

### FORMATION AND THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

### To make the school a protected environment where everyone feels safe

In every project we carry out, our priority is to promote the rights of children and to make the school a protected, safe, and welcoming environment, where children feel free to express themselves and be assured that they will be listened to. That is why we run annual training courses for educators, administrators and auxiliary staff on the rights of children and adolescents, as well as on resilience and best practices in innovative pedagogy. We also involve our students and their families, so that the educational action that takes place in our schools continues at home and in the communities where we work!







## SUSTAINABILITY AND FOOD SECURITY

### sustainable educational communities from an environmental, social and economic point of view

In line with our Lasallian tradition, our schools become centers for community development and for the promotion of green and sustainable practices. Beyond our educational facilities, our projects also improve the living conditions of the surrounding community through drinking water facilities, food programs and courses in agriculture and husbandry. Our initiatives use clean and renewable energy and foster the protection and responsible use of natural resources.



## OUR RESPONSE TO COVID-19 EMERGENCY

#LaSalleCovid19: a global campaign for the most vulnerable

In April 2020, together with the global La Salle network, we launched the "#LaSalleCovid19" initiative - an awareness-raising and fundraising campaign in 80 countries to promote solidarity and closeness and to help the most vulnerable to respond to the Covid-19 emergency.

- A hashtag to get together on social media and share messages of hope, photos and videos with colleagues and classmates from other countries.
- A hashtag to share the many initiatives carried out locally to assist their own community, such as the distribution of food and sanitary products, the fabrication of masks and provision of safe shelters for homeless people and health workers.

## THE APPEAL FOR BEIRUT AFTER THE EXPLOSION

On August 4<sup>th</sup> a massive explosion destroyed the center of Beirut, the capital city of Lebanon. As a result, hundreds of people were killed and thousands were injured. The explosion started in the port area of the city, razing buildings and also causing significant damage to three Lasallian schools.

The day after the explosion, we launched an emergency appeal under the hashtag #LaSalleForBeirut, to rebuild our schools and help families in need.

Thanks to the donations received from the Lasallian Family and from international organizations, we raised \$1.8 million USD, which enabled us to get our students back to school, by November 2020, when schools opened nationwide.



In synergy with other local organisations, we started a programme to distribute hot meals initially, and then food packages to families in need.



In the days following the explosion, a large group of volunteers, students, alumni and teachers flocked to our schools to clear away the rubble so that renovation work could begin.



In November 2020, students returned to inperson classes at school. Thereafter, national closure periods were arranged during which students continued their lessons through distance learning.



collège Notre Dame, with 960 students and 130 staff members (educational and administrative), was the educational center least damaged by the explosion and therefore the first to be completed.

ÉCOLE SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL, with 600 students and refugee children of Iraqi origin and 60 staff members, suffered serious damage including demolished doors and windows and structural damage. The school was completely renovated with the help of Misereor.





COLLÈGE SACRÉ COEUR, with 1588 students and 162 staff members, was the educational center most damaged by the explosion, due to its proximity to the port area.

The school lost doors and windows which, when they came off the frames, seriously damaged the walls, the electrical and plumbing systems, school equipment (computers, laboratories, etc.), and the administrative offices. The school was renovated thanks to donations from individuals, La Salle institutions, and support from Aid to the Church in Need, AMPELOS, CEI/Caritas Italiana and Missio Munich. Due to the confinement for Covid-19, some of the renovation work at the Sacré-Cœur School will be delayed, but by the time classes resume in the academic year 2020-2021, it will be ready to welcome its students.



# STORIES FROM OUR PROJECTS

## A SCHOOL FOR EVERYONE IN VIETNAM

In Vietnam, La Salle serves more than 2,000 children and young people daily, thanks to the presence of *three schools, vocational centers and residences for students.* 

La Salle is a school for everybody. That is why we set up educational centers in villages where there are no other nearby schools. We help families with scholarships, promote the inclusion of marginalized ethnic minorities, and welcome those who otherwise are excluded from education.

My name is Kim; I attend fifth grade at La San Tan Hung Charity School a Ho Chi Min City. I have three siblings. My parents work as bricklayers but are sometimes unemployed. I like to go to school to learn, get to know and become a good person to help society in the future. I would like to thank the Brothers, teachers and generous donors for helping me to have many happy days at school.

