PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Given this is my first report as President of the South Adelaide Football Club I want to sincerely thank our members, sponsors, volunteers and staff for their commitment and efforts throughout the 2024 season. It is often said, but that doesn't make it any less true, that without your support the Club would not be able to function, and I can assure you that this fact is foremost on the mind of your Board.

We have a new Board which was only elected at the end of February 2024 so only in place for a little over nine months as this report is being written. I want to assure our members that you have a very committed Board and one that I believe possesses the skills to take the Club to a much more successful and sustainable position than when we were elected at the start of the year.

That is not to say that the Club was not functioning as a valued member of the SANFL, but as a Board, we don't want to just meet the daily challenges of being one of the SANFL Clubs, we want to be the "Premier sporting Club in the South and aspire to win Premierships in every grade every year". That pronouncement is contained in our draft Strategic Plan which I hope will be posted on our Club's website early in the new year.

Our Strategic Plan will guide our actions and aspirations over the next three years, and I hope all our members will take the time to thoroughly read the document when it has been adopted by the Board and communicated widely to all our stakeholders.

Although it is sometimes hard for our members to see the work done by the Board month by month, I can again assure you that the Board has been busy setting the foundations for that aspiration of sustained success.

We have established portfolios for all Board members and each member chairs or has responsibility for at least one committee, ranging from our Hospitality Committee to our Women's Football Committee. As part of our approach in the new year we will be communicating far more often and in a more detailed way so members will be able to follow the work of these committees and the Board more comprehensively.

We have progressed the building of our first SANFLW standard women's changeroom which members will see being constructed when we come back next season.

This facility has been needed for a long time and I am so pleased to be able to say our all-conquering Senior Women's team will have a state-of-the-art facility in the near future. What a great effort by our Women's Coaches, the whole playing squad and our Women's Football Manager, Jonathon Parker, to erase the disappointment

of last year's Grand Final and achieve the ultimate success in 2024.

We have also been able to have our ageing oval irrigation system replaced with a system that will provide the best watering system in the South and serve us well for the next couple of decades, ensuring the oval is of the highest standard but also providing a considerable savings on our water bill.

On top of this we have moved our maintenance program up a notch and made progress on the problems we have had with our roof above the gaming room, the decking outside the bistro, the air conditioning in our function room and some work on the football facilities.

The Club has also been able to establish a master plan for the whole site and we are working very hard to establish a process to finance the plan and replace our aging facilities and amenities at Noarlunga.

As all members would be aware last season was a change in direction for our Senior Men's team with the retirement of a significant number of our older long serving players. We took the opportunity to rebuild with youth and with the aspiration of having a significant number of our senior players coming from our local zones.

This approach requires patience, but I was pleased with our approach, and we are looking to build on this approach again next season with the aim to become increasingly competitive through the next two seasons.

The talent in our zones has again been to the fore, with our Women's teams dominating the competition and our under sixteen men's team playing off in the Grand Final. This is after our under eighteen men's team won the Premiership last season, all of which demonstrates that the South can produce very talented players and that the SAFC has excellent development programmes. Our aim of course is to translate this into Premierships at every level.

I want to congratulate all the winners of our Club awards presented at the Knuckey Cup/Margaret Nyland Medal presentations in early October.

It was a dazzling night and extremely well organized by our Marketing Manager Rachel Kimber and professionally MC'ed by our reserves coach Alex Pigou.

I also want to thank all our Staff led by our CEO Neill Sharpe, for their tireless work in managing all the business at the Club from our Football Department through to our Hospitality business. I also want to thank our Senior Coach, Jarred Wright and our General Manager of Football, Brent Reilly, for their hard work and leadership of the Football Department throughout the season. They both have huge challenges in the upcoming seasons to achieve the success we crave.

Our volunteers are the best in the League, and I want to thank them for their tireless efforts that sustain the work of the Club.

In particular I want to thank Maxine McPherson and Cassy Naley and their incredible band of workers at the Panther Club canteen and Bob Swanson and his Past Players and Officials Committee for their work and comradery at the Past Players bar each and every home game.

Our sponsors have been wonderful again this season and their support through thick and thin is absolutely appreciated by the Board and Administration at the SAFC.

