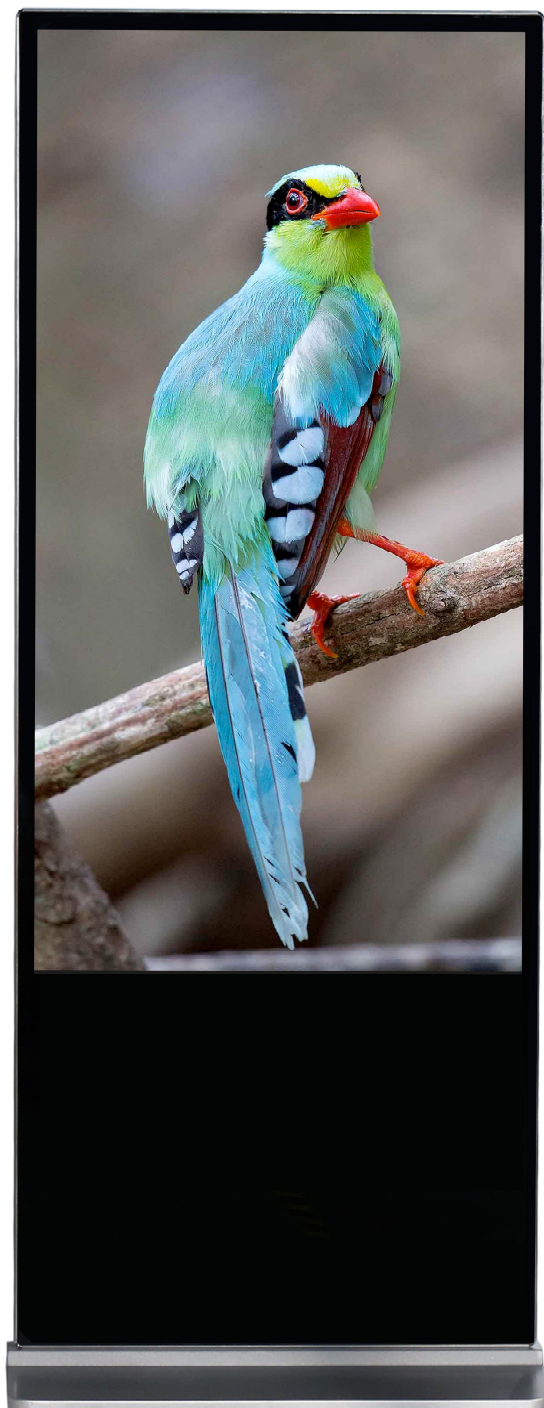

Electrical safety

To prevent overload, don't share the same mains supply socket with too many other items of equipment.

- Do not place any connecting wires where they may be stepped on or tripped over.
- Do not place heavy items on the leads, which may damage them.
- Hold the Mains plug, not the wires, when removing from a socket.
- During a thunderstorm or while leaving the Kiosk for long periods, disconnect the mains power.
- The PCB of the Kiosk is conformal coated to prolong electrical function
- Do not allow water or moisture to enter the kiosk do not use in wet or moist areas such as bathrooms, kitchens or near swimming pools.

Pull the plug out immediately, and seek professional help if:

- the mains plug or cable is damaged.
- liquid is spilt onto the set, or if it is accidentally exposed to water or moisture.
- anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots.
- the set does not work normally.

Do not remove the safety covers. There are no user serviceable parts inside. You may invalidate the warranty. Qualified personnel only are permitted to service this apparatus.

To avoid battery leakage, remove exhausted batteries from the remote control handset, or when not using for along period.

Do not break open or throw exhausted batteries on a fire.



