**Domestic Premises** are premises that are used for residential or residential and business purposes. Examples of domestic premises conducting business in urban areas might include a doctor's surgery at the doctor's home or a hairdressing salon attached to a house. Examples in rural/urban areas include hobby farmers that live on the property. The portion of domestic premises that is used for primary production is considered non-domestic.

**Non-domestic Premises** are all other premises not included in the above definition. Examples include schools, churches, shopping centres and recreational parks. Any portion of domestic premises that is used for primary production is also considered non domestic.

1. A permit is not valid until it has been signed by you and witnessed by the issuing authority.
2. **Burning is only allowed between the hours of 10am and 3pm Monday to Saturday.**
3. **Burning on Sundays and Public Holidays is prohibited.**
4. Materials to be burnt must be placed in an area that allows for a four-metre clearance around the fire area.
5. Only dry wood, paper, cardboard, garden and pruning's are to be burnt.
6. No wood treated with copper arsenate or other chemical preservatives, household rubbish, plastic or rubber to be burnt.
7. Council will inspect all permit application sites.
8. Council reserves the right to inspect the property prior to or during the burn.
9. The permit may be cancelled or revoked at any time should any of the conditions or requirements of the Permit not be adhered to. The fire prevention officer may do this verbally or in writing.
10. The fire must not be left unattended at any time until it is extinguished.
11. Burning is prohibited on a total fire ban day.

EPA Burning Policy Permits will only be issued outside the fire danger season from 1st May to 30th November.

**The fire danger season is from 1st December to 30th April**