Finally, I want to thank my fellow Board members for their commitment to the Club. Paul Kristoris, our Vice President and Chair of the Kingstonians, is a great supporter and worker for the Club as are the rest of our Board, Sean Augustin, Ian Cox, Lee Duffield, Andrew English, Grant Miles and Bianca Nash-Smith.

Finally, I would like to convey my best wishes for the Festive Season and the New Year to all members of the Panthers Community and hope that you are looking forward to the next few seasons with as much anticipation and excitement as I am.

CEO'S REPORT

As we reflect on the year that was, it's clear that 2024 brought its share of challenges and triumphs. In the words of a famous phrase, "life is like a box of chocolates" and this sentiment aptly describes our journey this year.

Our women's football program continues to shine as a pillar of success. The senior women's team secured their third premiership in a nail-biting Grand Final, while the Development League team achieved back-to-back championships in dominant fashion. Individual accolades included Nikki Nield's remarkable win as the League Best & Fairest and the inaugural Margaret Nyland Medal for South Adelaide's Women's Best & Fairest.

Coach Rick Watts' leadership has been instrumental in sustaining this excellence, and Development League Coach Ryan Skouborg's commitment was rewarded with a second premiership. These achievements highlight the depth and talent of our women's program.

Adding to this momentum, we are thrilled to commence construction on new female changerooms, a long-awaited development supported by \$2 million in State Government funding. Situated beneath the grandstand, these facilities will provide dedicated spaces for our female players. Final tenders are expected before Christmas, with construction set to begin in February and completion anticipated early in the season.

The funding also enabled the creation of a precinct masterplan, an ambitious vision for the Noarlunga site. This plan seeks to unlock commercial opportunities while enhancing our facilities. Discussions with the State Government remain ongoing, and we are optimistic about the long-term prospects.

In 2024, we undertook significant upgrades to our facilities. A new irrigation system replaced the outdated 30-year-old infrastructure, delivering greater efficiency in water usage and improving the playing surface. Our thanks go to Club partner BTM for their outstanding work.

Game days were elevated with the installation of a new Sportal digital scoreboard, courtesy of Redarc, and an upgraded audio system from AJS Sound. These enhancements have greatly enriched the spectator experience and provided valuable promotional opportunities for our partners. We deeply appreciate Anthony Kittel and the team at Redarc for their continued support.

Our senior men's football team embraced a year of growth. While competitive for much of the season, a challenging conclusion underscored areas for improvement. Senior Coach Jarrad Wright's contract extension reflects confidence in his leadership and the groundwork laid for future success.

The resilience of our reserves team, which reached the finals again, and the promising transition of U18 players to senior football are encouraging signs for the Club's future. Meanwhile, the U16s reached the Grand Final, a testament to the strength of our junior programs. We extend our gratitude to Brett Hudson, who steps down as U16 coach after years of dedicated service.

Player development remains a hallmark of our Club, with 15 players progressing to the AFL level in the past five years. This year, we celebrated Sid Draper being the first South Australian selected in the AFL Draft, fulfilling his dream of joining the Club he grew up supporting. Additionally, San Remo Scholarship recipient Benny Barrett's selection by Port Adelaide as a rookie is a testament to our development programs.

Jimmy Deane's continues to provide a strong financial foundation for the Club, with the bistro and gaming operations performing well. Recent upgrades, including new air conditioning and ongoing investments in the gaming room, have enhanced the venue. We are grateful for the efforts of our Venue Manager Rahmat Salah, Assistant Manager Crystal Cameron, Head Chef Danni Smith, and Gaming Manager Kellie Paisley, whose dedication underpins this success.

Our partnerships remain vital to our progress. Flinders University's unwavering support as our naming rights partner and Leader Computers' contributions are deeply appreciated. The partnership with Magain Real Estate, as the new naming rights sponsor for Magain Stadium, reflects strong South connections, and we look forward to the opportunities this partnership will bring.

It was a fantastic reward for our Female Football Premier Partners, Loftus and Redarc, to be part of a premiership-winning year. Their support has been instrumental to the continued growth and success of women's football at the Club, and we are deeply grateful for their contributions.

Reversing last year's trends, game-day attendance increased by 15%, although membership saw a slight decline. Unfortunately, the scheduling of our marquee Good Friday match as an away game was a disappointment, but we remain committed to delivering outstanding experiences for our fans.

