromatic scale** is a scale which moves in semitone steps. The ascending scale is written with sharps # but the descending scale is written with flats b

For example, going up C, C#, D, D#, E, F, F#, G would be written G, Gb, F, E, Eb, D, Db, C when coming down the scale.

This means one note can have two names – this is easiest to see on a keyboard



An **Enharmonic Equivalent** (E.E.) is a note which sounds the same but is written differently eg C# = Db

In this **Chromatic Combo game**, you can match the note on the staff with either of its names, so if it is written as C# on the music staff, you can match this with both C# and Db (further game rules in card pack)