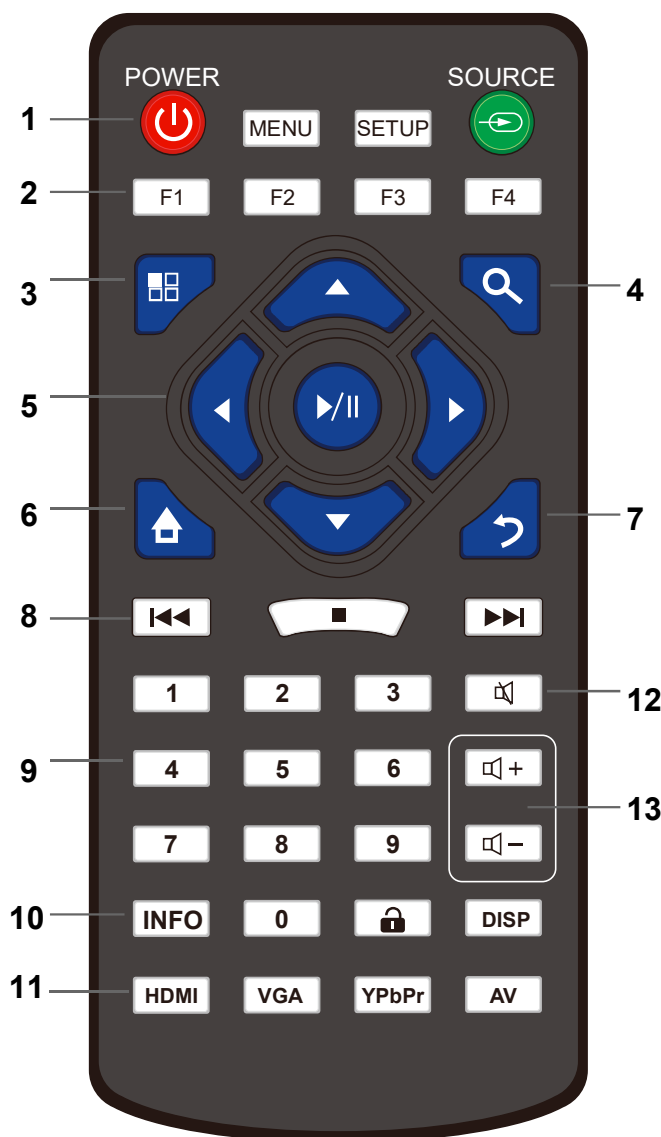
Physical safety

Do not block ventilation slots in the back cover. You may place the Kiosk in a cabinet, but ensure at least 5cm (2") clearance all around the unit.

Do not tap or shake the screen, you may damage the internal circuitry. Take good care of the remote control, do not drop it or allow it to come into contact with liquids.

To clean the TV use a soft dry cloth. Do not use solvents or petrol based fluids. For stubborn stains, you may use a damp soft cloth with diluted detergent.

1. Remote Control

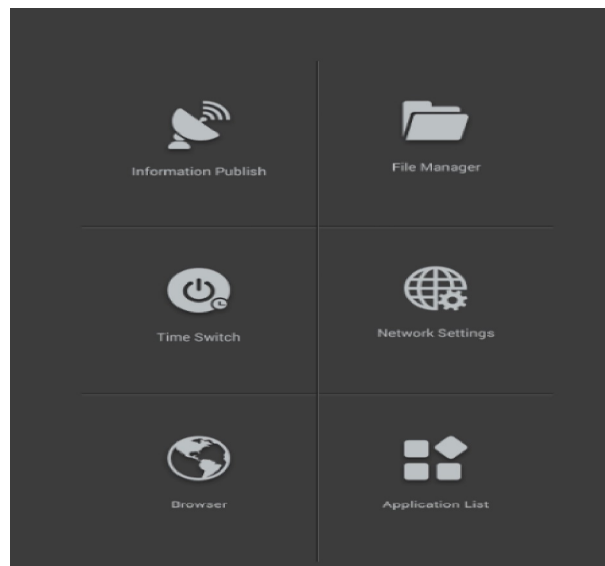


- 1. **POWER:** Turn the TV on/standby.
MENU: System setup menu.
SETUP: No Function.
SOURCE: Press to display the input source.
- 2. **F1:** Picture status.
F2: Sound status.
F3: Display mode status.
F4: No Function.
- 3. No Function.
- 4. No Function.
- 5. **Arrow Keys:** Allows you to navigate the on-screen menus and adjust the system settings to your preference.
- 6. **Home Page Button:** System setup menu.
- 7. **Back Up Button:** Exit the OSD menu.
- 8. **Back & Forward Buttons:** No Function.
- 9. **Number Buttons:** Press 0-9 to select the number.
- 10. **INFO:** Press to display the current mode information.
LOCK & DISP: No function.
- 11. **HDMI:** Press to go to the HDMI input directly.
VGA/YPbPr/AV: No function.
- 12. **Mute Button:** Press to mute the sound, press again to unmute.
- 13. **Vol+/-:** Adjust the volume.