Our community spirit was celebrated with the successful return of the Christmas Carols, thanks to the tireless efforts of Maxine McPherson and the Carols Committee. We also acknowledge the invaluable support of Cassie Naley and Maxine of the Panther Club, who are such an important part of our game days. Past Players and Officials, President and Life Member Bob Swanson steps down as President after years of dedicated service. Thank you, Bob.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to our Football Club staff for their unwavering commitment and efforts over the past 12 months. Special thanks to Brent Reilly, Jarrad Wright, Alex Pigou, Jono Parker, Mark Clayton, Bryce Gibbs, Rachel Kimber, and Maggie McKay, who joined us early in the season. Rachel Kimber's exceptional work across marketing, partnerships, events, memberships, and game days has been a cornerstone of our operations, and we are incredibly grateful for her dedication.

Thank you to a newish Board for the past 12 months. New President Geoff Baynes hit the ground running and his contacts within Government and the community will be important moving forward.

The passing of SANFL Finance Consultant Sean Nicholas was a deeply saddening moment this year, and our thoughts remain with his family and friends.

As the 2025 season approaches, we look forward to building on the successes of 2024 and addressing the challenges ahead. Thank you to everyone who contributes to making South Adelaide Football Club the strong and united community it is.

HOSPITALITY REPORT

As we close the chapter on 2024, it's a great opportunity to reflect on the success, challenges and lessons that defined our journey. Overall, this year has been a strong period of growth, accompanied by valuable insights that will shape our strategy moving forward.

We are proud to report that Jimmy Deane's achieved revenue growth this year, exceeding its budget by nearly 10% which is an additional 10% increase from last year's revenue. This success reflects the trust and loyalty of our customers, as well as the hard work of our team in delivering quality products and service.

While the revenue was strong, we also faced higher than anticipated expenses, which impacted our budget for expenses. Supply chain disruption led to higher procurement costs, on-boarding of additional team members to support our growth and additional contributions towards the football club.

Despite higher expenses, we celebrated several milestones, including functions smashing its beverage budget by 17% and its food budget by 88%. Crystal has been dedicated towards functions this past year to grow profit margins and to promote the spaces here at Jimmy Deane's and delivering exceptional service to our event customers. Gaming was up 11% on budget with thanks to Kellie for her ongoing dedication to the room and in her organisational of promotions to encourage customer engagement and return. Our food revenue stayed strong with an additionally 5% growth in the bistro, with thanks to Dani and her team for delivering quality food even through the struggles they face within an outdated kitchen.

As we move into 2025, our focus will be on building this year's momentum while addressing cost management. Our main goals will be to streamline operations by exploring cost-saving measures and operational efficiencies to reduce overheads without compromising quality and our brand. Investing in additional revenue streams and to capitalizes on marketing opportunities with existing and new customers to ensure additional growth to the business. Continuing our customer engagement through personalized experiences and improved service.

None of this would be possible without the unwavering support of our team, volunteers, customers and partners. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to everyone who contributed to our success this year. Cheers to an even more prosperous 2025.

SENIOR FOOTBALL REPORT

Senior Men's

Heading into our first year of our three-year plan, we were optimistic in how this young group would compete to win games of football. We played 42 players at League level, 16 debutants and with an encouraging 10 of the 16 being harvested from our local zone. This was a deliberate strategy to fast track our young local talent into playing football at SANFL League level. This saw some great results and competitiveness; however, it did show there is some work to do in helping this talent play consistent winning League football.

A disappointing 4-14 win-loss ratio for the season and with a handful of games we could have seen in the win column, however, we have been able to see an increase in our young group's performance. This will hold us in good stead for the coming years. Our Reserves were able to put together another consistent year, with an 9-8 win-loss ratio finishing 4th, and we saw this young group play another finals game. Although we didn't get the result we were after, for this group to get another taste of finals football is another step in the right direction for the football club.

We unfortunately saw too many injuries again to our squad with 11 players being ruled out for the season from Round 13. With all bar 1 being impact injuries that we do not have much control over. We have made some significant changes to our program for 2025 and hopefully we get some luck on the injury front for next season.

I would like to thank our coaches for this season in Jarrad Wright at League level and Alex Pigou at Reserves level. We had great support for the development of our young playing group and you both led from the front in a developing year. We saw huge growth in our group and all of our coaches put in a mountain of work to help this group be the best they can be.

