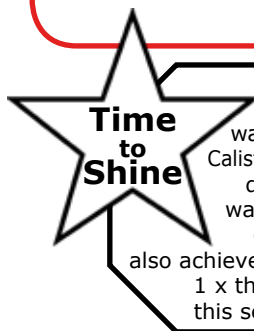

MYP Matters

Students in Years 6-10 participate in the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme [IB MYP]. With its emphasis on developing self-directed learners who have a passion for taking action, the MYP sits comfortably within our Dominican school. This term, students will be undertaking learning experiences that delve into concepts such as *Identity* in Year 6 Drama; *Communication* in Year 7 English; *Change* in Year 9 Religion and *Logic* in 10A Mathematics. All students will be involved in service learning reflections and Year 10 students will be continuing with their personal project. Take a few moments to read a little more about each of these areas below.

Service Learning

Service is both a value of the IB community and our Dominican school. Through developing a service learning culture, students can strive to be caring members of the community who demonstrate a personal commitment to service, and act to make a positive difference to the lives of others and to the environment. This term, students will have the opportunity to participate in several school-initiated service activities which either come from their curriculum or co-curricular events including Gala Day; the Musical; the Vinnies Group; Creating a Business or developing a fitness



program for a friend or relative; just to name a few. Ideally, we hope students will challenge themselves to initiate their own service actions either at school or in the wider community. Students will be writing their reflections this term, and pastoral care teachers will write a brief comment about each student's service activities in the middle years.

Personal Project

The personal project encourages Year 10 students to practise and strengthen their approaches to learning (ATL) skills, to consolidate prior and subject-specific learning, and to develop an area of personal interest. It provides an excellent opportunity for students to produce a truly personal and often creative product/outcome and to demonstrate a consolidation of their learning in the MYP. This term students will be concentrating on finalising their product/outcome and beginning to write their final report. Do keep the 11th September (Term 3) free to come along and see what the students have produced.