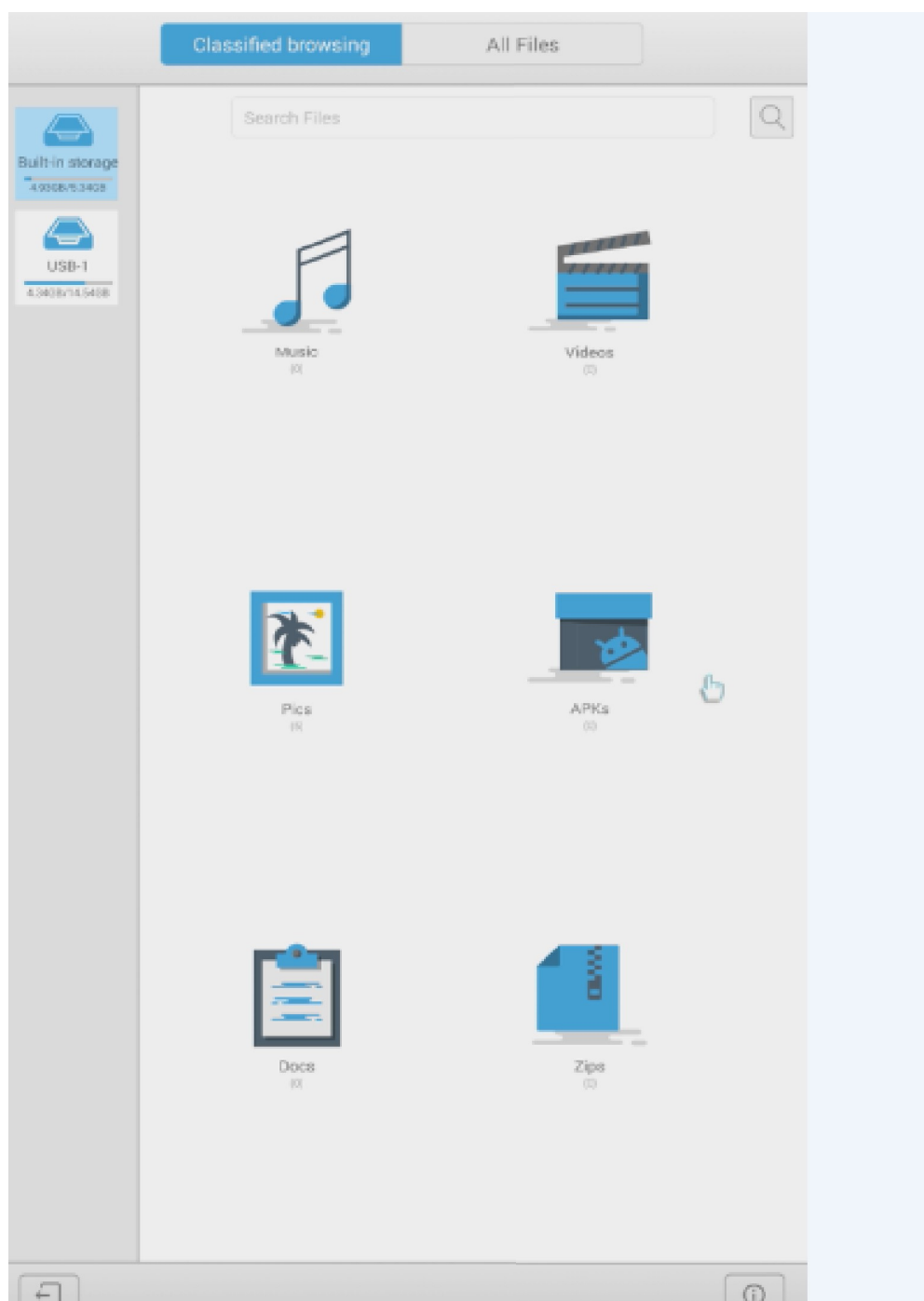


2.1 Information Publish

This function is not available on the 55" and 65" Kiosks.