Tony Kernahan came on board to help the League side in being the Team Manager and we thank you for the commitment you showed throughout the year. Tony Barbaro our long serving Reserves Team manager is ever reliable and we thank you also for the time you put into our young reserves side.

A very special thank you the three amigos who I believe keep the football afloat. Julie Harrington our Head Trainer leads the way with our strapping and game day care for our players. John Vanderham our newly appointed Property Steward has done an amazing job in making the Property Room a well-functioning machine. Lachlan Wilson who commits an enormous amount of time during the week in assisting John in the property room and his

timekeeping duties on a game day. We can't thank you 3 enough for the time and effort you put into this group.

We would also like to thank Dr. Michael Thurling for his commitment to the Senior Men's program. We wish him well in his next role as the Head Doctor of the Port Adelaide Women's team.

This was a year full of information and the growth that we got from this group has provided us with excitement for the future. We look forward to next season and we can't wait to see you all out there to support our Senior Men's squad in 2025.

Juniors

Our Junior squads were introduced with a 7 game U14 season along with the full seasons for U16 and U18's. Therefore, our Junior coaches and staff were put to work early on in the season. It is great for our U14 squad to play against other SANFL clubs' best talent and they really enjoyed the challenge. Bryce Gibbs did a great job in organising and managing this new program.

The U16 squad had some of the best talent we have seen for some time. With 6 in the SANFL State Squad, 2 All-Australians and the U16 SANFL MVP, we were able to see some of the future talent on display to play for the Panthers. Unfortunately, the young men couldn't get the result we were after in the Grand Final in a loss to Sturt. Well done to Brett Hudson and his team in being able to make the Grand Final and I'm sure the squad will be around the finals again in 2025.

The U18 squad had a tough year with the majority of their top end talent either playing State Football and or playing Senior football. We had 3 U18's come up to play League football and another 6 have an opportunity to play Reserves football. Although this number is too high to have our U18's playing Senior football, they have the talent and attitude to hold up to play good Senior football. Thanks to Mark Clayton, coaches and staff for the commitment to helping our Junior players have the exposure to an elite program.

Senior Women's

Another year and another Grand Final. After the disappointment in 2023, our women had the word 'redemption' plastered throughout the facility and they were able to live up to it. Following their most consistent

SENIOR MEN'S COACH REPORT

The 2024 season marked the beginning of a 3- to 4-year journey focused on building a list that would provide our youth with early opportunities at the league level, setting the foundation for sustained growth and future success. At the conclusion of the 2023 season, we bade farewell to some of our senior players—Keegan Brooksby, Joseph Haines, Matt Rose, Matt Broadbent, and Bryce Gibbs—who collectively represented over 1000 games of SANFL/AFL experience. Their departures also meant the loss of 4 Knuckey Cup Winners, 1 Magarey Medallist, and 1 Fos Williams Medallist, which was a significant void in both quality and experience.

In Year 1, the objective was to limit recruiting while providing our younger players with the chance to step up and experience senior football early in their careers. This strategy was not only aimed at gauging their ability to compete at this level but also to help them understand the high demands of the competition. The hope was that by the end of the season, these young players would not only be able to compete with more mature teams but also begin to push past them, aiming to return to finals football in the years ahead.

Looking ahead to 2024, our forecast was to be competitive while acknowledging that we would likely be punching above our weight. We expected fluctuations in performance and fatigue but understood that these would provide valuable insights into the list build and help the football department make informed decisions about which players could contribute to pushing the club back into deep finals contention. This would also reveal who was truly committed to the long-term vision of the club.

During the preseason, we made a conscious decision to bring in a limited number of recruits, starting with former Junior player Arlo Draper, who returned after being drafted to Collingwood. We also welcomed Essendon VFL's Callum McCarty, Finn Emille-Brennan from Casey VFL, Jake Arundell from Box Hill VFL, and Tom Beaumont from the Tasmania Devils/Allies U18s. Alongside these external recruits, we were thrilled to have several of our U18 Junior players join the Senior ranks: Nicholas Schroder, Tom Wheaton, Noah Howes, Blake Rodrigues, and Zak Kier, all of whom played pivotal roles in securing the 2023 U18 premiership.

