APPENDIX - 'AT A GLANCE': MISCELLANEOUS SOURCES

The following is material I found when the annotated bibliography approached completion, but did not have time to examine further. However, I can show where it is located should interested readers wish to pursue further enquiries. Generally, the sources are in good condition and well-bound but they are also problematic in that:

- they do not include an author or compiler (ie. person, committee or society);
- lack proper titles (apart from what is on the spine) and/or title page;
- loose material such as letters, memoranda and other correspondence have been inserted in them and tend to confuse the process of dating a work and working out its chronological order;
- it is difficult to interpret what they are actually about;
- have not been catalogued.

(A) ABN (AUSTRALIAN BIBLIOGRAPHICAL NETWORK) SOURCES

(B) GAWLER INSTITUTE ARCHIVES

Account Book.

The title page reads "Date showing amount deducted from Subscriptions Year Ending Jany 28 1895". It records register numbers and monetary figures. There are also amounts for the year ending January, 1896.

Account Book.

The spine is damaged and contents cover the period January, 1869 to December, 1893. It has many entries concerning the Bank of South Australia, land accounts, credits and debits for the Gawler Institute.

AOF Bushman's Pride Trustees Minute Book, 30 March (1855) - 20 August (1902), 16 vols.

AOF refers to Ancient Order of Foresters. All the entries have been written in varying degrees of legibility, and concern resolutions on loan applications, minutes of meetings, court proceedings, etc. Occasionally, some volumes have loose correspondence attached, such as memos of the Independent Order of Rechabites. I have found a photograph dated 1906, *Trustees of Court Bushman's Pride, A.O.F.* and the men in the picture are identified as D. Thomson, W. Antwis, C.G. Rebbeck, C.A. Linke and A. Stewart.

Annual Subscriptions 1869-1898.

This volume is rather large (533 pages in length) and I think it is a subscription book for the Gawler Institute. Inserted in it are loose sheets recording financial balances for 1904 and 1905.

Assessment Book.#

On the first page is the heading "Assessment Book for the Corporation of Gawler", and this accompanies the records for the various Wards (ie., Willaston, Evanston, Central, Barossa, Church Hill, Gawler South) throughout. Records begin with the year ending 30 June, 1936 and end at 30 June, 1938. The information concerns assessment of property for rates and includes owners' names, addresses and size of property. Throughout (in red ink) are alterations for fines remitted.

Book Committee Meeting.

Probably refers to a committee of the Gawler Institute. The records of meetings are for the period 10 November, 1887 to 17 August, 1894.

This volume is actually kept in the Corporation Town Council's Strong Room

Committee Meeting Minutes.

I suspect that these also refer to the Gawler Institute. The first entry I could find is 17 February, 1873 and possibly end on 19 August, 1895.

Committee Social (?)

This may have been the original title on the spine which is damaged. On the title page is written: "Social Presentation to Mr. E.H. Coombe". The entries, which appear to have been done in 1914, record minutes of meetings, subscription lists, expenditure, a social to be held at the Institute Hall, various committees (general, excursion, social), Coombe testimonial receipts.

Garran, Andrew (ed.), *Australasia Illustrated, Parts 38 and 39 (no date)*. The Picturesque Atlas Publishing Company Ltd. (Sydney, 1886-1888).

These issues of what looks like a pre-war periodical were found lying at the bottom of a box. Part 38 (p. 842) introduces descriptions for Gawler and its region under the heading "Along the Railways: Northward". And it has an illustration titled "The Haystacks fo Gawler", showing hay-laden carts and (in the foreground), two men talking, perhaps a supervisor talking to an employee. The description of Gawler continues in Part 39 on pp. 843-46 (approaches to Gawler, North and South Para Rivers, Gawler River, Murray Street, monument to John McKinlay) and some comments on the town's political influence.

Gawler and Starr Bowkett Society.