#### A HIGH SCHOOL IN DAK MIL

This secondary school opened in August 2018 and already has 500 students, 57 of whom are from minority groups. With a new high school, we will be able to help our students continue their studies and access tertiary education.



#### A HIGH SCHOOL IN PLEIKU

This primary and secondary school has 688 students (90 of whom are from minority groups), half of whom live on campus. We want to build a secondary school to accompany our students throughout their education.





With a vocational center, we want to help young people in Kinshasa enter the world of catering and hotel management.

In 2020, we completed the construction of *Atelier Ho.Re.Ca.* (Hotellerie, Restaurant & Catering), inside the Lasallian school "*College Saint Georges*" in Kinshasa.

We constructed this new building with the best equipment to start professional training courses in catering and hotel management.

In a country where **7 million children between the ages of 5 and 17 do not go to school** [UNICEF], we are committed to providing new educational opportunities for the most disadvantaged young people, enabling them to enter the world of work and train for their future.

# PROMOTING GIRLS' ACCES TO EDUCATION IN PAKISTAN

Pakistan has the second-highest level of early school drop-out in the world, with 44% of children between the ages of 5 and 16 not attending school [UNICEF]. Gender inequality still remains a decisive factor in access to education, and many girls, especially in the most isolated areas, do not continue their studies. That is why in 2020 we committed to providing access to quality education for the 565 female students of "La Salle Girl-Highschool" in Faisalabad, Pakistan.

Through our project to rehabilitate the school facilities and the promotion of a scholarship program, we are ensuring the inclusion of girls and accompanying them on their educational pathway.

Unfortunately, many girls are unable to continue their studies in Pakistan. When I think of my school, I feel totally safe and there is no discrimination among students.

## A SCHOOL TO BE PROTECTED IN SOUTH SUDAN

La Salle School-Rumbek, South Sudan, is a Lasallian secondary school, opened in February 2018 in the rural area of Rumbek, with the purpose of *restoring the educational opportunity that the civil war had taken away*.

Today, this campus *is home to 153 students, who attend the first three classes of high school*. The facility includes staff quarter housing for 14 teachers. The dormitories allow the students to live on campus, boost their academic performance, and protect them from both external conflicts and the spread of the Covid-19 virus. The school is powered by clean, renewable energy from solar panels, and is surrounded by farmland, which produce supplies the school canteen.




La Salle School-Rumbek opened in February 2018 with a first class of 28 students, housed in the Sisters of Loreto school. Meanwhile, work has begun to build the new campus on land donated by local leaders.



In March 2019 (the start of the South Sudanese school year), the number of students rose to 73 and in June of the same year, our students were able to attend classes in their still unfinished school.



In March 2020, the campus was finished. For the start of the school's third year, 401 young people from the area took the admission tests, out of 80 available places. The number of students rose to 153.



# TUTOR OF RESILIENCE IN MOZAMBIQUE



We train our teachers so that they acquire the necessary tools to help children and young people overcome traumatic experiences.

Thanks to the collaboration with *BICE* (*Bureau International Catholique de l'Enfance*) and with *Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore* (*Milan*), we organised a *training course for tutor of resilience*, targeting 32 people including educators, teachers, volunteers and social workers, from Lasallian schools in Beira, and the diocese of Pemba, Mozambique.

In Psychology, resilience is a concept that indicates our ability to cope with and overcome a traumatic experience, such as war, migration or, in the case of Beira, the violence of environmental disasters: This programming is especially relevant in Mozambique where many families lost all of their possessions due to Cyclone Idai in 2019.

Through these courses, we train our educators so that they can increase the resilience levels of the youngest children and give them the sociopsychological support they need to grow.



## San Isidro Labrador school in Pozo Colorado serves more than 300 boys and girls in Paraguay's expansive and undeveloped El Chaco area.

Most of the families - many of indigenous origin - struggle financially with subsistence-level incomes from tending large agricultural 'haciendas. Without San Isidro Labrador, many children would be pushed from education into child labor. To provide these students with a quality Lasallian education, their teachers and staff must be trained in innovative pedagogies, enhanced school administration, and techniques to safeguard children's rights, Programs on these topics are organized jointly between us and Fundación La Salle Paraguay. Because of its remote location, the school has difficulty attracting good teachers. Through major improvements of staff quarters provided by DLSSI-ONLUS, enhanced facilities are now attracting teachers and their families. During 2020, for example, repairs were made to