Unfortunately, the season was marred by injuries to several key players. Ben Shillabeer dislocated his mid-foot in February, while Tom Beaumont suffered a ruptured ACL during the first trial match, with both requiring reconstructive surgery that sidelined them for the entire season. Jake Arundell broke his arm in Round 5 and returned home for the remainder of the year. Cal McCarty only managed 6 games due to injury and stress fractures

ended his season early. Sid Draper, returning from the State Hub preseason, suffered a shin stress fracture that kept him out until the final six games of the season. U18 prospect Noah Howes had an impressive start to the year as a key forward before dislocating his shoulder in Round 10, requiring surgery and ruling him out for the rest of the season. Additionally, Oscar Clavarino re-dislocated his shoulder, missing a significant portion of the season with further surgery, playing only 11 of the 18 games.

Despite the challenges posed by these injuries, the silver lining was that it created more opportunities for our young and inexperienced list. In Year 1 of our rebuild, while we faced tougher challenges and our list depth was tested, we were able to see 42 players take the field in league football, a valuable experience that will pay off in the coming years. Below is a snapshot of our list demographic, with comparisons to the top 3 SANFL teams:

- 42 players played league football (Top 3 average 35 players)
- 26 of the 42 were local zoned players (62%)
- 17 debutants, 11 of whom were from our local zone
- 18 of the 42 players were aged 20 or younger (Top 3 averaged only 5 players under 20)
- 780 SANFL games experience per game on the field, ranging from 540 to 880, compared to an average of 1500+ for Glenelg, Sturt, North, and Eagles.

Despite the challenges, we began the season positively. In Round 1 against the Crows, we led for most of the game but were outworked in the final minutes, losing by just 5 points after a set shot in the dying seconds missed. Rounds 2 and 3 saw us face eventual finalists in Sturt and Centrals. While we showcased some strong football at times, lapses in concentration, particularly in the early and late stages of the game, were costly. This trend—where we remained competitive but faded late due to strength and experience deficits—shaped much of our win-loss record.

Despite these setbacks, it was clear that our best football was highly competitive against top 5 sides. We were in winning positions during the third quarter in 12 of our 18 games, including a nail-biting 5-point loss to the Eagles away in Round 6 and an 8-point deficit against Glenelg at three-quarter time in Round 5. We secured our first win of the year in Round 7 with a 73-point victory over Port

Adelaide, followed by our second win in Round 9 against the Crows.

Our most consistent patch of the season came between Rounds 13-16. During this stretch, we won 2 games and lost 2 close contests. One of our best performances came in Round 13 against Sturt, where we controlled the game but missed crucial opportunities in front of goal, allowing Sturt to clinch a 21-point victory in the final quarter. Round 14 saw us fail to capitalise on wind advantage in the first half, losing narrowly to North Adelaide by 8 points. In Rounds 15 and 16, we secured victories over Port (by 15 points) and West (by 21 points). Key to our improved performances during this period was the introduction of ruckman Olivier Northam, who joined us for four games, as well as the return of Sid Draper after his injury and national carnival commitments.

While the final few games of the season were disappointing, they provided invaluable learning experiences, particularly in matches against the eventual Grand Finalists, Norwood and Glenelg. These games helped our young players understand the competition's demands at the highest level.

When we break the season into two phases—the first 15 games and the last 3—the initial expectations were met. While our win-loss record may appear unflattering from the outside, internally we saw significant growth, with exciting talent emerging for the future. This was evident as four players—Charlie Duncan, Noah Howes, Tom Wheaton, and Corey Grocock—won Powerade Breakthrough Player of the Week awards.

Getting games into our young talent was a priority, as it allowed them to experience the competition's expectations first-hand. Looking ahead to 2025, we have a clear plan for improvement, having already welcomed Olivier Northam (ruckman) full-time for next season, alongside midfielders Luke Bogle, Brad Jefferies, and returning AFL-listed player Jaiden Magor. We have also focused on restructuring our high-performance team to ensure that our young players develop a solid foundation in strength and conditioning, preparing them—and the club—for a rise up the ladder as we enter Year 2 of our journey.

Congratulations to all players who made their league debut this season, and a special mention to Knuckey Cup winner Elliot Dunkin, who was outstanding in his consistency and performance in the backline. Finally, I want to express our deepest gratitude to the coaches, support staff, and volunteers who dedicate so much of their time and energy to supporting our players. Your unwavering commitment to making our club a welcoming and professional environment is truly appreciated.

