The position will provide a range of support and assistance to newly arrived refugees and asylum seekers including assessment, referral to appropriate health services and case management.

Key Responsibilities for the role include:

- Provide resources to clients, GPs and team members on refugee health issues
- Provide health assessments
- Work closely with ARA bilingual/bicultural workers to facilitate referrals to other health care providers both internally and externally
- Provide consultations/act as a resource person for primary health services based on knowledge, experience and skills

Key Skills and Experience required for the role include:

- Knowledge of contemporary professional nursing and health care issues, considerations and complexities of working with clients from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds with complex physical and mental health issues.
- Experience in working in primary health services in a capacity development role