2.2 File Manager

Use this to Set Auto Bootup and Shutdown Time settings for up to four time periods.



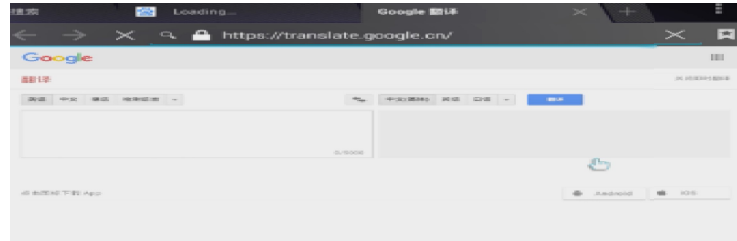

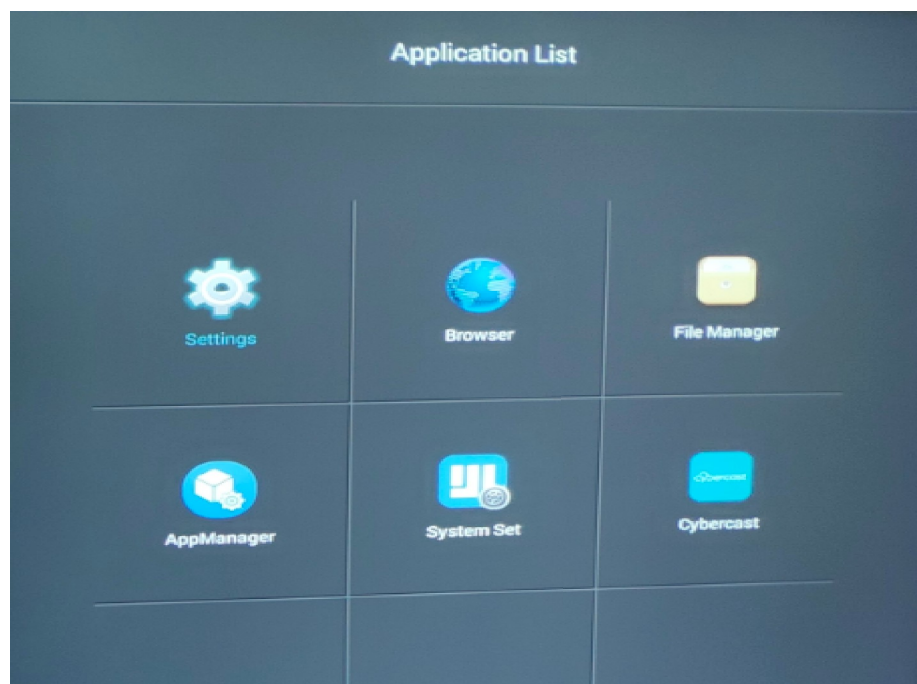

Use this to browse the internet.



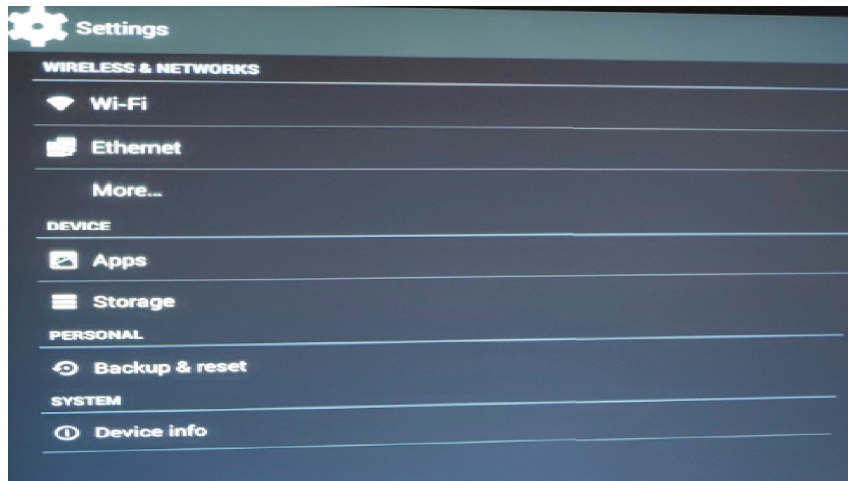
2.6 Application List

Use this to view all of the apps that are installed on the system.