SENIOR WOMEN'S REPORT

The 2024 season was a year of redemption, growth, and remarkable achievement for South Adelaide's Female Football Program. Following the heartbreak of the 2023 SANFLW Grand Final, we embarked on the 2024 journey with determination and resilience, culminating in our third SANFLW Premiership and back-to-back Development League Premierships. These successes are a true testament to our program's enduring commitment to excellence.

This year, we showcased exceptional grit and skill, finishing the home-and-away season strongly to secure our place in a seventh consecutive finals series. The pinnacle of our season was a hard-fought Grand Final victory against Norwood, bringing the Premiership cup back to Noarlunga for the third time in seven seasons.

Throughout the season, we demonstrated resilience and adaptability. Early challenges, including back-to-back losses to start the season, were met with determination. We delivered dominant performances, including a statement win over Glenelg on Good Friday, where we held the Tigers goalless. Crucial victories against Glenelg and Central District in the minor rounds highlighted our relentless drive, helping us secure our third minor Premiership.

Our program celebrated several outstanding individual accomplishments. Nikki Nield became South Adelaide's first SANFLW Best and Fairest Medalist, a landmark moment for the club. Emily Brockhurst's return to SANFLW saw her claim the SANFL Leading Goalkicker title with 25 goals. Additionally, six players—Brockhurst, Esther Schirmer, Nikki Nield, Soriah Moon, Jordann Hickey, and Tiffany King—were named in *The Advertiser* SANFLW Team of the Year. Jordann Hickey capped her exceptional season with a Best on Ground performance in the Grand Final.

This year also marked a proud moment for our program with the introduction of the Margaret Nyland Medal, named after The Hon. Margaret Nyland AM, in recognition of her significant support of our program. It was fitting that Nikki Nield, our first-ever Best and Fairest Medal winner, also claimed the inaugural Margaret Nyland Medal, capping off her outstanding year. Margaret's ongoing support has been instrumental in building one of the nation's best Female Football Programs.

Our younger players also excelled, with Emma Charlton, Taya Maxwell, and Layla Vizgaudis representing the Under-16 State Team and Lily Baxter, Shae Archbold, and Esther Schirmer selected for the Under-18 squads. Developing local talent remains a cornerstone of our

success, with 58% of our 2024 list sourced from GSFL and SFL clubs.

The success of our 2024 program was made possible by the tireless efforts of our coaches, support staff, and volunteers. Under the exceptional leadership of Rick Watts—who this year became the longest-serving SANFLW coach—we maintained our competitive edge and team unity.

Our coaching team played a vital role in driving our success. I extend my gratitude to Assistant Coaches Taylah Eastwood, Jamie Woodward, Michael Hegarty, Wayne Williams, Micka James, and High-Performance Coach Trent Larwood, whose dedication to player development has been invaluable. I would also like to thank Development League Premiership Head Coach Ryan Skouborg for his loyalty and passion, which has been instrumental in developing the depth of our playing list and preparing players for League football.

Special thanks go to Maddie Green, Madhav Parab, Deb Huddleston, and Sher Read for their exceptional support in keeping our players fit and ready to compete. I also want to acknowledge the contributions of our broader support team—Meg Sherry, Brad and Josh Read, Malcolm Freak, Lachlan Wilson, and Belinda Uppill—whose work behind the scenes, from timekeeping to wellness support, helped our program thrive.

The Pinktails Cup, played during First Nations Round, highlighted the strong connection between South Adelaide and the Redtails/Pinktails Right Tracks Program—an initiative we are incredibly proud to support. Special thanks go to Rob

Clarke for his unwavering dedication to the Pinktails program and his invaluable support of our Football Club.

The club bids farewell to several key players, including 2022 Best and Fairest winner Gypsy Schirmer, Ex Evans, and Jess Kirk, whose contributions have been invaluable. We also acknowledge the departure of

Assistant Coach Ben Yeomans and Jamie Woodward and thank them for their service to our program.