I have found three volumes of material concerning this society. One volume is dated to the 1920s with occasional newspaper clippings and many loose letters of correspondence. Another is for the period 5 February, 1894 to 17(?) June, 1919. In this source are minutes of monthly directors' meetings and some inserted (typed) letters. The third has on the cover the title *Gawler and Barossa Starr Bowkett Society Minute Book*, for the period 3 November, 1921 to 2 July, 1931.

Gawler Floral Society Minutes.

Meetings were held in the High Street Hall and entries record attendees and various propositions, for the period 2 February, 1950 to 6 February, 1955. Included are typed notes presumably concerning this society's entries for the Gawler Show.

Gawler Institute Catalogue 1886, 2 vols.

Volume One (spine is in bad condition) is titled "Class A Fiction" and catalogues material under authors (in alphabetical order), library call number, title of work and remarks. Volume Two is titled "Class B to L" and these are categories for non-fiction works. It has a contents page

describing the kinds of literature in each class. Both volumes were especially printed for the Gawler Institute by E.S. Wigg & Son, Adelaide.

Gawler Institute Minutes of Committee Meetings.

These are rough notes in pencil in one volume, from 3 July, 1928 to 6 January, 1931.

Gawler Institute Official Catalogue.

It is a catalogue of literature received by the Gawler Institute from June, 1936 to 19 April, 1971. Handwritten notes record: (i) number of book (ii) title of work (iii) author (iv) from whom purchased or received (v) when obtained (vi) cost or value (vii) remarks.

Gawler Institute Receipts.

There are 26 tied bundles of receipts dated 31 March, 1901 to 20 September, 1930.

Gawler Institute Subscription Book.

Entries in this volume start on 1 January, 1918 and have been entered in pencil and ink. Contains material on "Juvenile Tickets".

Gawler Institute Subscription Book.

Entries in this volume start on 1 September, 1892 and on the title page is "Yearly Family Ticket". Some pages have been torn out. There are half-yearly and quarterly subscription amounts. Towards the back are (perhaps) records of borrowers' names and late returns.

Gawler Natural History Club.

In this volume, which is barely used but the entries are very legible, are entries for the period 13 August, 1854 to 8 September, 1857.

Gawler Progress Association Minutes.

Typed minutes of meetings conducted at the Town Hall during 23 May, 1935 to 17 March, 1937, by various committees.

Gawler Sub-Branch Australian Labour Party Minute Book 1952-1961.

One volume of detailed, handwritten minutes of meetings.

Journal.

In this volume are notes regarding "Gawler Memorial Buildings", but there are also attached letters to local business people and/or premises, for example, George W. Weaver, Plumber and Sheetmetal Worker (23 January, 1926) and the Union Bank of Australia Ltd., Gawler (February, 1927).

Journal.*

Town council financial records from 1 January, 1887 to 30 June, 1944, in handwriting on 266 leaves. Covers all aspects of local administration, particularly rates, town fund, sundries, police matters and care of the cemetery.

Ledger.

For the Gawler Institute, 1916-1918.

Ledger.

For the Gawler Institute, 30 April, 1916 and finishing at some indefinite point during the 1930s. It records members' subscriptions, revenues and expenditures and copies of laws relating to The Places of Public Entertainment Act, 1913.

Ledger.

For the Gawler Institute, February, 1932 to 30 June, 1951 with records of receipts and expenditure concerning library books and papers, renovations, electricity, petty cash, donations, etc. Inserted into this ledger book is loose correspondence from the Council of the Institutes Association of South Australia, Inc. (1951-54), and invoices concerning W. Dawson & Sons Ltd.

Ledger.

Includes an index at beginning and most entries (dated between 28 February, 1935 to January, 1946) allude to books, magazines and journals, electricity supply, hall licence, oil paintings and pictures, petty cash, Union Bank, sundries (expenditure). There is much in the way of loose and stapled-on correspondence from the Institutes Association of South Australia, Inc. to the secretary of the Gawler Institute, mainly about grant allocations.

