Pulteney won the toss and elected to bat in the final two-day game of the year. The first session was very even due to the good line and length targeted by our bowlers, in particular Wilson, Madigan, Haddad, Crafter and Mothersole and, after 25 overs, the game was evenly balanced at 4/80.

Pulteney's lower order batted with good discipline playing straight to our good balls, whilst putting away our bad deliveries amassing 9/185 after 49 overs. Jack Haddad in his first game this term (6 overs 2/17) and Aspen Davis (4 overs 2/16), were the main wicket takers, whilst Josh Mothersole (5 overs 0/6) and Kade Madigan (6.3 overs 1/14), were extremely economical. Henry Myall took two catches including a very good one in slip.

With captain Alex Pertl playing First XI, Josh Mothersole was elevated up the order to open with Henry Brand and both looked comfortable until Mothersole fell in the 6th over. Brand and Myall soon followed and at 3/8 after 8 overs the task of chasing Pulteney's score became very difficult. Madigan (36 runs) and Haddad (13 runs) looked to steady the ship until the loss of Haddad with the score on 36. Wickets steadily fell in the back half of the innings with the only real resistance shown by Harvey Wilson (17 of 16 balls) and Aspen Davis (6 not out). In response to the total, we were all out for 103.

Credit to Pulteney who was very disciplined in all aspects, and a well done to Madigan and Davis on their batting and bowling.

We now focus our attention on the one-day game to be played at home this Saturday against St Michael's College and will be looking for an improved effort by the lads.
