- Year 10 and 11 parents/guardians will be in again on Thursday 29 August for the all-important **Subject Counselling Day**.

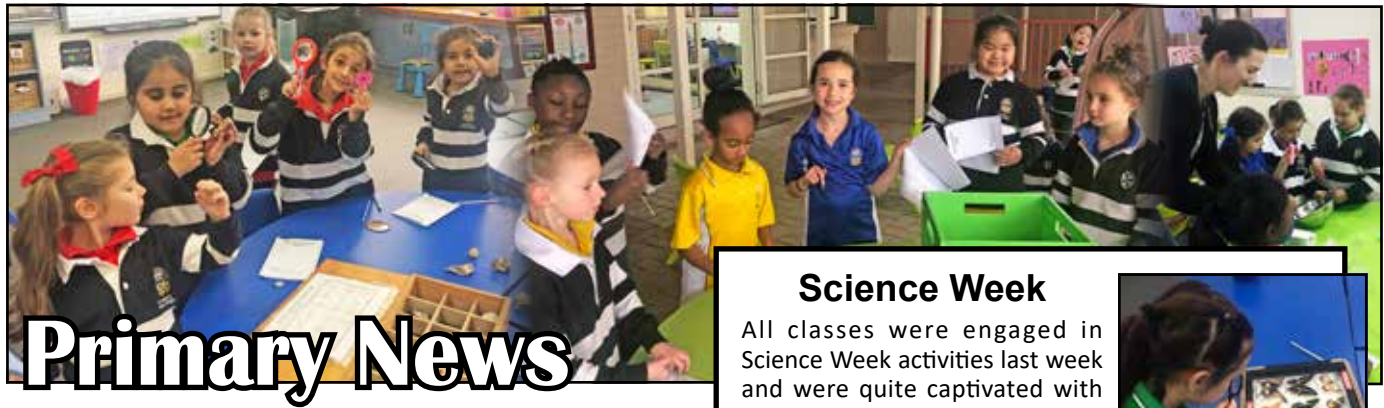
### Sr Jillian Havey sends her love

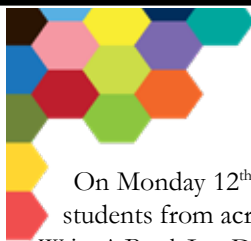