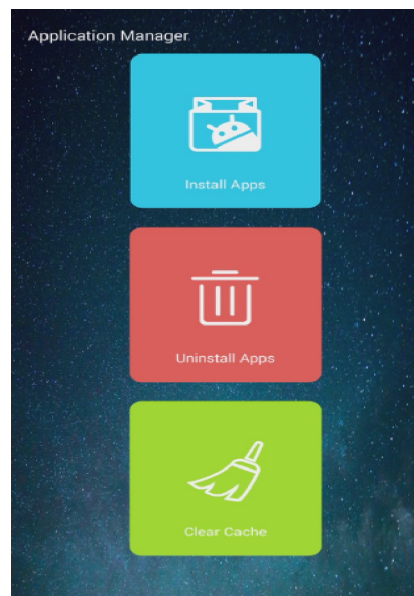
2.6.1 Settings

Use this to select a Wi-Fi network, check the internal storage information, and restore the default Settings.



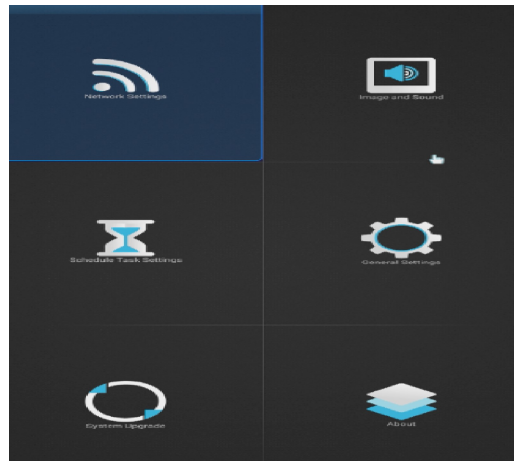
2.6.2 App Manager

Use this to view the Installed Apps, Uninstall Apps, and to Clear Cache.



