The five habits of happiness are simple concepts that when practised regularly can help the brain think more positively and also helps develop life skills needed for a healthy and successful life, which are: gratitude, kindness, mindfulness, optimism and happiness.

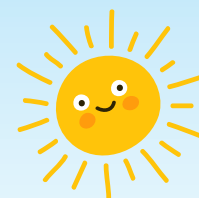

Please ensure when dropping off and picking up your child/ren that you sign for your child/ren. It is a legal requirement that this occurs.

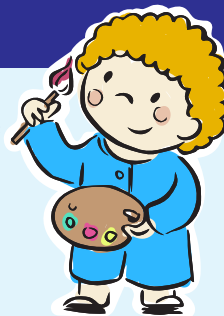
### Bookings/Cancellations

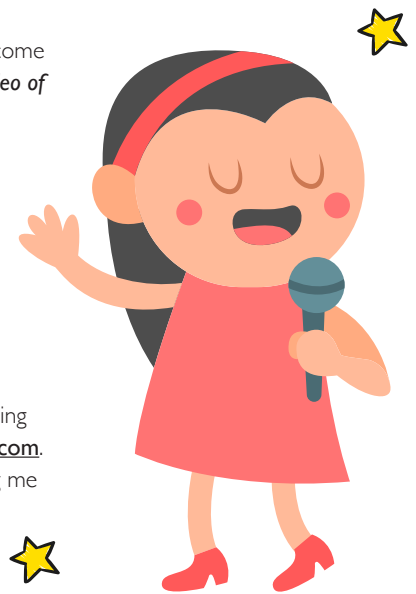
### Term 2 Incursion – Island Dreaming Performance