Looking ahead to 2025, we are excited to welcome new faces and familiar names to our coaching staff. Sheldon Currie joins as Senior Assistant Coach, bringing a wealth of SANFLW experience from North Adelaide and a strong focus on player development that aligns with our core values. We also welcome back Andrew Brockhurst as Opposition and Player Development Coach, Stacey Murray (née Huddleston) as Development League Backline Coach, and Helen Maidment as Development League Midfield Coach. Michael Hegarty transitions to the League team as Backline Coach after gaining valuable experience with the Development League side over the past two seasons.

As we prepare for 2025, we remain committed to fostering growth and achieving success both on and off the field. Building on this year's accomplishments, the future is bright for South Adelaide's Female Football Program. Together, we move forward, united by the values that make us #SouthProud.

UNDER-18 REPORT

The South Adelaide U18s preseason for 2024 kicked in Mid November, with the boys hitting the track twice a week through to Mid December. We utilised both Flinders University Stadium and Cardijn College to implement the training program. Our strength and conditioning team was lead by Christiaan Meyer and Dan Greenslade both were Flinders University placement students in previous years. After a solid three week block of skills and conditioning led by our coaching staff, Boyd Austin (backs), Sam Elliott (forwards), Bryce Gibbs (midfield), Matthew Sims (manager), Marty Clifton (bench coach) and Brett Hudson (Under 16 Coach) the squad headed for the Christmas break and prepared to return to the track in January.

In February, we held our annual U18s preseason camp at the club. It is a mainstay of our preseason structure, the camp focuses on developing a strong team bond within the squad and further developing the South Adelaide Football Club's values and culture in the junior ranks. Once again a huge success, the playing squad were challenged with a variety of physical and mental tasks as well as some gameplan revision and holding our leadership vote. Jacob Sheean was elected Captain with Oliver Goss and Blake Florance chosen as Vice Captains, Benny Barrett and Jack Cohen Shortridge rounding out the leadership group. Our entire group handled themselves admirably throughout the year and were a credit to themselves, their families and their community clubs.

Season 2024 didn't go the way we would have liked for the Under 18s group, We didn't get the results from a win loss perspective that we like or expect, after winning the premiership last year that is our new expectation. We expect to win, we expect to get good results and we shouldn't shy away from that because that is the expectation from good football clubs. We were able to play more players than previous years give young players exposure to SANFL football. We did provide 37 games of senior football for the club from junior players this year up from 8 games last year. This experience could prove to be invaluable as these players transition into senior players.

Our 2024 squad consisted of playing 55 players, up from 42 of which played last year. We had 27 representatives from the Southern Football League, 16 from the Greater Southern Football League, 4 from Kangaroo Island Football League, 4 from the SANFL Juniors League and 4 from NT. Three players played every game for the U18s. Our age profile continued to show the strength of our youth programs, 33 U18s, 21 U17s and 1 U16s taking the field for the U18s team this year. We had 9 players

represent the senior teams during the year, with Jacob Sheean Benny Barrett, Ryan Borlace, Cohen Shortridge Brayden Nicholls and Jake Agnew playing reserves football, while Sid Draper and Phoenix Hargrave and Dakota Sterzl playing league football. We had Seven representatives in the State U18s Program (Sid Draper C and Phoenix Hargrave DVC Also Benny Barrett, Ryan Borlace Jacob Sheean, Dakota Sterzl and Noah Howes)

Phoenix Hargrave was the equal winner with three other players of the 2024 McCallum Tomkins Medal as the fairest and most brilliant performers in the SANFL U18 competition. We were all very excited over the draft period with Sid Draper get picked up in the first round of the national draft, Pick 4 to Adelaide. Then the next day having Benny Barrett has joined Port Adelaide as a category B rookie. Congratulations to those two boys and their families for all the hard work they have put in to get these opportunities and will look forward to watching them on the big stage soon.

Congratulations to our award winners this year. Our Best and Fairest winner of the Mark Naley Medal was Cohen Shortridge, with Jay Chapman coming runner up and Brayden Nicholls finishing third. Elliott Duffield took home the Best Team Man award, and Phoenix Hargrave won the Fred & Mavis Whitwell Trophy for the U18s Rising Star. Benny Barrett also won the Most Improved Award, and Jesse Nye won the Colin & Peter Haines Trophy for Best Junior Clubman. Oliver Goss won the teams Trademark player while Cohen Shortridge added his Best and Fairest with Leading Goalkicker Award, The Shortridge family taking home both the 16s and under 18 Leading Goal kicking trophies.