Ledger Books.

I found three volumes of ledger books which probably relate to the Gawler Institute. The first is dated July 1882-1885 and is 702 pages long. It records, in pencil, information on books issued and returned. In another volume dated February, 1935 to 1951 there are various headings and it includes lots of loose, unsorted letters regarding "Institutes Association of South Australia, Incorporated" during the 1940s and 1950s. The third volume (1912-1915) has various headings as well and they relate to financial matters.

Ledger Books.

Students' Fees for the period February, 1914 to July, 1917 with material on scholarship fund donations and bank interest.

Ledger C.C.M.

Overall, this volume is for the years 1910-1948. However, there is lots of stapled correspondence (written and typed) on local government matters, especially notes for the Engineering and Water Supply Department (money orders and water rates) and rent collection notices.

Members Roll. Gawler Union Parliament.

Notes concerning officials, members and speakers for the period 24 May, 1907 to 19 September, 1912.

Minute Book.

It is not known for what society this volume was written but it does indicate that meetings were held in the Gawler Institute building. The dates covered are 7 April, 1892 to 27 October, 1892.

Minute Book (?).

Records various kinds of tickets and dates for the 1920s and 1930s.

Minutes of Meetings of Gawler Baptist Young Men's Literary Society (1901-1904).

The subtitle reads: "Alterations of Name Second of March 1903 to Gawler Baptist Literary Society. Meetings open to all". This volume provides much information on the activities of the society for the period 1 July, 1901 to 8 August, 1904. The writing is very legible.

Note Book (?).

Contains a lot of material on matters relating to the W.E.A. from September 1913 to 5 March, 1917. There is also a typed letter inserted, dated 22 April, 1918.

Subscriptions.

Of note are the "Minutes of Meeting of the Gawler Liberal League", recorded at the Gawler Institute and other places, such as the home of E.H. Coombe.

Union Parliament Members Roll.

This volume lists members, members' district society (inside and outside Gawler), speakers, meeting attendees, etc. It covers the period 24 May, 1907 to 12 September, 1912.

(C) CORPORATION OF TOWN OF GAWLER - STRONG ROOM

Barossa Ward.

Receipts and expenditure statistics for rates, sanitary service, public health utilities (eg., Hutchinson Hospital, Infectious Diseases Hospital), elections, wages. Covers the period 1 July, 1936 to 6 July, 1954.

Cash Book.

All entries deal with Gawler South (see Gawler South 1899-1923 Statements in the spine of this volume). Furthermore, all entries appear to be countersigned with "audited and found correct".

Cash Book.

Inside the front cover are two receipts (1951) concerning R. Davies, contractor, situated at Eighth Street, Gawler West - both are "paid in full". Only leaves 1-61 have been used and data starts on 27 June, 1916 and ends at 6 December, 1954. It lists paysheets, repairs to roads, bank balances, main and district roads, grants, etc.

Cash Book.

For the period 8 June, 1918 to 9 November, 1925, and covers such things as rates, street watering, depasturing, sale of manure, hire of hall, rentals, salaries, nightwork, sanitary service, hospital licences, etc.

Cash Book.

The initials "E.L." appear on the spine but it is not indicated subsequently what they represent. The various municipal business concerns (rates, wages, insurance, etc.) are recorded for the period 5 June, 1914 and end on 22 December, 1923.

Cash Book G.S. [Gawler South] Statements (1923-1933).

Opening page indicates the nature of the contents: "Balance Sheet of the District Council of Gawler South, for the 12 months ending June 30th 1923", and ending on 30 June, 1933.

Central Ward.

Same sort of records as Central Ward, for the period 1 July, 1936 to 14 July, 1954.

Day Book.

