The Australasian Furnishing Research and Development Institute (AFRDI) is an independent not-for-profit technical organisation providing standards, testing, and product certification for furniture products.

What do the AFRDI certification levels mean and what are they suitable for?



Level 4: Light commercial use;

office, hospitality.

Level 5: Medium commercial use; heavy duty

office use, hospitality environments or

moderate industrial.

Level 6: Heavy commercial use conditions.

What do the AFRDI Rated Load levels mean and what are they suitable for?



135 SS: Up to 135 kg for 40 hours per week.

135 MS: Up to 135kg for over 40 hours per week.

160 SS: Up to 160 kg for 40 hours per week.

160 MS: Up to 160 kg for over 40 hours per week.

Rated Load certification undergoes significant additional testing and exceeds Level 6 for strength, durability and stability.

Enviromental Certifications for Furniture



AFRDI Green Tick Certification allows environmentally conscious users to make a sustainable choice and can apply across all furniture types.

The Green Tick involves assessment of factors including:

- Material sourcing (e.g. sustainable forestry practices for wood procurement)
- Operating energy (e.g. how much power an electronic sit-stand desk consumes)
- · Waste generated during production
- End-of-life factors including recycling materials
