From the Principal

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Dear Families,

A very warm welcome back to Term 3. We are very excited to welcome our new Reception students: Jordyn, Amelia, Taylah, Emily, Kara, Levi, Peyton and Lucy, and their families into our school community and we look forward to getting to know you and working with you. Our 'newies' have been amazing in their very first week of school and are settling in well. Congratulations!

We also welcome Jett, in Year 4 and Blake in Year 2. We hope that you enjoy being part of the Our Lady of Hope community as much as we do.

I hope that you have all enjoyed the break from routine and have had the opportunity to spend some time relaxing and having fun with your children. As you know, Ashley Keane is on Long Service Leave and enjoying spending time with his family. Ashley has worked tirelessly through a challenging semester. His solid leadership of this community and his positivity through a rollercoaster of happenings and changes has been amazing. Thank you, Ashley!

It has certainly been a challenging year and whilst life in South Australia has returned to a situation close to normality this has not been the case in other places, particularly Victoria. Many of us have family and friends L who live in Melbourne and the restrictions, isolation and uncertainty they are facing is very difficult. Our thoughts and prayers go out to them and also to you, who are missing them and worrying about them. Whilst we usually lament the end of the holidays, this is a time for us to feel blessed that we can all safely L return to school and work.

L Although we can begin the process of returning school operations to a greater sense of normality, we are still required to operate in a COVID safe manner. I would like to remind you of the protocols that are currently in place. Our Lady of Hope and Greenwith will have separate playtimes, possibly for the remainder of the year. In order to observe social distancing rules and to limit the number of adults on site we will continue to have staggered pick up times at the end of the day. Please note, however, that the staggered pick up has been reduced to a window of 10 minutes: 2.55-3.05 pm. This will allow teachers and students more time to complete their learning for the day. We ask that you collect your children as soon as

you arrive on site rather than waiting for the bell. The playground will continue to be closed after school, and we ask that you leave promptly. We understand that your children, particularly the younger ones, may like you to wait with them in the morning until their classroom is open. Again, please be mindful of social distancing and minimising time spent on site. Remember to say goodbye at the door and not enter the classroom unless invited by the class teacher.

We know that many of you have missed interacting and chatting with one another, but we are so grateful for the support you have shown through these turbulent and everchanging times.

You will be pleased to know that we can begin welcoming back our volunteers in small numbers and teacher based on requests. Volunteers will need to sign a COVID health form every time they volunteer and must be completely well and symptom free. We will run 2 face to face Volunteer Induction Sessions this term, Tuesday 11th August at 9.15 am and Monday 17th August at 5.15 pm. Please remember to book a place in advance as we are required to follow social distancing protocols.

We will also be able to reinstate some school events: assemblies (currently with only students present), excursions, after school sport, sport carnivals and playgroup. There will be protocols and some restrictions in place for all of these events.

Some whole school events to look forward to this term are a Book Week dress up parade on Friday 28th August, a disco on Friday 11th September and Our Lady of Hope Day on Friday 18th September. Details of these events will be shared at a later date.

Term 4 will be a busy and exciting one as we are planning swimming for Reception and Years 1/2, camps for Years 4-7, Sports Day, Graduation and an end of year celebration.

Of course, all of these events are subject to COVID restrictions which are constantly being reviewed and changing on a regular basis.

There will be a pupil free day on Friday 4th September. On this day teachers will be working with the newly revised curriculum and planning document for Religious Education. During the holidays the Kiss and Drop area was revamped. A number of overgrown and somewhat unsightly bushes and trees have been removed and replaced with new fencing and low plantings. This has greatly improved safety and visibility in this area and it is certainly more aesthetically pleasing. Parents now have a clear and extended view of children as they drive up and children are more quickly able to identify their parents' cars and be ready to leave. A number of leaks in the Parish Centre roof have been repaired and we can now look at replacing damaged tiles. As you walk around the school, you will notice that many garden areas have been renewed and refreshed thanks to the tireless efforts of Dave Toohey, our groundsman (see photographs on page 5 of this newsletter).

As we are still in the season of winter children can continue to play without hats. Please check that your child has a hat, as they will need to start wearing these again in a few weeks' time.

The current season of the church is known as Ordinary Time. I think you would agree that life has been anything but ordinary; rather it has been extraordinary. In the Church this is a time of spiritual growth and renewal. It is a time to reflect on our lives and think about how we can follow Jesus more closely. We have certainly had the opportunity to reflect on what is really important and whilst we have seen some examples of selfish behaviour and panic throughout Australia and the world, there have also been many uplifting stories of people showing great generosity and support to one another, reaching out to neighbours, sharing their time and their resources. These simple acts of kindness and generosity of spirit remind us that God is ever present to US.

2020 School Fees

Term 3 fees are due on Friday 28th August.

At Our Lady of Hope School we are committed to ensuring that an inability to pay fees should not prevent families from pursuing or continuing the enrolment of their children at our school.

During difficult times we are conscious that children and families require stability, and we believe that the best way that we can assist you in providing that stability is to ensure that students remain enrolled at a school that they know and are comfortable in.

If your family has lost significant income due to COVID-19 you will receive a school fee remission effective immediately, initially for a period of 3 months. This is the equivalent of 1 term's fees and levies. We will continue to review the fee situation for individual families and the school as a whole.
