| Class Two | Physical Product Specifications |
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| Colour | Purple, purple-brown or bright green skins with crimson, pink-brown or red flesh depending on variety |
| Appearance | Plump, full fleshy fruit. Intact thin skin. Base of fruit has an eye. |
| Eating Quality | Sweet, delicate fig flavour. No off tastes or odours. |
| Maturity | Over mature fruit is overly soft and may burst. |
| Size | Count Sizes per carton: 20,32,36,40,42 |
| Shape | Squat pear shape with short stem. |
| Defects | Minor Defects: must not exceed 10% of the pack. |
| | Major defects: 5% or less per tray |
| | Total Defects: 10% or less per tray |
| | Minor Defects |
| | Minor defects do not affect the shelf life. These include: |
| | Skin Marks <4cm ² |
| | Superficial bruising <4cm ² |
| | Healed scars <4cm ² |
| | Major Defects |
| | Major defects do affect shelf life. These include: |
| | Product should have no more than 5% major defects per pack: |
| | Severe bruising |
| | Unhealed splits, cuts or holes, torn skin |
| | Discolouration or disfigurement |
| | Splits or moisture loss at base, sticky skin |
| | Shrivelling |
| | Dry pulp texture and unpalatable (immature) |
| | All rots and moulds |
| | Dark sunken areas or internal browning (chilling injury) |
| | Pest and insect damage |
| | Heavy skin marks (scaling) |
| Presentation | Consistent sizing in tray |
| Outer Packaging | Cardboard carton |
| Pulp Temperature | 0 - 5c |
