Internet Access - Conditions of Use

1. You must read and agree to the **Rules for using online resources and services** before using the service.
2. If you are under eighteen years of age, you must have permission from your parent or legal guardian to use the service. This permission is recorded on your library membership card.
3. Bookings are not essential and you may log in to any workstation that is available and suits your times. You need a One Card Network library card and your PIN to log in.
4. Sessions are limited to thirty or sixty minutes (dependent on the workstation) and you will be automatically logged out at the expiry of your session time. Daily limits are two bookings with a total of ninety minutes per day. Extensions of time are at the discretion of Library staff.
5. Material displayed on screen must be appropriate to a public access site as outlined in **Rules for using online resources and services** and are reproduced below. Where it is unclear, the final decision rests with Library staff.
6. Users wishing to download information from the Internet can do so on their own storage device, or alternatively can purchase a USB storage device from the Library. No liability is accepted for any loss or damage caused by the transmission of computer viruses.
7. To avoid crowding, only two people at a time can use an Internet workstation.
8. Access is free, but users wishing to print must pay the current charge per page. The Library does not refund printing costs for pages printed in error.
9. The Library strives to be a child safe environment and it is preferable that an adult accompany primary school children. The Library cannot accept responsibility for the supervision of children.
10. Users are not to adjust, change or tamper with settings on the workstations or printers.
11. Users are responsible for copyright requirements when using workstations.
12. The Library reserves the right to terminate your use of the facility if you breach these Conditions of Use.

Prohibited Activities

- Gaining access to any material which is pornographic, offensive or objectionable
- Engaging in any conduct which contravenes Federal, State or Local Council laws and regulations.
- Embarrassing or harassing (sexually or otherwise) another person.
- Engaging in any defaming message, including reading and then forwarding a message of which you are not the author.
- Sending or forwarding any material which is abusive, sexist, racist or otherwise illegal.
- If you reproduce protected material without the permission of the copyright owner you may infringe copyright and other rights such as trade marks and business name rights.