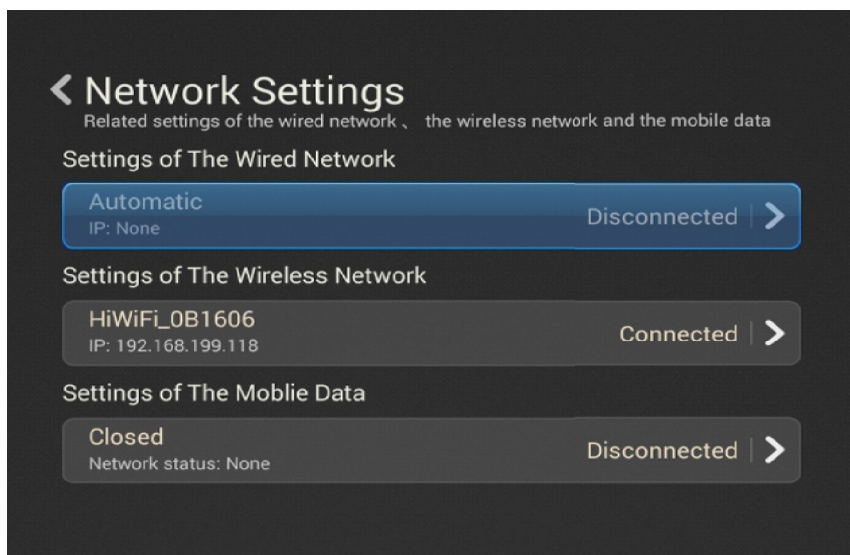

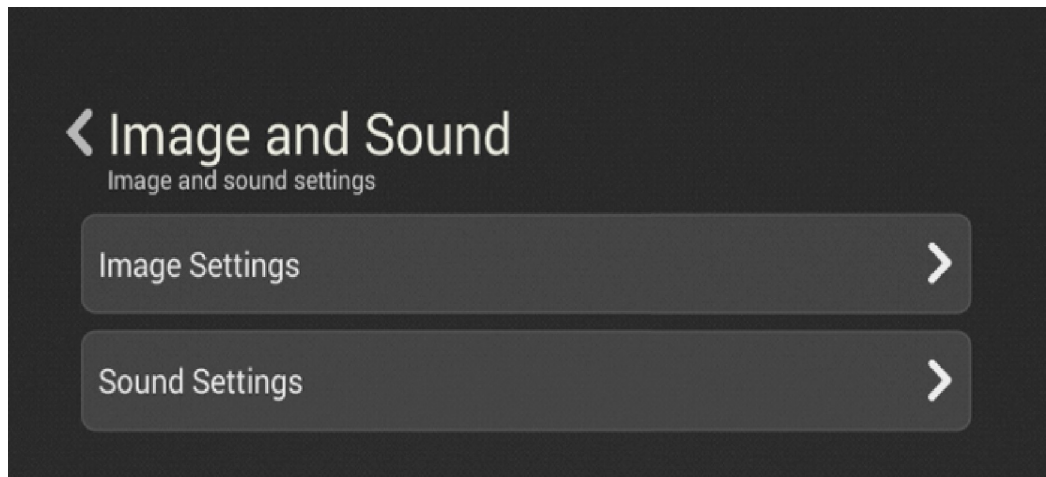
2.6.3-1 Network Settings

Use this to setup and connect to Wired Networks (LAN) and Wireless Networks (Wi-Fi).



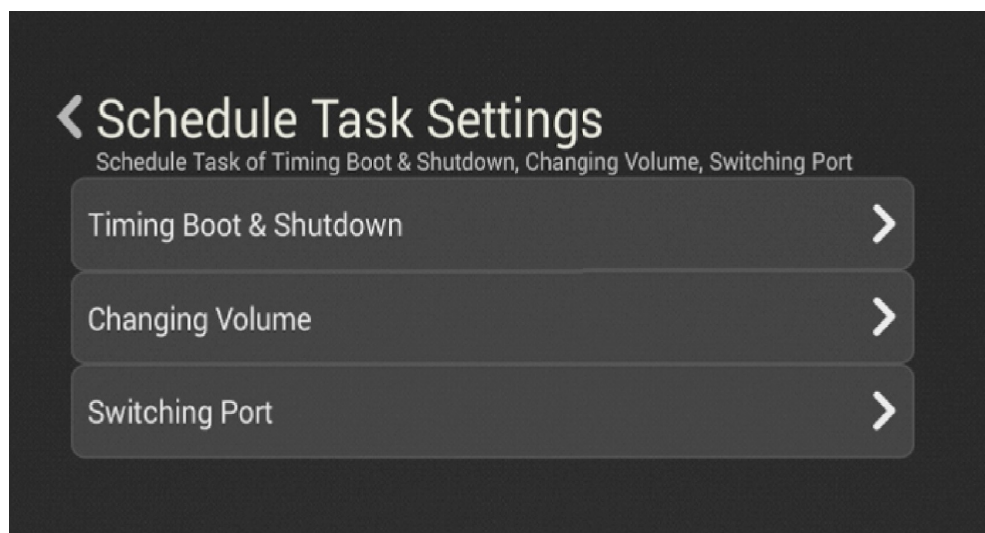
2.6.3-2 Image and Sound

Use this to select the Image Settings and the Sound Settings.




2.6.3-3 Schedule Task Settings

Use this to set Auto Bootup and Shutdown Time settings for up to four time periods.





