Crestani Scholarship in Cancer Nursing – the cost of one subject, up to the value of \$2,000, under one of ACN Cancer courses.

Tracey is currently working with the Centre for Children's Health and Wellbeing, and Griffith University (Logan) to evaluate a new sustained nurse home visiting program that has been implemented within areas of known social disadvantage. The right@home program includes a series of 25 home visits by a Child Health nurse up to the child is 2 years of age, and aims to improve the parents' capacity to provide their baby with safe and responsive care in a learning environment that improves developmental outcomes for their child.
