1. When the Judge, Ehud, died what did the Israelites do?
2. Is the cycle continued in the church? Does the church / leaders serve as a firewall to protect society in general? Explain!
3. What would happen to society if that firewall was not in place?
4. What did God do with His people when they sinned?
5. What does it mean that God sold His people?
6. What do we know of Jabin and his forefathers? Do you think he had a grudge to settle?
7. What do we know of Deborah? Does Deborah's appointment say something about the state of leadership in Israel?
8. What do we know of Barak? What are we to make of Barak's response to Deborah in v.8?
9. What does Barak lose in his response?
10. Why does Sisera think he has the winning edge? What does he not count on? Why does he think he is safe in Jael's tent? Does Jael break the code of Middle Eastern Hospitality?
11. Who else was betrayed by a friend?
12. The Israelites could not drive out the Canaanites straightaway. They had to build their strength. Does this apply to the church in dealing with enemies, and with the sinner in regard to dealing with sin?