Inside the front cover are receipts for the Lord Mayor's Fund for Greek Soldiers' Appeal (January-February, 1941). This volume includes: names, addresses and remarks on enlisted men from in and around Gawler; names and military address for men who have received wallets or pens; financial records from 1930s; Air Raids Appeal Fund (September, 1940); memorandum book to record donations for the Gawler Greek Appeal

Fund (signed by mayor on 9 January, 1941); receipts for Lord Mayor's Fund concerning British Air Raid Victims (1940).

Engineer's Stock Book.

Despite this title appearing on the spine, this is actually a collection of council meeting notes (all in pencil), for the period 1 January, 1924 to 19 January, 1925. Summaries of councillors' utterances on various matters (eg., by-laws, contracts, notices of motion, previous meeting minutes confirmed, etc.).

Evanston Ward.

Same sort of records as Barossa and Central Ward, for the period 1 July, 1936 to 14 July, 1954.

Health Report.

Copies of notices to householders on the state of sanitation of their houses or properties, as required by the Local Board of Health - Municipality of Gawler under Part VI of the Health Act (1935). Dates are 11 March, 1936 to 8 August, 1940.

Journal.

Concerns payments in the North Ward, between 18 July, 1917 and 1 July, 1933. What exactly has been paid for by recorded individuals is not shown.

Journal.

Covers the period 1 July, 1937 to 28 February, 1940 and involves many aspects of municipal government in Gawler. Includes a loose leaf circular on "Unemployment Relief Council Act, 1930. Unmarried Persons".

Journal.

Inside the front cover is written "Gawler South Ward". Records payments and receipts for rates, Hutchinson Hospital, remittance of fines, sundries, wages, council commitments, sanitation, etc., for the period 1 July, 1939 to 14 July, 1954.

Journal.

For 30 November, 1912 to 22 December, 1923. Accounts of the Corporation of Gawler, including its various plants and buildings. It cites various local businesses (including James Martin & Co.), current accounts and working accounts.

Ledger.

List of mayors, 1857-1979; list of councillors, 1857-1933, and from 1934-1979, councillors for Barossa, Central, Church Hill, Evanston, Gawler South and Willaston Wards; list of town clerks, 1857-1954; list of Gawler streets; list of corporation properties, 1913; land values assessment, 1913; list of deed records (conveyances); office furniture, 1928-1956/57; plant

inventory, 1928-1953; loans, 1923; by-laws, emphasising those repealed and gazetted in the 1930s; dry wells, 1923; installation of septic tanks, 1922-1945; new buildings - additions, 1923; street lights; council appointments; exhibition building; appointment of ranger.

Ledger.

The date 1914 appears on the spine. This volume starts on 1 December, 1914 and carries through to 1 July, 1933. Headings include: fire brigades board; electric lights; ornamental grounds; rates; national bank; labour materials; health; street watering.

Ledger Book.

Begins on 8 July, 1910 and ends in 1935 (unspecified date). The headings are: Day Labor; Labor; Metal breaking; Metal; Sundries; List of pans (East Ward, North Ward, West Ward; and land, building and stock inventories for district councils.

Letter Book.

"Gawler Corporation" appears on title page, inside front cover. It has an A-Z cross-reference index and carbon copies of corporation letters, mostly typed but some handwritten. The period covered is 19 February, 1907 to 7 January, 1914.

Letter Book.

Has an A-Z cross-reference index and carbon copies of corporation letters. There is only occasional reference to the war in the period represented, 17 October, 1916 to 9 July, 1918.

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. These record business for the period 19 September, 1922 to 10 April, 1923. Correspondence deals with business tenders, sanitary service, householders' concerns, government instrumentalities, etc.

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. These are out of sequence in some places but they fall between the period 3 April, 1918 and 22 April, 1919. They shed light on Gawler's contribution to the war effort. Of interest is a circular, situated between pp. 270-271, on the influenza outbreak and dated 14 December, 1918.

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. Quite a few refer to Gawler County Board of Health during 3 April, 1918 to 2 May, 1919, which were years of the influenza epidemic.