Grand Final

We faced a strong Sturt side for the second time in the finals series, aiming to secure another victory over them. The prestigious Adelaide Oval set the stage for an intense contest, and the Panthers were ready to leave everything on the field.

In the first quarter, we started with energy, dominating the midfield battle and capitalizing on opportunities. Zemes Pilot opened the scoring with a set shot, while Kody Shortridge showcased his finishing ability in front of goal. Sturt struggled with accuracy, allowing us to hold a narrow lead at quarter-time.

The momentum shifted in the second quarter as Sturt increased their pressure and found their rhythm. EXPLANATORY NOTES

Coaches were not a feature of football until the early years of last century – up until that time, the captain and senior players generally took younger players under their wing and spent time with them – there are, for example, accounts of Reedman doing this with the young players in the 1890's, but no formal appointment of a coach until 1908.

Best Player – Although there is a press record of F. Mehrtens receiving an award for best player in 1886, again it was not a feature that best players were selected on a yearly basis. It was the belief that the team performance was more important. In 1923 the Knuckey Cup was instituted, and perhaps this could be taken as the starting point for Best & Fairest (although even in the year this award began the committee decided it should be for the “most useful” player, reflecting the ideal performance over individual ability).

Top Goalkickers – In the first 10-15 years of the last century, there is sometimes a discrepancy between Annual Reports and weekly press reports about goalkickers. Annual Reports are often unreliable in this regard, and the figures here reflect weekly match results published in the newspaper of the day. For the years 1876 – 1902, press reports are the only records available, and some of the earlier ones are sometimes dubious.

ITEM 7 – PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Vice President Russell Westmoreland read extracts from President Margaret Nyland's report.

Russell opened the report by discussing the Men's and Women's Football Results.

Russell addressed that it was a disappointing result for the league team as there was great expectations coming into the 2023 season to win the flag, as there was hope with some of the younger players maturing and the recruitment of some highly regarded players.

Russell addressed that towards the end of the season the board appointed ISC consulting, led by former South Player and AFL Premiership Captain Mark Bickley, to undertake a review of the football program. The recommendations of that review have almost entirely been accepted, with the acceptance of 33 recommendations and 1 not accepted. These are now in various stages of implementation, under the oversight of the newly created Football executive committee. The committee draws on independent external resources, 2 board representatives as well Football management.

Russell congratulated the Reserves and Senior women's for reaching finals and the Under 18's and Women's development league for achieving a premiership. Russell congratulated the award winners from these teams. Russell expressed the clubs thanks to the players, coaches, support staff, volunteers, and anybody else that was involved.

Russell highlighted in Margaret's report that under the new constitution that life memberships are now presented at the Knuckey Cup Dinner. Russell was pleased to announce the life memberships awarded, Matt Rose and Joey Haines, 2 retired players for their player service to the club, and Bronte Enright, for his voluntary role in supporting players and football staff.

Russell addressed the boards focus on trying to secure funding to undertake a major redevelopment of the clubs' facilities, highlighting the women's changerooms. Russell discussed the positive outlooks for bolder projects for the future due to the success of Gather Round, and the development of the land around the stadium. Russell mentioned the ongoing dialogue with government, council and the SANFL, plus some work preparing for the masterplan for the venue which Russell explained that CEO Neill Sharpe elaborated on this more in his report.

Russell addressed the funding that was able to be secured from the state government, the AFL and the SANFL to supplement the contribution for the lighting on Cardijn College's oval, supported by a 15-year access right with an extension for another 15 years. Russell highlights how this has been vital to being able to provide a quality training oval for the expanding number of teams.

Russell was pleased to announce the funding secured from our sponsor Redarc for the new state of the art video scoreboard which will improve the games experience for supporters and a chance to increase advertising revenue.

Russell drew from Margaret's report to thank the contributions made from outside the football department, which addressed the Administration staff led by Neill, the staff at Jimmy Deanes, the volunteers, the Panther Club, Kingstonians and sponsors.

Russell closed by expressing thanks to Margaret Nyland for her time as president, and the support she offered during difficult times and for the women's program.

Russell announced that Senior Coach Jarrad Wright was currently involved in squad training during the time the meeting was taking place. Russell addressed that Jarroa did provide a comprehensive review to members before Christmas and further information was in the Annual Report.