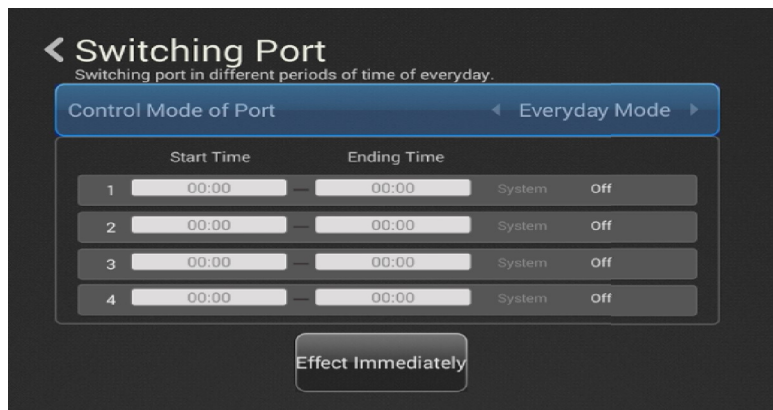

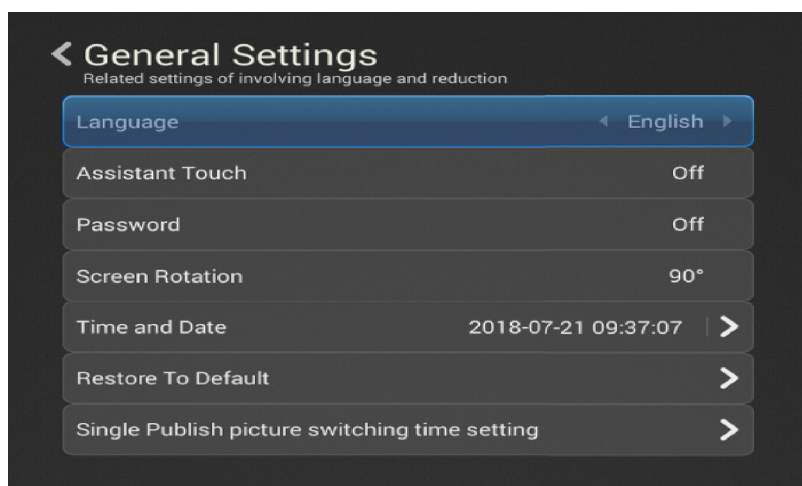
2.6.3-3-3 Switching Port

Use this to set the Switching Port for up to four time periods.



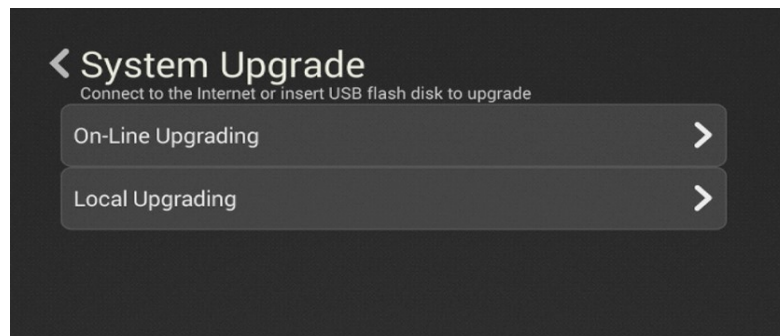
2.6.3-4 General Settings

Use this to access the different General Settings on the System.



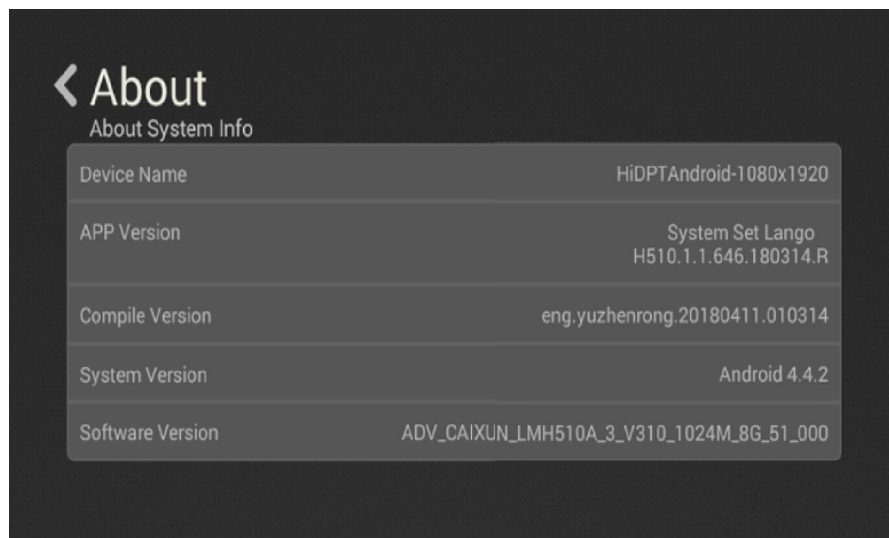
2.6.3-5 System Upgrade