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. Many letters are addressed to the South Australian Soldiers' Fund in Adelaide. The time covered is 14 May, 1919 to 26 May, 1920. Letters after this one are not in chronological sequence.

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. Many letters are copies to the Department of Repatriation and concern: the plight of soldiers, their wives, widows and families; pension queries; apprenticeships; applications for employment. The time covered is 22 August, 1919 to 24 March, 1922. Letters after this one on p. 563 are not in sequence.

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. After p. 976 the letters cease to run in sequence; up to that point they start at 2 May, 1919 and end at 18 January, 1921. There is a loose two page letter from The Adelaide Electric Supply Company, Ltd. to Gawler's Town Clerk on the company's inability to supply the town (5 January, 1921).

Letter Book.

Begins with an A-Z index at the front, the names of individuals, businesses etc being cross-referenced to each carbon copy-type letter. After p. 916 the letters cease to run in sequence; up to that point they start at 25 January, 1921 and end at 7 December, 1922.

Minute Book.

The title is misleading, there are no actual minutes of council meetings in this volume. See p. 2 note: "Sand Royalties South Para River page 225 onward". Records begin on 1 September, 1925 under "North Para River". Statistical information on cart and truck numbers, amount of sand cut and moved, price per load. See references to "Sand Returns".

Minute Book (Licence - Record)

Covers the period 30 June, 1933 and ends in June, 1953. Page 1 is indexed as follows: petrol pumps (p. 5); restaurant and fish shop (p. 51); dairies (p. 61); milk (p. 71); explosives (p. 81); hospitals (p. 91); weighbridges (p. 171); manufacturing (p. 101); slaughtering (p. 111); bakehouse (p. 109).

Minute Books (1906-1938), 3 vols.

There are three volumes dealing with typical local council business: various committees' reports; rates; unemployment relief; finances; public

works; expenditure, etc. The specific volume dates are as follows: 1906-1915; 1928-1933; and 1933-1938.

Register of Cases.

The title is taken from the main heading on each page and it appears to be for the District of Gawler, beginning on 30 November, 1926 and ending on 31 July, 1930. Nurses have recorded and signed the names of patient, address, disease, doctor, remarks, dates of visits (and total number of visits), and occasional deaths of patients.

Untitled.

An exercise book in which only the first 6 leaves are used, it is nonetheless interesting for the light it sheds on the proposed Band Rotunda in 1909. The first meeting for the "Committee re Band Rotunda" was held on 20 May, 1909. Loose items are attached to this document: (i) a lead and blue pencil drawing of a rotunda, with 275 pounds inscribed (ii) memorandum book regarding subscriptions to erecting a Band Rotunda "in Gawler in the Enclosure known as the old Cemetery" (iii) Gawler Band account book with The National Bank of Australasia Limited (iv) folded/creased papers, memorandums, dated 1909.

Untitled.

Account book for The National Bank of Australasia Limited, for the period 8 August, 1939 to 5 July, 1954.

Untitled.

An account book dated from 19 May, 1948 to 29 December, 1950 with records for rates, etc., all handwritten.

Untitled.

Begins on 7 August, 1944 and ends at 30 June, 1967. Handwritten records for all aspects of town business (rates, town fund, fines, salaries, business licences, cemetery administration, hospital, etc.).

Untitled.

An revealing summary of the daily work commissioned by councillors to keep Gawler tidy and functioning normally in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The dates covered are 1880 to 13 February, 1928. This volume records work proposed by councillors, the nature of this work, by whom it will be carried out, when work commenced, and rough estimate of cost of the work. There are numerous references to road and footpath repairs, moving of limestone, mending fences and embankments, building alterations, grass cutting, care of the cemetery, painting, tree planting, and agriculture-related duties (eg., horse feed, chaff).

War Records (1916).

