TIME TO PRUNE THOSE TREES.

The Wedderburn community is fortunate to have the knowledgeable Peter Goegan, an expert arborist from Melbourne visiting again this year to run another workshop on pruning those wild and woolly fruit trees. This workshop was well attended last year. If any of those people are as forgetful as me, there will be many repeat participants along with new gardeners.

The Pruning workshop will be the first in our annual **SPRING GARDENING PROGRAM**, to be followed in August with a workshop on building wicking garden beds, the ultimate garden bed design for these harsh dry conditions. We hope to follow in September with an organic poultry care workshop, learning about the role of poultry in permaculture and how to save ourselves a lot of money by treating poultry problems such as lice and bumble feet through natural means.

We finish the garden season with our spectacular GARDEN EXPO, where there will be numerous local gardens open to the public, Devonshire tea, Bunnings garden workshops and more. We will keep you posted.

A WORD FROM THE MAYOR.

Streetscape moves full steam ahead

Residents and visitors will start to see the transformation of the Wedderburn streetscape, with recent funding announcements meaning the project is now fully funded. The Wedderburn streetscape now has funding of \$2.3 million.

Last week Minister for Regional Development Jaala Pulford announced the state government would provide \$500,000 towards the project. Council also approved funding of \$584,400.

The first part of the project will see the removal of overhead power lines, construction of improved drainage works and a completely remodeled streetscape and landscaping works between Godfrey and Reef streets.

The revitalised main street will create a welcoming atmosphere to encourage greater visitation, provide opportunities for new businesses and promote the growth of existing businesses.

Strategy outlines emerging opportunities

Public comment is sought on Council's draft Economic Development Strategy. Spanning 2015 to 2019, the strategy will focus on supporting growth and diversification of the economy based on areas of competitive advantage.

Residents are asked to view the 22 page document and provide feedback before Council formally adopts the strategy.

This strategy provides Council with direction in economic development over the coming years and seeks to promote improved prosperity for our community.

The strategy identifies emerging opportunities for Loddon Shire including agribusiness, tourism and lifestyle.

The strategy has been developed to align with the Council Plan 2013-2017, which outlines the broader strategic direction for the Shire.

The opportunity to provide feedback closes on Friday 19 June.



Gorgeous Golden Orbs!

The Golden Orb weaver spider. Their name refers to their web, which if you look at it in the right light is a beautiful golden colour. The web is often suspended between two trees, and many of us have experienced walking straight into them. Not a pleasant experience for arachnophobes. In spite of the size of this spider it is not dangerous and they are not aggressive.

The female spider is the large impressive one, sometimes measuring up to 23mm in length. She constructs a beautiful golden silk egg sac during early winter. She will lay about 300 eggs.

The male is much smaller usually only about 6mm long. These spiders are not as common in these dry times, but when the weather is wetter the population of these spiders increases.




FAREWELL TO A UNIQUE CHARACTER.

WHAT MAKES WEDDERBURN SPECIAL?

That's the question at the heart of a new push by a group of local residents, aimed at developing a "town brand" to assist in promoting Wedderburn as an attractive place to live and to visit.

The Wedderburn Development Association is taking action on two particular objectives laid out in the town's Community Plan 2015-2025. Those are to "establish Wedderburn's uniqueness by defining and developing a brand" and to "establish eye catching town entrance signage depicting Wedderburn's unique environment".

To achieve these aims, it is now inviting residents to contribute their ideas, either in words or graphic form. Spokesman Greg Deimos said this call for submissions involved both branding and signage, as those necessarily went hand in hand.

"We're looking for something which captures the essential nature and uniqueness of the Wedderburn community," Mr Deimos said.

"We have had some ideas come up in conversations to this point, centred on gold, agriculture and the local landscape, but we really want as many people as possible to share their thoughts and contribute to this process.

"At the end of it, we'll go over all the ideas and put forward some suggestions for further public comment.

"The branding that's finally accepted will be used locally at first, but, down the track, will appear in promotional and marketing material for a wider audience.

"Our hope is to have attractive and welcoming highway signs erected at both entrances to the town which will complement the Council's Wedderburn Streetscape Plan."





At school my best friend is Anna and she makes me laugh lots when she imitates other people. Another thing that makes me laugh uncontrollably is when Mum tickles me.




