Parent – Teacher Interviews: By now in your experience of parenthood you have attended many parent teacher meetings at which your daughter's progress is the subject of discussion. Sometimes, I imagine, you and the teacher have been, "on the same page" in regard to your daughter's progress. At other times you may have different perceptions. Patient listening and honest responding is the secret to a successful interchange for both Teacher and Parent. Tonight many of you will be engaged in this sharing and I hope that it is of mutual benefit.

Term 2 began for staff on Monday 29th April, on the Feast of St. Catherine of Siena, Doctor of the Church, prolific writer and theologian and a role model for young women who want their voices heard. If I asked you, and especially Parents of our Primary school students, where would I go to see her honoured in the grounds of our campus, some of you would know. St. Catherine's Courtyard is to be found in a quiet corner of the school grounds which is shared with our junior primary children at the back of the gymnasium. Take a look. There you would read about St. Catherine, view an artist's impression of her, and be introduced to the school which sat on the site now inhabited by the junior primary. St. Catherine's School was in part intended for children whose parents could not afford St. Dominic's fees. It was merged with St. Dominic's by the 1940s as, wisely, it was not seen as a good thing to differentiate children in that way. A former pupil, and highly regarded friend to the Dominican Sisters, wrote about her time there:

I started school in 1909. We did not have a beautiful school like the children of today. We had our classes in an old house in Barnard St. but we loved it. It had fruit trees in the yard; figs, quinces and grapes. My Father was a stone mason who cut the stone for St. Dominic's Chapel. I always bragged about this to my school pals.