This is one of the most interesting documents found. It contains lists of men required to report on various dates in 1916 for recruitment into the army. Particularly interesting are the notes in the 'excuse or reason given' for not turning up at the appointed time and place. Men living at Sandy Creek, Rosenthal, Rowlands Flat, and Cockatoo Valley. The Lyndoch District call-up notice is interesting as it shows many German names! There is an eleven page long "List of Names of Refusals", those who are medically unfit for army service, and a few loose call-up notices to individuals included.

Ward Book.

Assessment numbers, names, addresses and summaries of sanitary service to Barossa Ward, Willaston Ward, Central Ward, Church Hill Ward, Gawler South Ward, Evanston Ward, from 30 June, 1944 to 30 June, 1955.

(D) GEOFFREY MANNING'S DATABASE

Geoffrey Manning is a published author (for example, *Place Names of South Australia* (1990)) and maintains a huge database of records on South Australia, culled from all of South Australia's first newspapers (some of which no longer exist). He has been working on this for several years. At last count he estimates that he has found a minimum of 800 newspaper citations relating to Gawler and its region. Locality headings include Gawler, Roseworthy, Gawler Plains, Gawler River, North and South Para Rivers, Kangaroo Flat, Sandy Creek, Bassett, Bentleyville and Willaston. Geoffrey Manning has stated that his entries for the Barossa Valley contain many entries involving Gawler (for example, Barossa Flax Milling Co.). In the Reading Room of the Mortlock Library is a pictorial collection dating back to the early colonial era. There are two index books (no author or publisher sighted) for this collection. One is for location, the other is for subject. The location volume contains 89 references for Gawler, 73 for Willaston and 5 for Roseworthy. "Sir Winston Dugan" engine built at Islington, driven by the Governor - leaving Adelaide Railway Station to Gawler. Hills run through Millswood, Upper Sturt - views from the train, including homes at Mount Lofty. Waterstop - turntable - running repairs/service - return home.

The Honorary Magistrate, vol. 1, no. 1 (1904) - ongoing.

This journal is the publication of the Royal Association of Justices of South Australia. At the time of first publication, the association had been in existence for six years. Much of the journal's contents relate to the experiences of justices of the peace in country areas, in performing their duties: railways, rape, rates, recognisances, recreation grounds, dogs, disorderly houses, drainage, etc. I have located a couple of Gawler-related records for issues published in April, 1913 (p. 454) and October, 1913 (p. 492).

The Kapunda Herald: and northern intelligencer. vol. 1, no. 1, 29 October (1864) - vol. 87, no. 5,692, 3 May (1961).

Kapunda has had long historical ties with Gawler through the importance of the copper ore industry and impact of railways. This newspaper was published by C.H. Barton (1864-1951). In these 87 volumes, which are illustrated, there are supplements for many issues and subtitles vary. For a period of time from 6 October, 1916 on, the last page had a separate title: "The Midlands Gazette".

The South Australian Government Gazette (1839 - ongoing).

Most volumes of the *Gazette* have an index at the beginning. From 1857, when Gawler was proclaimed a corporate town, references can be seen under "Corporations - Gawler Town" and subheadings are generally consistent: assessments, rates, by-laws, appointments or elections of council officers and police constables, proclamations, specific incidents, etc. There are many references to Gawler in the 1857 volume alone (pp. 448, 526, 684, 826, 921-24, 958) but it would also pay to look under individuals' names and other subject headings: for example, railways, tenders, licences, businesses, companies, proclamations, etc.

Videodisk [database].

The videodisk database contains 50,000 photographs, paintings, sketches, etc. of South Australian colonial history. It can be used to specify any time or place. Typing "Gawler" produces 768 'hits' on the viewing list but the researcher or reader must carefully sift through this list to eliminate "Gawler Place" or "Governor Gawler" entries. Typing "Gawler Town" produces 2 'hits': one of the Gawler Town Hall, another of a sketch c. 1866 describing Gawler Town, "general view from the south".
